5 Relating to the centennial of the auto-
6 mobile.
7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
8 WHEREAS the first patent for an automobile was issued in Germany on
9 January 29, 1886; and
10 WHEREAS the subsequent development of the automobile throughout the
11 world has had a profound effect on our economy and culture; and
12 WHEREAS the automobile industry, affiliated service industries, and
13 secondary markets account for one-quarter of the economy of the United
14 States; and
15 WHEREAS since the automobile first arrived in the state, it has played
16 a significant role in the development of the "Last Frontier"; and
17 WHEREAS the centennial year of the automobile is being celebrated
18 around the world with automobile races, historical exhibits, and other
19 appropriate observances;
20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the Governor is
21 respectfully requested to declare 1986 as the Centennial Year of the Auto-
22 mobile, and to call for appropriate celebrations and commemorations by
23 persons and groups for which the automobile holds significant meaning; and
24 be it
25 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska Transportation Museum is encouraged
26 to make special efforts to appropriately celebrate 100 years of motoring.
