A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to criminal sentencing procedures."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 \* Section 1. AS 12.55.025(g) is repealed and reenacted to read:

9 (g) Except as required under (h) of this section, if the defen-  
10 dant has been convicted of two or more crimes before the judgment on  
11 either has been entered, any sentences of imprisonment may run concur-  
12 rently if

13 (1) the crimes violate similar societal interests;

14 (2) the crimes are part of a single, continuous criminal  
15 episode; or

16 (3) there was not a substantial change in the objective of  
17 the criminal episode, including a change in the parties to the crime,  
18 the property or type of property right offended, or the persons of-  
19 fended.

20 \* Sec. 2. AS 12.55.025 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

21 (h) If the defendant has been convicted of two or more crimes  
22 before judgment on either has been entered, sentences of imprisonment  
23 shall run consecutively if

24 (1) the crimes were committed while the defendant attempted  
25 to escape or avoid detection or apprehension after the commission of  
26 another crime;

27 (2) the sentence is for a violation of AS 11.41.100 -  
28 11.41.470; or

29 (3) the sentence is for a violation of AS 11.41.500 -

- 1 11.41.530 that results in physical injury or serious physical injury
- 2 as those terms are defined in AS 11.81.900.
