A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act exempting certain purchases from the State  
7 Procurement Code."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 36.30.850(b) is amended to read:

10 (b) This chapter applies to every expenditure of state funds,  
11 irrespective of their sources, including federal assistance except as  
12 otherwise specified in AS 36.30.890, by the state, acting through an  
13 agency, under a contract, except that this chapter does not apply to

14 (1) grants;

15 (2) contracts for professional witnesses to provide for  
16 professional services or testimony relating to existing or probable  
17 lawsuits in which the state is or may become a party;

18 (3) contracts of the University of Alaska where the work is  
19 to be performed substantially by students enrolled in the university;

20 (4) contracts for medical doctors and dentists;

21 (5) acquisitions or disposals of real property or interest  
22 in real property, except as provided in AS 36.30.080;

23 (6) disposals under AS 38.05;

24 (7) contracts for the preparation of ballots under AS 15.-  
25 15.030;

26 (8) acquisitions or disposals of property and other con-  
27 tracts relating to airports under AS 02.15.070, 02.15.090, and 02.15.-  
28 091;

29 (9) disposals of obsolete property under AS 19.05.060;

1 (10) disposals of obsolete material or equipment under  
2 AS 35.20.060;

3 (11) agreements with providers of services under AS 47.07;  
4 AS 47.08; AS 47.10; AS 47.17; AS 47.24; AS 47.25.195, and 47.25.310;

5 (12) contracts of the Department of Fish and Game for flights  
6 that involve specialized flying and piloting skills and are not  
7 point-to-point;

8 (13) purchases of income-producing assets for the state  
9 treasury or a public corporation of the state;

10 (14) the purchase of books, book binding services, news-  
11 papers, periodicals, audio-visual materials, network information  
12 services access, approval plans, professional memberships, archival  
13 materials, objects of art, and items having cultural, historical, or  
14 archaeological significance; in this paragraph

15 (A) "approval plans" means book selection services in  
16 which current book titles meeting an agency's customized speci-  
17 fications are provided to the agency subject to the right of the  
18 agency to return those books that do not meet with the agency's  
19 approval;

20 (B) "audio-visual materials" means nonbook materials,  
21 including records, tapes, slides, transparencies, films, film-  
22 strips, cassettes, videos, compact discs, laser discs, and items  
23 that require the use of equipment to render them usable;

24 (C) "archival materials" means the noncurrent records  
25 of an agency that are preserved after appraisal because of their  
26 value;

27 (D) "network information services" means a group of  
28 resources from which cataloging information, holdings records,  
29 inter-library loans, acquisitions information, and other

1 reference resources can be obtained.

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
