2 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 22

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 FIFTEENTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

5 Relating to an agreement between the
6 Department of Defense and the Alaska
7 Department of Labor for enforcement of
8 the Alaskan hire requirements of sec.
9 8078 of the 1986 Defense Appropriations
10 Act, and subsequent acts; and urging the
11 Congress to extend the resident hire
12 provision through fiscal year 1988.

13 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

14 WHEREAS, because of its unique climate and its distance from the con-
15 tiguous states, Alaska has historically suffered from unique social, geo-
16 graphic, and economic conditions that result in an unstable economy; and

17 WHEREAS the unstable economy is a hardship on the residents of the
18 state and is aggravated by the large number of seasonal and transient
19 workers; and

20 WHEREAS the promotion of a resident-based workforce is a sound local,
21 state, and federal public policy; and

22 WHEREAS the rate of unemployment among residents of the state is one
23 of the highest in the nation; and

24 WHEREAS construction projects funded wholly or partially with federal
25 funds have traditionally accounted for a substantial percentage of the
26 available employment of the state; and

27 WHEREAS the federal government, in recognition of these facts, has
28 provided for the preferential hire of Alaskan residents on Department of
29 Defense contracts in the state in sec. 8078 of the 1986 Defense

1 Appropriations Act; and

2 WHEREAS the Department of Defense, in preparation for the deployment
3 of the Sixth Infantry Division (LIGHT), will award contracts for major
4 construction, repair, and maintenance in Alaska estimated at \$134,000,000
5 in fiscal year 1987; and

6 WHEREAS the Department of Defense fiscal year 1988 plan for military
7 construction in Alaska includes contracts estimated at \$273,000,000; and

8 WHEREAS the state Department of Labor possesses the expertise and
9 capability to verify compliance with regulations requiring resident hire in
10 Alaska; and

11 WHEREAS the Governor has requested that the Department of Defense
12 enter into a cooperative agreement with the state Department of Labor
13 regarding compliance monitoring and enforcement of the resident hire pro-
14 visions of sec. 8078 of the 1986 Defense Appropriations Act, and subsequent
15 acts;

16 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature encourages the De-
17 partment of Defense and the state Department of Labor to enter into an
18 agreement under which the state would monitor and enforce compliance with
19 sec. 8078 of the 1986 Defense Appropriations Act, and subsequent acts; and
20 be it

21 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature encourages the
22 Congress to extend the resident hire provisions of sec. 8078 through fiscal
23 year 1988.

26 Honorable Frank Murkowski, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U.S.
