6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to sport fishing, hunting, and
7 trapping licenses; and providing for an effective
8 date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 16.05.340(a)(1) is repealed and reenacted to read:

(1) Resident sport fishing

However, the fee for a blind resident is 25 cents for an annual li-

14 However, the fee for an annual license is 25 cents for a applicant who
15 is the head of a family or a dependent member of that family, or who
16 is solely self-supporting, upon proof presented by the applicant that
17 the applicant is obtaining or has obtained assistance during the
18 preceding six months under any state or federal welfare program to aid
19 the indigent, or has an annual family gross income of less than \$5,600
20 for the year preceding application.

21 * Sec. 6. AS 16.05.350 is amended to read:

22 Sec. 16.05.350. EXPIRATION OF LICENSES AND TAGS. Licenses and
23 tags required under AS 16.05.330 - 16.05.430, except biennial li-
24 censes, triennial licenses, quinquennial licenses, the nonresident
25 special sport fishing license, the resident trapping license, and the
26 waterfowl conservation tag, expire at the close of December 31 follow-
27 ing issuance. Biennial licenses expire after December 31 of the year
28 following the year of issuance. Triennial licenses expire after
29 December 31 of the second year following the year of issuance.

1 Quinquennial licenses expire five years after the date of issuance.

2 The resident trapping license expires at the close of September 30 of
3 the year following the year in which the license is issued. The
4 waterfowl conservation tag expires at the close of January 31 of the
5 year following the year of issue of the tag.

6 * Sec. 7. AS 16.05.360 is amended to read:

7 Sec. 16.05.360. COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE CHARGED WITH LICENSE
8 ISSUANCE. Except for quinquennial licenses issued under AS 28.15.111,
9 the [THE] commissioner of revenue or an authorized deputy shall issue
10 each license and tag to a qualified person under written application
11 containing such reasonable information as required by the commis-
12 sioner. The commissioner shall designate the license and tag form or
13 type. The form or type shall be sufficient to identify and locate the
14 applicant and establish the applicant's status as to residency and
15 citizenship. Each application shall be subscribed and sworn to by the
16 applicant before an officer authorized to administer oaths in the
17 state.

18 * Sec. 8. AS 28.15.111 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

19 (c) The department shall issue, at the time that an operator's
20 license is issued, a resident sport fishing quinquennial license, a
21 resident hunting quinquennial license, a resident hunting and trapping
22 quinquennial license, a resident hunting and sport fishing quinquen-
23 nial license, or a resident hunting, trapping, and sport fishing
24 quinquennial license. A sport fishing, hunting, or combination li-
25 cense may be issued only to a qualified applicant who submits a writ-
26 ten application containing information required for similar licenses
27 under AS 16.05.360 and pays the fee established for the license under
28 AS 16.05.340. The fee for the sport fishing, hunting, or combination
29 license is in addition to the fee for the operator's license, and

1 shall be deposited in the fish and game fund (AS 16.05.100). The
2 sport fishing, hunting, or combination license may not be larger than
3 an operator's license, and shall be sealed in plastic and attached to
4 the operator's license. The department may issue a duplicate sport
5 fishing, hunting, or combination license in the same manner and for
6 the same fee as provided for similar licenses under AS 16.05.340.
7 * Sec. 9. This Act takes effect January 1, 1988.
