6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the Alaska automated fingerprint
7 system and to the inclusion of fingerprint informa-
8 tion in that system."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 44.41.025 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 44.41.025. FINGERPRINTS [FEES FOR FINGERPRINT INFORMATION].

12 (a) The Department of Public Safety may maintain an automated finger-
13 print system.

14 (b) The commissioner of public safety may establish by regu-
15 lation and the Department of Public Safety may charge a reasonable fee
16 to be paid by a person requesting information from the Alaska automat-
17 ed fingerprint system. The commissioner of administration shall
18 separately account for fees collected under this section that the
19 Department of Public Safety deposits in the general fund. The annual
20 estimated balance in the account may be used by the legislature to
21 make appropriations to the department to carry out the purposes of
22 this section.

23 (c) Each of the following may submit a complete set of finger-
24 prints of the person designated for inclusion in the Alaska automated
25 fingerprint system:

26 (1) a person may submit the person's own fingerprints;

27 (2) the parent or guardian of a minor who is two years of
28 age or older may submit the minor's fingerprints; and

29 (3) the guardian or conservator of a person under AS 13.26

1 may submit the fingerprints of the person protected by the guardian or
2 conservator.

3 (d) The commissioner may maintain the fingerprint sets of minors
4 who are under 14 years of age submitted under (c)(2) of this section
5 in a file separate from the general file for all other fingerprints
6 maintained under (a) of this section.

7 (e) Upon request by a person who is 18 years of age or older,
8 the commissioner shall remove from the records of the Alaska automated
9 fingerprint system the complete set of the person's fingerprints
10 submitted by the parent or guardian of the person under (c)(2) of this
11 section. The regulations must establish a procedure for the sub-
12 mission of a request under this subsection and for notification that
13 the fingerprint set has been removed from the records in response to
14 the request.
