8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 43.70.110 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 43.70.110. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter, unless the con-  
11 text otherwise requires,

12 (1) "business" includes all activities or acts, personal,  
13 professional, or corporate, engaged in or caused to be engaged in, or  
14 following or engaging in a trade, profession, or business, including  
15 receipts from advertising services, rental of personal or real proper-  
16 ty, construction, processing, or manufacturing, but excluding farming,  
17 fisheries businesses, fishermen, liquor licenses, insurance busi-  
18 nesses, mining, and coin-operated amusement and gaming machines,  
19 calling or vocation, with the object of financial or pecuniary gain,  
20 profit or benefit, either direct or indirect, and not exempting subac-  
21 tivities producing marketable commodities or services used or consumed  
22 in the main business activity, each of which subactivities shall be  
23 considered business; the giving or supplying of services as an em-  
24 ployee and the furnishing of property, services, substances, or  
25 things, by a person who does not represent to be regularly engaging in  
26 those transactions, does not constitute business under the meaning of  
27 this chapter;

28 (2) "commissioner" means the commissioner of commerce and  
29 economic development;
