A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act extending the jurisdiction of the Alaska
7 Police Standards Council to include certain airport
8 personnel."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Sec. 1. AS 18.65.290(5) is amended to read:

11 (5) "police officer" means a full-time employee of the
12 state or a local police department, or a full-time employee of the
13 Department of Transportation and Public Facilities who is stationed at
14 an airport, who has [WITH] the authority to arrest and issue cita-
15 tions; detain a person taken into custody until that person can be
16 arraigned before a judge or magistrate; conduct investigations of
17 violations of and enforce criminal laws, regulations and traffic laws;
18 search with or without a warrant persons, dwellings, and other forms
19 of property for evidence of a crime; carry a concealed weapon; and
20 take other action consistent with exercise of these enumerated powers
21 when necessary to maintain the public peace;

22 * Sec. 2. Notwithstanding AS 18.65.290(5), as amended by sec. 1 of this
23 Act, an employee of the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities
24 who holds a position on the effective date of this Act that would be
25 covered by the amendment made to AS 18.65.290(5) by sec. 1 of this Act is
26 not subject to the jurisdiction of the Police Standards Council for the
27 duration of the employee's tenure with the department in that position
28 unless the employee receives a certificate issued by the council. The
29 Department of Transportation and Public Facilities may not discriminate

1 against a person described by this section in any matter related to the
2 person's employment status, wages and benefits payable, promotion and
3 reassignment opportunities, or training necessary to attain certification
4 because the person does not have a certificate issued by the Alaska Police
5 Standards Council.
