2 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 19 am

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 SIXTEENTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

5 Ratifying an amendment to the Constitu-
6 tion of the United States concerning the
7 compensation of members of the United
8 States Congress.

9 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 WHEREAS the First Congress of the United States passed a resolution on
11 September 25, 1789, proposing the following amendment to the United States
12 Constitution:

13 "RESOLVED by the Senate and House of Representatives of
14 the United States of America in Congress assembled, two thirds
15 of both Houses concurring, that the following [Article] be
16 proposed to the Legislatures of the several States,...which
17 [Article], when ratified by three-fourths of the said Legisla-
18 tures, to be valid to all intents and purposes, as part of the
19 said Constitution, viz.:

20 "Article the second. No law, varying the compensation
21 for the services of the Senators and Representatives, shall
22 take effect, until an election of Representatives shall have
23 intervened."; and

24 WHEREAS this proposal has been ratified by the legislatures of at
25 least 25 states since September 25, 1789; and

26 WHEREAS the resolution of the First Congress proposing this measure
27 did not establish a date by which the amendment must be ratified;

28 BE IT RESOLVED that the Sixteenth Alaska State Legislature ratifies
29 the proposed amendment to the United States Constitution as set out in the

1 Congressional Resolution.

2 COPIES of this resolution, properly certified, shall be sent to the
3 Honorable Dan Quayle, Vice-President of the United States and President of
4 the U.S. Senate; to the Honorable Jim Wright, Speaker of the U.S. House of
5 Representatives; and to the Honorable Frank G. Burke, Archivist of the
6 United States; and to the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Frank
7 Murkowski, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U.S. Representative,
8 members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
