Urging revision of housing requirements

10 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 WHEREAS the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development
12 plays a leading role in providing housing in rural Alaska; and

13 WHEREAS most of those homeowners are not involved in construction de-
14 cisions about the homes in which they will live and for which they will
15 ultimately pay the energy bills; and

16 WHEREAS the Rural Housing Needs Assessment found that the owners of 28
17 percent of rural homes could not maintain a healthy inside temperature
18 within their homes, despite paying extremely high winter heating bills; and

19 WHEREAS the state spends tens of millions of dollars annually in
20 subsidizing the costs of heating fuel and electricity and in providing
21 weatherization assistance to substandard homes; and

22 WHEREAS, by designing and constructing homes to meet energy standards
23 appropriate to the state's climate, the United States Department of Housing
24 and Urban Development could help reduce these costs substantially; and

25 WHEREAS the current maximum amount that the United States Department
26 of Housing and Urban Development allows for the construction of a rural
27 home is too low to ensure that the home constructed may be affordably
28 heated; and

29 WHEREAS the department's Comprehensive Improvement Assistance Program

1 provides resources to regional housing authorities to retrofit existing
2 department-assisted homes;

3 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature requests that the
4 United States Department of Housing and Urban Development provide greater
5 flexibility in allowing regional housing authorities to allocate more money
6 per residence for the construction of the residence to ensure that it will
7 be energy efficient and structurally strong; and be it

8 FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislature respectfully requests that the
9 Congress appropriate sufficient additional money to the Comprehensive
10 Improvement Assistance Program to allow existing department-assisted homes
11 to meet a minimum energy efficiency standard.

14 the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Frank Murkowski, U.S. Senators,

16 delegation in Congress.
