7 wildlife; and providing for an effective date."
8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
9 * Section. 1. AS 16.05.258 is amended by adding new subsections to
10 read:
11 (g) The Board of Fisheries and the Board of Game shall determine
12 which areas of the state are rural in character based on fish and
13 wildlife uses that may be established by regulation. The boards,
14 where appropriate, shall consider, individually and in the aggregate,
15 communities or areas that are economically, socially, and communally
16 integrated. A community or area with a population of
17 (1) 2,500 or less is rural unless the community or area
18 possesses significant characteristics of a nonrural nature or is part
19 of an urbanized area;
20 (2) more than 2,500 but less than 7,000 may be rural or
21 nonrural, depending on its characteristics;
22 (3) 7,000 or more is nonrural unless the community or area
23 possesses significant characteristics of a rural nature.
24 (h) Determinations made under (g) of this section are effective
25 until February 15 of the year following the year in which the deter-
26 minations are made unless the determinations are extended by the
27 legislature by law.
28 * Sec. 2. AS 16.05.940(26) is amended to read:
29 (26) "rural area" means a community or area of the state

1 designated as "rural" under AS 16.05.258(r) [IN WHICH THE NONCOMMER-
2 CIAL, CUSTOMARY, AND TRADITIONAL USE OF FISH OR GAME FOR PERSONAL OR
3 FAMILY CONSUMPTION IS A PRINCIPAL CHARACTERISTIC OF THE ECONOMY OF THE
4 COMMUNITY OR AREA];

5 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the effective date of a constitu-
6 tional amendment relating to subsistence that is approved by the voters in
7 the 1990 general election.
