A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act relating to the taking of fish and game by proxy for a person with physical
2 disabilities or for a person who is 60 years of age or more."

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

4 * Section 1. AS 16.05 is amended by adding a new section to read:

5 Sec. 16.05.403. TAKING FISH AND GAME BY PROXY. (a) Notwithstanding
6 AS 16.05.420(c), a resident holding a valid hunting license may take game under a subsistence
7 or sport hunting license issued under this section to a person with physical disabilities if the
8 resident possesses the license of the person with physical disabilities.

9 (b) Notwithstanding AS 16.05.420(c), a resident holding a valid fishing license may take
10 fish under a subsistence or personal use fishing license issued under this section to a person with
11 physical disabilities if the resident possesses the license of the person with physical disabilities.

12 (c) A resident person with physical disabilities may obtain from the department upon
13 payment of the fee prescribed in AS 16.05.330 - 16.05.430 a resident subsistence or sport hunting
14 license or a resident subsistence or personal use fishing license indicating that the purchaser is

1 a person with physical disabilities.

2 (d) Notwithstanding AS 16.05.420(c), a resident holding a valid hunting license may take
3 game for a person who is 60 years of age or older if the resident possesses the person's

4 (1) resident hunting license; or

5 (2) permanent identification card issued under AS 16.05.400(b) and a document
6 signed by the person stating that the resident possesses the person's identification card in order
7 to take game on behalf of the person.

8 (e) Notwithstanding AS 16.05.420(c), a resident holding a valid fishing license may take
9 fish for a person who is 60 years of age or older if the resident possesses the person's

10 (1) resident fishing license; or

11 (2) permanent identification card issued under AS 16.05.400(b) and a document
12 signed by the person stating that the resident possesses the person's identification card in order
13 to take fish on behalf of the person.

14 (f) A resident who takes fish or game on behalf of another person under this section may
15 take the fish or game only under those terms as would apply to the other person if the other
16 person took the fish or game personally.
