A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act relating to qualifications for teachers; and the teacher scholarship loan program."

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

3 * Section 1. AS 14.20.020 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

4 (h) A person is not eligible for a teacher certificate unless the person has completed three
5 semester hours in Alaska studies and three semester hours in multicultural education or cross-
6 cultural communications. However, the commissioner may issue a provisional certificate, valid
7 for no longer than two years, to an applicant who has not completed the semester hours required
8 under this subsection at the time of application if there are insufficient applicants for that type
9 of certificate who have completed the semester hours required under this subsection.

10 * Sec. 2. AS 14.20 is amended by adding a new section to read:

11 Sec. 14.20.035. EVALUATION OF TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE. In evaluating an
12 applicant for a position in a district or regional educational attendance area, a district or regional
13 educational attendance area shall give preference to those applicants who demonstrate training
14 or experience that establishes that the applicant is likely to be sensitive to the traditions and

1 culture of the cultural backgrounds represented in the student population.

2 * Sec. 3. AS 14.43.700 is amended to read:

3 Sec. 14.43.700. DEFINITION. In AS 14.43.600 - 14.43.700, "rural" means

4 [(1)] a community [IN THE SECOND, THIRD, OR FOURTH JUDICIAL
5 DISTRICT OF THE STATE] with a population of 5,500 [4,500] or less that is not connected by
6 road or rail to Anchorage or Fairbanks or with a population of 1,500 or less that is connected
7 by road or rail to Anchorage or Fairbanks [; OR

8 (2) A COMMUNITY IN THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT OF THE STATE
9 WITH A POPULATION OF 4,500 OR LESS].
