A RESOLUTION

1 Relating to enforcement of state laws prohibiting age discrimination in employment.

2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

3 WHEREAS the older population in the state has more than doubled in the past decade and is
4 one of the fastest growing age groups in the state; and

5 WHEREAS the state has one of the most rapidly growing senior populations in the nation; and

6 WHEREAS participation in the workforce by older Alaskans does not seem to be keeping pace
7 with the changing demographics of the state; and

8 WHEREAS age-related stereotyping, age discrimination, and a widespread lack of understanding
9 about the employment needs and capabilities of older persons contribute to the difficulty older workers
10 have in obtaining and retaining employment; and

11 WHEREAS older workers are more inclined to be "discouraged workers," not registered with
12 the state Job Services offices or actively seeking employment; and

13 WHEREAS half of the workers in the United States between age 40 and 55 have incomes below
14 \$10,000 a year and want and need to work;

15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that Governor Walter J. Hickel is
16 respectfully requested to direct the State Commission for Human Rights to vigilantly enforce the
17 provisions of state law prohibiting discrimination in employment based on age.
