A RESOLUTION

**1 Requesting an immediate federal investigation of the conduct of certain Los Angeles police
2 officers in the Rodney King videotaped beating incident for possible violations of federal
3 civil rights laws and requesting criminal prosecution of those officers if the investigation
4 reveals that violations of federal civil rights laws occurred.**

5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

6 WHEREAS the videotaped beating of Rodney King by certain Los Angeles police officers has
7 shocked the conscience of the country; and

8 WHEREAS it appears that the conduct of the Los Angeles police officers that participated in
9 the beating may have violated federal civil rights laws;

10 BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate respectfully requests George Bush, the President of the
**11 United States, direct the Attorney General to immediately open a major investigation of the conduct of
12 the Los Angeles police officers that participated in the videotaped beating of Rodney King to ascertain
13 if federal civil rights laws have been violated; and proceed expeditiously with prosecution to the full
14 extent of the law if federal civil rights laws have been violated.**
