A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act relating to alcoholic beverage license and permit fees and the use of  
2 license fees; and providing for an effective date."

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

4 \* Section 1. AS 04.11.090(b) is amended to read:

5 (b) The annual beverage dispensary license fee is \$2,500 [~~\$1,250~~].

13 obtain a general wholesale license for each distributing point. The annual general  
14 wholesale license fee is \$2,000 [\$1,000] for the first \$100,000 of business transacted,  
15 payable at the time of making an original application or an application for renewal.  
16 In addition, the following annual fees shall be paid by a holder of a general wholesale  
17 license:

1 (b) A wholesale malt beverage and wine license authorizes the holder to sell  
2 malt beverages and wine in the original packages in quantities of not less than five  
3 gallons. The holder of a wholesale malt beverage and wine license may not sell to a  
4 person not licensed under this title except as provided in AS 04.21.040. The annual  
5 wholesale malt beverage and wine license fee is \$400 [\$200] for the first \$20,000 of  
6 business transacted during a year, payable at the time of making an original application  
7 or application for renewal. In addition, the following annual fees shall be paid by a  
8 holder of a wholesale malt beverage and wine license:

10	over \$20,000 and not over \$50,000 . . . . .	<u>\$600</u> [\$ 300]
