**FOR AN ACT ENTITLED**

1 "An Act relating to the Milk Control Advisory Board, Museum Collections  
2 Advisory Committee, Alaska Workers' Compensation Board, resource development  
3 authorities, Board of Parole, railroad labor relations agency, Alaska School  
4 Activities Association, Steering Council for Alaska Lands, Rural Affairs  
5 Commission, Governor's Commission on the Involvement of Young People in  
6 Government, Yukon-Taiya Commission, environmental advisory board, Alaska Gas  
7 Pipeline Financing Authority, and Alaska Manpower Services Council; and  
8 providing for an effective date."

9 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

10 \* Section 1. AS 03.17.010 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 03.17.010. DUTIES OF THE DIRECTOR. The director shall [(1)]  
12 administer and enforce this chapter [, (2) ENFORCE THIS CHAPTER] and the

1 provisions of marketing orders issued under this chapter [, AND (3) HAVE AN  
2 ACCOUNTING MADE OF THE FUNDS HELD BY THE BOARD AT LEAST  
3 ANNUALLY].

4 \* Sec. 2. AS 03.17.040(a) is amended to read:

5 (a) Subject to AS 03.17.060 and AS 44.62 ( [THE] Administrative Procedure  
6 Act) [(AS 44.62), AND WITH THE ADVICE OF THE BOARD], the director may  
7 issue, amend, or repeal marketing orders to regulate the marketing of milk in specified  
8 regions of the state. A milk marketing order may be issued to

- 9 (1) establish orderly marketing of milk;
- 10 (2) provide for uniform grading and classification of milk;
- 11 (3) provide for the proper preparation of milk for market;
- 12 (4) ensure [INSURE] an adequate supply of milk;
- 13 (5) eliminate unfair competitive practices;
- 14 (6) assist producers to adjust to changing conditions;
- 15 (7) maintain incentive for the production of high quality milk under the  
16 most sanitary conditions;
- 17 (8) conduct research and provide information for the benefit of the  
18 producer and the consumer.

20 (a) A marketing order may direct that

- 21 (1) a determination be made whether a surplus of milk exists and, if  
22 so, its extent;
- 23 (2) a surplus be disposed of with a proration of the burden of any loss  
24 among the handlers;
- 25 (3) the quantity, class, or grade of milk sold for a certain period be  
26 limited;
- 27 (4) the quantity a producer may sell be limited, based upon the quantity  
28 available, the quantities previously handled, or both;
- 29 (5) the quantity or grade a handler may handle during specified periods,  
30 based upon the quantity a handler has available, or quantities previously handled, or  
31 both;

1 (6) there be specified periods during which a particular grade of milk  
2 may be distributed;

3 (7) a surplus pool of milk or a class or grade of milk be formed and  
4 the milk sold, and the proceeds of sale be equitably distributed;

5 (8) milk be inspected, graded, and classified, or any of these;

6 (9) an assessment, not to exceed three percent of value, be levied on  
7 the sale of milk to provide a fund for advertising and [,] sales promotion [, AND THE  
8 EXPENSES OF THE BOARD];

9 (10) prices at which a grade, class, or quantity will be sold be posted;

10 (11) milk be labeled;

11 (12) stations be established for the receiving and weighing of milk, and  
12 the collection of assessments;

16 (b) The committee shall meet at least once every six months and at the call  
17 of its chair [CHAIRMAN], on petition of a majority of its members, or at the call of  
18 the commissioner, or the director of the museum, at a mutually convenient time and  
19 place both for the members of the committee and for interested members of the public.  
20 A meeting of the committee may be held by teleconference.

22 (b) Artifacts, natural history specimens, art objects, collections, or other items,  
23 materials, or properties that relate to the history of Alaska and are appropriate for  
24 preservation in the state museum of a value of \$5,000 [\$1,000] or more may not be  
25 acquired by purchase, gift, or exchange, or otherwise nor may any item owned by, or  
26 in the custody of, the state museum be disposed of by sale, gift, exchange, or  
27 otherwise, without the written approval of the committee. In recommending the  
28 acquisition or disposal of an item under this subsection for the state museum, the  
29 committee shall evaluate the need for the item or collection proposed for acquisition  
30 or disposal with reference to the scope of collections of the state museums.

1                   **Sec. 14.57.060. ADVISORY DUTIES.** The committee shall act in an advisory  
2 capacity to the board as to the general acquisition and deaccession policies and  
3 programs of the state museum.

4 \* **Sec. 7. AS 23.30.005(a)** is amended to read:

5                   (a) The Alaska Workers' Compensation Board consists of a southern panel of  
6 three members sitting for the first judicial district, a northern panel of three members  
7 sitting for the second and fourth judicial districts, ~~three~~ [TWO] southcentral panels of  
8 three members each sitting for the third judicial district, and one panel of three  
9 members that may sit in any judicial district. Each panel must include the  
10 commissioner of labor or the designated representative of the commissioner, a  
11 representative of industry, and a representative of labor. The latter two members of  
12 each panel shall be appointed by the governor and are subject to confirmation by a  
13 majority of the members of the legislature in joint session.

15                   (a) The residents of each area of the state within the boundaries of a regional  
16 housing authority established under AS 18.55.996 which is located in whole or in part  
17 in the unorganized borough of the state may create a public body corporate and politic  
18 under the name and style of the " \_\_\_\_\_ Resource Development  
19 Authority" with all or any significant part of the name of the region of the state  
20 inserted. The boundaries of the authority created shall be coterminous with the portion  
21 of the applicable regional housing authority that lies in the unorganized borough.  
22 Creation of an authority is initiated by a petition filed with the Department of  
23 Community and Regional Affairs and a statement submitted to the governor [BEFORE  
24 JULY 1, 1986]. The petition must include the proposed name of the authority, its  
25 boundaries, and a statement of the facilities proposed to be provided by the authority.  
26 The petition must be signed by 15 percent of the total number of residents in the  
27 portion of the applicable regional housing authority that lies in the unorganized  
28 borough who cast votes in the preceding general election. The Department of  
29 Community and Regional Affairs shall review petitions for content and signatures. If  
30 the department determines that the petition is adequate, it shall transmit the petition to  
31 the director of elections.

21 the parties are unable to agree on an arbitrator, the railroad labor relations  
22 agency shall appoint an arbitrator from a list of arbitrators knowledgeable in  
23 railroad labor agreements. The arbitrator shall [BE THE SAME PERSON  
24 SELECTED UNDER AS 42.40.840 AND SHALL] fashion the award the arbitrator  
25 considers equitable.
