A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act making an appropriation to the Alyeska Settlement Fund and making
 2 appropriations from the Alyeska Settlement Fund; making, amending, and repealing
 3 operating and capital appropriations; and providing for an effective date."

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

5 * Section 1. The interest of the State of Alaska in payments received by the state for
 6 deposit into the Alyeska Settlement Fund under the Agreement and Consent Decree in IN RE:
 7 The EXXON VALDEZ, United States District Court, District of Alaska, case No. A89-095
 8 Civil (Consolidated)(Re: case No. A92-175 Civil, decree entered November 25, 1992), is
 9 appropriated to the Alyeska Settlement Fund.

10 * Sec. 2. The sum of \$20,500,000 is appropriated from the Alyeska Settlement Fund to the
 11 Department of Transportation and Public Facilities and is allocated for the following projects
 12 in the amounts listed:
