6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to legislative per diem; and provid-
7 ing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 24.15.010 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 24.15.010. LEGISLATIVE PER DIEM. (a) The rate of per diem
11 instead of subsistence for each member of the legislature is \$43 [\$35]
12 for each day of a legislative session. The per diem is also payable
13 for those days of necessary travel to and from sessions.

14 (b) In addition to the per diem provided for in (a) of this
15 section, a member is entitled to receive an additional \$43 per diem
16 for each day he is required to travel away from the capital during
17 legislative sessions on official legislative business.

18 (c) A member who is required to travel on official legislative
19 business during the interim is entitled to \$43 per diem for the minimum
20 time required to get to and from meetings and while attending meetings
21 unless the meeting is in a location for which other state employees
22 are entitled to a higher rate. In that event the member is entitled
23 to the rate of per diem received by other state employees.

24 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect July 1, 1975.
