8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 23.20.408(d) is amended to read:

10 (d) There is a national "on" indicator for a week if the United
11 States Secretary of Labor determines that for each of the three most
12 recent calendar months ending before that week, the rate of insured
13 unemployment, seasonally adjusted, for all states equaled or exceeded
14 4 [4.5] per cent.

15 * Sec. 2. AS 23.20.408(e) is amended to read:

16 (e) There is a national "off" indicator for a week if the United
17 States Secretary of Labor determines that for each of the three most
18 recent calendar months ending before that week, the rate of insured
19 unemployment, seasonally adjusted, for all states was less than 4 [4.5]
20 per cent.

21 * Sec. 3. The provisions of AS 23.20.408(f)(1) and (g)(1) are suspended
22 for the period from January 1, 1975 through December 31, 1976 in accordance
23 with the provisions of the Federal-State Extended Unemployment Compensation
24 Act of 1970 as last amended by P.L. 93-572.

25 * Sec. 4. This Act is retroactive to January 1, 1975.

26 * Sec. 5. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
