

The Legislative Affairs Agency, State of Alaska, contracts with the Institute of Social, Economic and Government Research, University of Alaska, (ISEGR), for the provision by George W. Rogers of professional services to the Special Pipeline Impact Committee. The services to be rendered shall be as prescribed by the Chairman, and George Rogers shall serve at the direction of the Chairman.



CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES



Compensation for services of this type shall not exceed the sum of Six Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$6,400.00) without the prior written approval of the Chairman. In addition, Joseph P. Witherspoon will be reimbursed for necessary secretarial services performed during the course of his work at the prevailing rate in the Austin, Texas, area. Reimbursement shall not exceed the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) for services of this type without the prior written approval of the Chairman. In addition, Joseph P. Witherspoon will be reimbursed for expenses necessarily incurred by an attorney in the performance

of this agreement. Reimbursement for services rendered in this regard shall not exceed the sum of Three Thousand Dollars* (\$3,000.00) without the prior written approval of the Chairman. In addition, Joseph P. Witherspoon will be reimbursed for travel expenses when previously approved in writing by the Chairman.

Joseph P. Witherspoon shall submit monthly statements to the Legislative Affairs Agency indicating the amount due and the Legislative Affairs Agency shall pay for said services within fifteen (15) days of the receipt of billing.

This contract shall be terminated upon the mutual agreement of the parties.






CONTRACT FOR ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT


