6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the computation of state aid under
7 the public school foundation program; and providing

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

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12 district shall make a report at the end of the first nine weeks of
13 school, which contains a new estimate of its average daily membership
14 for the fiscal year and other information which will aid the commis-
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16 aid. This new estimate and information of average daily membership
17 shall be the basis for the computation and distribution of each dis-
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19 shall, on the basis of this new estimate and information, make recom-
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28 February 15 and on the 15th of each subsequent month, one-fifth of
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1 distributed. However, one-half of the June payment shall be withheld
2 pending a final determination of the district's state aid.

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5 June 16 each district shall transmit to the commissioner a final
6 computation of the district's state aid. The commissioner shall
7 process each district's computation in the manner provided by sec.
8 150(a) of this chapter. However, in no event may the entitlement of
9 a school district to state aid be less than that computed under
10 sec. 170 of this chapter. Additional state aid shall be obligated
11 by the commissioner before June 30. [IF THE DISTRICT RECEIVED MORE
12 STATE AID MONEY THAN IT WAS ENTITLED TO UNDER THIS CHAPTER, IT SHALL
13 IMMEDIATELY, AFTER NOTICE FROM THE COMMISSIONER OF THE OVERPAYMENT,
14 REMIT THE AMOUNT OF OVERPAYMENT TO THE COMMISSIONER TO BE RETURNED TO
15 THE PUBLIC SCHOOL FOUNDATION ACCOUNT.]

Our 1973-74 data for the last complete fiscal year, shows only four districts has less ADM at the end of the year compared with the first quarter ADM. The difference was insignificant.
