Dear Bill:

Attached is a copy of a bill draft that you may want to introduce entitled "An Act relating to benefits paid under the territorial Public Employees' Retirement System; and providing for an effective date." [The bill increases retirement benefits for three former territorial employees to assist them in attempting to meet higher cost of living. These individuals are the only persons still receiving benefits under the Public Employees' Retirement Act of 1949 which was repealed in 1951. The repealing act provided for continued payments for six named individuals and to any others who retired before the effective date of the act, which was June 22, 1951. The benefits were increased by the State legislature by 25% in Sec. 1, Chapter 85 SIA 1970, and I feel that an additional increase at this time is certainly justified.

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to benefits being paid under the Territorial Public Employees Retirement System; and providing for an effective date.

- \* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.

CHAPTER 102

AN ACT

H. B. 271


