III. ANALYSIS (See Fiscal Note Preparation Instructions, Section III)

It is noted that a number of projects listed under the category of small boat harbors might more appropriately belong in the port development grant category; i.e., Scammon Bay small boat harbor, Mountain Village small boat harbor, Galena small boat harbor and Northwest Alaska mini barge docks. Little information is available on these particular projects but seemingly they all relate to commercial river transportation facilities. Small boat harbors, as normally envisioned, are neither practical nor feasible in ice bound, silt laden river communities. It is also noted that no "other projects" category is included. Such a category is highly recommended in order to permit communities who are not listed on the bill to participate in the program. Finally, it should be pointed out that the projects listed total \$29,450,000, not \$27,450,000, and that the Cold Bay project has already been included in the Aviation bond proposal House Bill 622. This fiscal note has been prepared on the basis of \$27,450,000.

III. ANALYSIS (See Fiscal Note Preparation Instructions, Section III)

It is noted that a number of projects listed under the category of small boat harbors might more appropriately belong in the port development grant category; i.e., Scammon Bay small boat harbor, Mountain Village small boat harbor, Galena small boat harbor and Northwest Alaska mini barge docks. Little information is available on these particular projects but seemingly they all relate to commercial river transportation facilities. Small boat harbors, as normally envisioned, are neither practical nor feasible in ice bound, silt laden river communities. It is also noted that no "other projects" category is included. Such a category is highly recommended in order to permit communities who are not listed on the bill to participate in the program. Finally, it should be pointed out that the projects listed total \$29,450,000, not \$27,450,000, and that the Cold Bay project has already been included in the Aviation bond proposal House Bill 622. This fiscal note has been prepared on the basis of \$27,450,000.



PROJECT PROFILE FOR CITY OF HAINES ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION  
PUBLIC WORKS GRANT REQUEST

OEDP Status of Haines Area: The City of Haines submitted a Revised O.E.D.P. Report in March of 1975, which was approved by the Economic Development Administration as to form and content. The Haines O.E.D.P. Committee, in November of 1975, recommended to the City Council that Port Facilities Development be the highest priority for EDA Public Works grant funds. The City Council, on December 1, 1975, unanimously in agreement with the O.E.D.P. Committee recommendation, voted to approve Port Facilities Development as the top priority project.

Eligibility of Haines Area: The Haines Area has been designated as an 80% Federal and 20% Local funding district by the EDA Regional Office due to the levels of unemployment and low family income of the region. Current setbacks in the Fishing and Logging Industries have disasterously cut earnings in these two top industries to 20% of their earnings in recent years. Tourism, the third major industry, has also declined disasterously due to the lack of adequate port facilities. Southeast Alaska Fishing and Logging industry set backs have been well documented by the State of Alaska as well as the local area and are the subject of considerable deliberation on the legislative level, both State and National. The unemployment rate in the local region is currently estimated at over 50% of the labor force due to the decline in the economic base.

Eligibility of Applicant: The City of Haines is a First Class City under the laws of the State of Alaska, and is fully capable and empowered to administer Federal Grants.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

History of Project Site: The existing U. S. Government Dry Cargo Dock was constructed in 1953 as an evacuation dock. It is constructed of steel sheet piling driven in 60 foot cells interlocked together resulting in a waterfront face of 1,051 feet. The cells are rock filled and capped with concrete over the forward sections. The wharf area attached to the dock face is 250 feet wide along the entire length, all of fill placed behind the steel facing pilings.

In 1963 the State of Alaska constructed a landing structure on the southern end of the dock for use by the Alaska Marine Highway System. In 1973, the entire area of the southern 250 feet of the wharf was paved by the State of Alaska for ferry traffic parking, and a substantial Ferry Terminal Building was constructed.

Current Usage and Ownership of the Dock: The northern 750 feet of the dock are presently leased from the State of Alaska by commercial operators for freighting operations both import and export. Principal exporting has been cants, chips and round logs for the Japanese market. Recent incoming freight has been heavily related to petroleum development in the Interior of Alaska. Cruise ships have also used the dock facility, but conditions on the wharf area have been poor, and marine traffic control problems have forced the cruise ship companies to virtually terminate their landings in Haines. This has been a severe blow to the tourist industry.

The overall ownership of the dock facility rests with the Federal Government which has extended a lease to the State for the entire facility. The dock has been declared surplus property and the General Services Administration has announced its intention to sell the facility within the next two months, at which time the lease to the State will expire and only the south 250 feet including the Ferry Terminal area will remain under the State lease until the expiration of the original lease agreement. Upon expiration of the original lease, the Ferry Terminal section also reverts to the buyer of the entire facility exposing the State to a potential multi-million dollar loss in investment.

EDA Grant to Aid the City of Haines in Purchase and Improvement of the Lutak Dock: The City of Haines has available \$750,000 of State Bond money with which to purchase the Lutak Dock. There is a 10% matching requirement of City procured funds, which must be available prior to the use of the State Bond money. The current economic depression makes it imperative that the City seek EDA Grant funds of \$100,000 for its 10% matching share of the State Bond money, and to cover the costs of critical improvements to the wharf area. The primary immediate improvement would be the construction of a cruise ship reception facility which would be paved, fenced, and partially covered to ensure proper embarking and disembarking facilities for cruise ship passengers.

The City and State have met in several emergency sessions concerning purchase of the Lutak Dock, and tentative agreement has been reached concerning the efficient usage of the facility to accommodate the freight, cruise ship and ferry uses. An innovative berthing scheme has been worked out whereby cruise ships and ferrys can dock simultaneously while leaving room for commercial freight vessels on the north end.

The proposed cooperative agreement with the State extends to the purchase arrangements with GSA, as the State will contribute other funds to ensure the purchase price is met, and Local-State government ownership of the facility is assured.

Economic Potential of Proposed Project: It is estimated that 20-30 jobs involved in operation of the commercial north end of the dock will be saved with local ownership of the facility. The Tourist Industry will also see a substantial revival with assured berthings of large cruise ships. Easily 20-30 additional jobs will be available to service an increased Tourist Industry. The ongoing development of the large Chilkat State Park immediately south of Haines, the new Kluane Canadian


National Park north of Haines and the Klondike International Gold Rush Park all prove to be substantial attractions to tourists in the near future. Pending improvements to the Haines Cut-off Highway linking Haines with the Alcan Highway promise to more firmly establish the Haines transportation corridor as a vital link from tidewater to the interior of the Yukon and Alaska. The flow of tourists and freight over this improved highway will guarantee increasing use of the Dry Cargo Dock facility. Local government ownership of the dock can guarantee proper traffic control, and management of the facility so that all users are fairly and sufficiently accommodated.

Current Status of EDA Grant - Loan Funds: The EDA Regional Office has stated that all regional funds are presently committed through September, 1976. The Haines requirement for \$100,000 of grant funds must come through EDA action on the Washington, D.C. level. This Project Profile is, therefore, being sent in multiple copies through the Regional Office, and simultaneously to several State Departments and the Alaska Representatives to the U. S. Congress. The two months time frame for acquisition of EDA funds requires rapid expediting on all levels of government if this important dock facility is to remain in public ownership. Local and State government feel this is imperative.
