13 and other plant propagative material from subarctic and subantarctic regions
14 to carry out agricultural experimentation under AS 03.65.

12 1976, for the purpose of funding two cold weather botanist positions to
13 gather suitable seed specimens from subarctic and subantarctic regions to
14 carry out agricultural experimentation under AS 03.65.
