BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 14.07.030(5) is amended to read:

(5) enter into contractual agreements with the Bureau of Indian Affairs or with a school district to share boarding costs of secondary school students;

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.070(c).
