SUBJECT: Fiscal Implications of Senate Concurrent Resolutions 6 and 7

In response to your inquiry concerning the fiscal implications of Senate Concurrent Resolutions 6 and 7 (Legislative Assistance at Girls' and Boys' State), the following information is pertinent.

This agency has sent two staff members to each for a period of seven or eight years as a result of the passage of resolutions similar to Senate Concurrent Resolutions 6 and 7. Attendance at each requires the staff members assigned to be in attendance in Fairbanks and Anchorage for approximately one full week. The cost to the office is basically that of travel and per diem for the four staff members involved, and these costs have always come out of travel funds allocated to the agency and they do not necessitate additional appropriations.

The cost to the agency last year for per diem and travel was \$1542.36. The cost to the agency would be approximately the same this year should the aforementioned resolutions pass the legislature.
