Sec #1 Present sec does not allow school land to be sold -  
Problems when school land is in ~~with~~ a municipality  
especially in residential areas.

Still must go through State Board of Education.

Will not affect University land.

100,000 acres of school grant lands within the state.

Monies from sale of school land go into a trust fund
