Dear Governor Hammond:

The subject meeting, which you attended for a time at the onset, was initiated by Representative Ernie Haugen (reference letter from your office by Keith W. Specking dated January 4, 1978, copy enclosed). We appreciated the time you took from your busy schedule to address the meeting. The meeting was very well attended and, we feel, productive. We especially thank you for the time and efforts of Mr. Jim Edenso of the Department of Revenue and Mr. Eric Yould of the Alaska Power Authority. They were most helpful and informative in our later deliberations.

The meeting resulted in the formation of a committee by the representatives of electric power Utilities attending the meeting. This committee is now identified as the "Concerned Alaska Electric Power Utilities Committee", or as shortened to "CAEPUC".

CAEPUC initiated a Resolution which is hereby submitted to your office as Chief Executive of the State of Alaska.

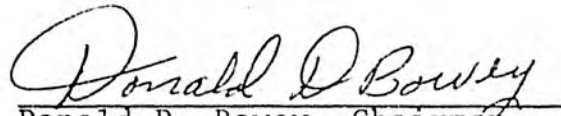
We respectfully request that you as Governor, and your administrative offices take action to endorse the concepts therein, and initiate any actions necessary that will lead to the fulfillment and realization by as many Alaskan citizens as possible of having available to them the electric generating means to provide the lowest possible electric rates for decades to come, the most environmentally sound, and other additional benefits to Alaskans by the use of a renewable resource.

We are taking the opportunity presented by the results of the subject meeting to contact other electric power Utilities within the State of Alaska not fortunate enough to have been in attendance at the meeting of January 13, 1978, and are requesting their endorsement

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska has growing energy problems and energy shortages which are of deep concern to Alaskan Electric Power utilities, and the Citizens of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska has abundant undeveloped hydroelectric resources that may be developed to satisfy many of these energy problems and energy shortages; and

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska has the financial resources in the form of the Permanent Fund and its earnings, the Renewable Resources Development Fund, and the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, financial assistance is needed by Alaskan utilities to build hydroelectric projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, the undersigned, urge the Alaska State Legislature and the Executive branch to provide the financial means and support from the Permanent Fund through the Alaska Power Authority, Water Resources Revolving Loan Fund or other existing government agencies to develop the hydroelectric resources of the State of Alaska.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the agency designated shall evaluate every means to provide long-term capital on sufficient terms to permit the Citizens of Alaska the advantages of hydroelectric power development.

DATED this 13th day of January, 1978 in Juneau, Alaska.

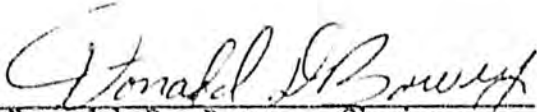

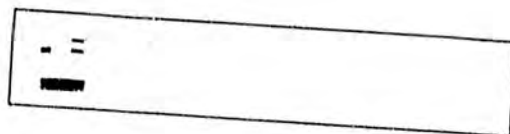

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TRESPASS CASE DISMISSED

Federal District Court Judge James Fitzgerald has dismissed the massive North Slope trespass case. Known as *United States v. ARCO, et al.*, the case has been under consideration by Fitzgerald since last November when the defendants filed a motion to dismiss.

The suit was brought by the Justice Department on behalf of North Slope Eskimos against the State of Alaska and 140 other defendants, including some of the world's richest oil companies, charging them with pre-ANCSA trespass on Eskimo lands.

The case is the outgrowth of the *Edwarsen v. Morton* decision of 1973 which held that although the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act extinguished land claims from that time on, it did not extinguish responsibility for trespass which occurred before passage of the Act.

The decision is expected to be appealed.

COOK INLET LAND SWAP OKAYED

The United States Supreme Court has refused to hear the appeal of Harold Galliett opposing the Cook Inlet Land Trade, thus clearing the way for finalizing the complex region-state-federal land swap.

CIRI President Roy Huhndorf, who shepherded the original negotiations through two years of talks, trades and Congressional amendments, commented that he was "overjoyed" by the announcement.

The negotiations began when Cook Inlet, located in the most populated area of the state, found itself with "mountain tops and glaciers" from which to select land, instead of the "lands of similar character" promised by the Alaska Native Claims Settlement

The Arctic Slope Regional Corporation has joined the State of Alaska and the Anti-Trust Division of the U.S. Department of Justice in protesting the proposed pipeline tariffs filed by the owner companies of the trans-Alaska pipeline.

ment Act.

The 3-way swap was challenged by Harold Galliett and J.R. Lewis as illegal, and their position was originally upheld in superior court, but reversed by the Alaska Supreme Court.

The refusal of the U.S. Supreme Court to hear the case sends it back to the state superior court for issuance of a final order clearing the way for the trade.

ASRC PROTESTS TARIFFS

Arctic Slope's protest is based on the contention that the high tariffs, besides being unjustified, will result in its losing money from the \$500 million to be paid Native corporations under ANCSA. This loss will come about from inflation and time lag in use of the money. The money referred to is the 2% royalty on the oil which is to be paid into the Alaska Native Fund.

The State and Justice Department based their protests on waste and mismanagement which led to large cost overruns in construction, and on anti-trust aspects.

The oil companies have until June 22 to reply.

ARCTIC SLOPE RECEIVES LAND

The Arctic Slope Regional Corporation (ASRC) recently received interim conveyance to 483,233 acres of subsurface land and Point Lay Village received interim conveyance to 85,300 acres of surface estate.

This nearly completes the entitlement of the Arctic Slope Regional Corporation and its eight village corporations. The region has received interim conveyance on 2,904,955 acres of surface and subsurface estate with a regional selection on Anaktuvuk Pass remaining to be conveyed. The villages of Atkasook, Barrow,

Kaktovik, Point Hope, Point Lay and Wainwright have received interim conveyances for a total of 703,240.5 acres of surface estate. Lands for the villages of Nuksut and Anaktuvuk Pass remain to be transferred.

CIRI BOARD RETAINS HUHDORF

Roy Huhndorf has been elected president of Cook Inlet Region, Inc. for the third consecutive time, with John Colberg retaining his seat as chairman of the board. Bob Rude and Gosta Dagg were reelected to the 1st and 2nd vice president posts respectively. Charles Roehl was chosen 3rd vice president; Jerry Brown, treasurer; and William Prosser, secretary.

The new slate of officers was elected in a weekend meeting of the new board. It was the first

board meeting since the recent court ruling that the challenged proxies carried by Jerry Ward must be counted in tallying the board of directors election results.

- VILLAGE AFFAIRS -

VILLAGE CHOICE GOVERNS 14(c)(3)

The state's new municipal trustee for 14(c) lands should be a trustee for the villages themselves, rather than for the state, Bob Jenks told a recent Land Manager's Association meeting. This premise of local control and involvement will form one of the basic tenets of the municipal trustee's philosophy which he is in the process of formulating, he said. Jenks has been appointed the municipal trustee for the lands conveyed to the state in trust under Section 14(c)(3) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act.

That section requires village corporations to reconvey 1280 acres for a municipality. If there is no municipality in existence, the land is to be conveyed to the State in trust for a future one.

Several seemingly minor, but very important issues have come up in regard to these conveyances already, according to Jenks, in spite of the fact that there has been almost no land to reconvey as yet.

The first issue is that of who has a say over the choice of lands to be conveyed. Jenks' strong feeling, which is also held by the LMA, is that the choice of which 1280 acres is conveyed is strictly between the Village corporation and the municipality involved.

The region may be marginally concerned, but it is no one else's business; not the LUPC, BLM, nor the State or any of its agencies.

By the same token, none of these agencies or other individuals have a right to nominate easements of any kind on such lands intended for reconveyance to the municipality or the state in trust.

This point was addressed by Kevin Waring of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs to the Division of Aviation in February. "My concern relates to the implicit premise that it is appropriate for the Division of Aviation, or the Bureau of Land Management or the Federal-State Land Use Planning Commission unilaterally to request or impose easements or seek leases specifically upon lands expected to be designated as part of the Section 14(c)(3) conveyance to the Trustee. The presumption that any lands so encumbered will

AFOGNAK CHANGES NAME

On May 28, Natives of Afognak, Inc. held their fourth annual stockholders meeting, and voted to streamline the name of their corporation to Afognak Native Corporation.

The name change and the amendment to the Articles of Incorporation necessary to make it, was one of the main items of business at the meeting. Also approved was a change in the corporation's authorized stock and the issuance of 100 shares to each village corporation stockholder.

Three directors were reelected for three year terms on the staggered-term board. Officers for the corporation for the coming year are: Iver Malutin, president; Mary Fearn, vice president; Pete Olsen, secretary; and Dick Wamser, treasurer-general manager.

LITIGATION UPDATE

Chugach & Eyak v. Forest Service

The U.S. Forest Service has agreed with the two Native corporations not to issue any free use permits in the forest on Native-selected lands, and not to issue any permits at all without consultation with the corporation involved. The agreement is very specific on what "consultation" is. They have further agreed not to issue such permits without *consent* except in nine specific instances (where permits have already been issued), and then the money will go into escrow.

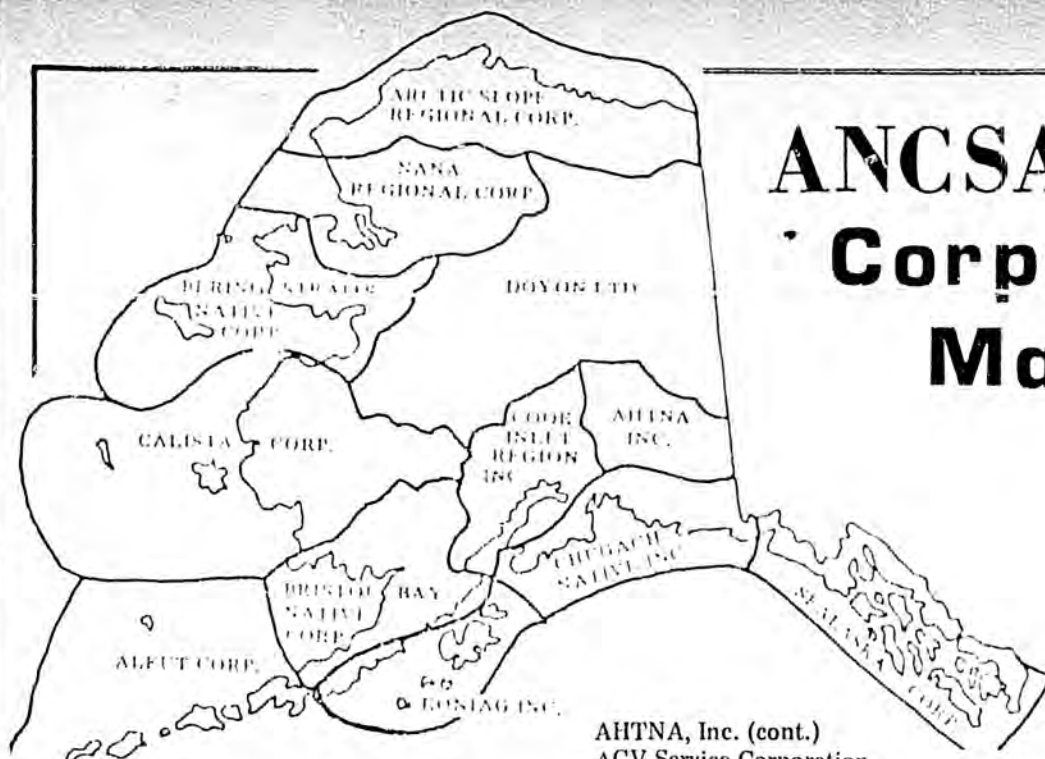

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BRAZILIAN NATIVES EYE CLAIMS

Mr. Alain Moreau, an attorney from Brazil, has been in Alaska recently studying Native corporations and associations on behalf of Natives in Brazil.

"The difference between Natives organizing to press for land claims in Brazil and in the United States is that in Brazil the government discourages it," he said. "If Natives travel to a place to meet and discuss it and the government gets wind of it, they come there and send everyone away, saying it is an illegal gathering, which it is not. But it is effective, and it makes organizing of Native people more difficult."

Mr. Moreau spent two days in Barrow meeting with Arctic Slope Natives; one day in Fairbanks discussing land claims with Prof. Dennis Demmert at the University of Alaska, and some time in Anchorage talking to various persons on the subject. From Alaska he went to Hawaii where he was just in time to attend the ALOHA Association convention in Kauai before returning to Brazil.

Mr. Moreau is especially studying land claims concepts, of which the ANCSA is a bold new

experiment and being watched closely throughout the world. He has talked with Canadian Natives and with American Indians, especially tribes with a cattle herding culture similar to that which is prevalent with some of the Brazilian Natives. Although they do not have herds now, they are thinking of a possible provision for payment of rentals for use of their lands in cattle, rather than money. He seemed very interested in the NANA reindeer herd, but didn't have time to go there to find out more about it.

He is, of course, looking into forms of organization for handling Native claims, in order to develop plans and strategies for Brazilian Natives faced with a similar white encroachment on Native lands.

* Two amendments to Alaska's Omnibus Housing Bill have been adopted by the U.S. Senate, according to Senator Mike Gravel. The first amendment enables Alaskans to participate in the government's mobile home program. "Alaskans have not been able to take advantage of the program because mobile home prices are so much higher in Alaska," Gravel said. "And the guarantees don't cover the Alaskan price." The second amendment creates the office of Indian and Alaska Native Housing within the Department of Housing and Urban Development. The amendment also calls for the creation of an Assistant Secretary for Indian and Alaska Native Housing within HUD.

CHARLES NAMED TO TRAVEL BOARD

George Charles of Calista Corporation has been elected to the Board of Directors of the American Indian Travel Commission (AITC), and will serve as Vice President of the Board.

The announcement was made at the Commission's annual meeting last May in Denver, Colorado.

Charles, President of R & R Travel Agency, is Administrative Assistant to the President of Calista. In addition he serves on the Calista Hotel Planning and Real Estate Committees, and is on the Board of Directors for the Alaska Rural Development Council and Hope Cottage.

The American Indian

Travel Commission is a federally-funded commission created to assist American Indians and Alaska Natives in becoming more proficient in the field of tourism. Funding for the commission is jointly provided by the Economic Development Commission of the Department of Commerce and the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

THIRTEENTH HOLDS ANNUAL MEETING

The 13th Region, Inc. held its annual shareholders meeting in Seattle on June 4th. The meeting took place in the Olympic Room of Seattle Center with about 97 persons braving the rain to turn out; they carried proxies for about 63% of the total enrollment of the regional corporation, which represents Alaska Natives residing outside Alaska.

Three of the directors elected last year were up for re-election, and were all re-elected without opposition to three-year terms. The directors retained the full slate of offices elected last year.

During the past year, the newest of the ANCSA

corporations has acquired one subsidiary business corporation: Alaska House Movers, Inc., with Jerry Osborne, manager. They have also set up a non-profit arm, Al-Ind-Esk-A, Inc. Gregg Frazier is manager and executive director of that corporation, which has offices in both Seattle and Portland.

D-2 HEARINGS SCHEDULED FOR JULY AND AUGUST IN ALASKA

The General Oversight Subcommittee on Alaska lands has scheduled public hearings in Alaska on H.R. 39, the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act, better known as the Udall Bill.

The schedule for July includes: July 1-4 — Field trips to proposed wilderness areas; July 5 — Public Hearing, Ketchikan; July 6 — Field trip to Admiralty Island and Angoon; July 7 — Public Hearing, Juneau; July 8 — Field trip to Misty Fjord; July 9 — Public Hearing, Ketchikan.

Less formal "town meetings" will be held in two villages of each region, prior to Public Hearings scheduled for Anchorage on August 12, and Fairbanks on August 20.

Persons wishing to testify at the public hearings should write a letter of request to Representative John Seiberling, 1225

Longworth Building, Washington, D.C. 20515. The letter should state the date of the hearing the individual wishes to testify. A copy should be sent to Congressman Don Young, 1210 Longworth Building, Washington, D.C. 20515, for follow-up.

Additionally, a hearing on implementation of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act will be held in Washington, D.C. on July 21, at 9:45 AM, Longworth Building, Room 1324.

* Over \$18 million in Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA) funds has been awarded to Alaska —with the majority going to programs designed and administered by Alaska Native non-profit corporations. According to Senator Mike Gravel, the funds were made available through an amendment to the CETA Act which was designed to include the bulk of Alaska's Native population. As originally written CETA funds were only available to Native Americans living on reservations. Commenting on the new allocation, Gravel said, "This is a significant amount of money, and it should have a real impact in areas of the state where unemployment is a particularly severe problem."

* Jack Wick was recently appointed to the Alaska Power Authority for a three-year term by Governor Hammond, who cited his specific knowledge of rural Alaskan power needs in making the choice.

* Construction on a 50-bed, \$36 million hospital in Bethel is scheduled to begin June 20, with completion expected by 1980. Hoffman Construction of Oregon is construction manager, with local contractors including a joint venture of the Aleut Corporation and Walsh and Company.

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VILLAGES FORM AVIATION FIRM

Coastal Management Corporation, a management corporation formed by six villages in the Nelson-Nunivak Islands region of Western Alaska, is getting into the aviation business. CMC is completing the purchase of certain assets of Petco Aviation, which includes 5.2 leased acres, a 60 X 100 hanger, office space, flight training equipment, tools and equipment.

Located at the west side of Anchorage International airport, the shop is a certified maintenance facility, and CMC provides complete maintenance services for most types of aircraft, from small planes to twin turbo units. The new company, Village Aviation, will have its primary base at the International Airport sites. Village Aviation would like or is considering to establish a base at Bethel, to serve outlying Western Alaska villages, especially the members of CMC (Toksook Bay, Chefornak, Newtok, Mekoryuk, Nightmute-Umkumiute, Tununak).

Village Aviation began back in June, 1976, when CMC Board Member Fred Don of Mekoryuk directed the CMC staff to pursue the concept of village-owned air service.

Village Aviation plans to begin an expediting service this year, which will cut costs and delays in providing goods and groceries to villages.

"We hope to cut out the middle men in providing this delivery service," said Don Harris, manager of CMC and president of Village Aviation. "We hope to have villagers ordering directly from Bethel or Anchorage, then we would purchase the goods and ensure they are delivered in a minimum amount of time to the village."

Village Aviation is submitting applications to the Alaska Transportation Commission; upon approval, Village Aviation will then begin to contract with businesses and suppliers to begin full operations.

"Our aim at first is to serve a limited clientele -- but serve them well," said Harris. "Then when we get fully certified and build staff, we can expand into our full range of plans."

Professional staff members are already on board at Village Aviation, with the latest addition of pilot Ted Moses from Mekoryuk.

EASEMENT POLICY MAY CHANGE

A meeting held recently with Department of Interior officials in Washington, D.C. may result in a complete re-evaluation of easement policies that have "ground the ANCSA process to a halt."

AFN President Byron Mallott met with Assistant Interior Secretary Guy Martin and the Department's solicitor last week and received a firm commitment the two would recommend to Secretary Cecil Andrus he completely review existing easement policies affecting Native lands.

According to Mallott, AFN won't be satisfied with just technical changes that would modify current regulations.

"We'll look at how the Secretary deals with easements as a bellwether issue to see the Administration's policy," Mallott said.

"If they stand pat on easements, we'll know exactly where we stand with the Department."

AFN is currently in the process of drafting suggested changes to the liberal easement policies which, at present, allow the public to act to create easements across Native owned lands.

One of the changes AFN will advocate in its position paper will be no continuous coastal easements. A study conducted on lands of two regional corporations showed foot-path easements would total some 10,000 miles, while coastal easements across Native lands would be in excess of 3,000 miles.

"We're just asking for reasonable easements," Mallott said. "We're not saying there shouldn't be any easements across Native lands, but we are saying the Settlement Act shouldn't be used as a public lands act."

Stating that six months has been long enough to wait for action by the Department, Mallott expects a final decision from Secretary Andrus by the end of the summer.

BLM SURVEY PLANS TOLD

Surveys will be made this summer on lands selected by 32 village corporations, according to information from the Bureau of Land Management. Under ANCSA, 222 Alaska Native village corporations are entitled to select lands, of which 53 have already been surveyed in prior years. Of the ones scheduled for this year, 24 will be done by BLM crews and eight under contract to other firms. The contract survey work will be on village selections at Ruby, Nulato, Pedro Bay, Chenega, Brevig Mission, Teller, Noatak, and Tatitlek. Seven Alaska surveying firms will do this contract work.

Four large airborne survey crews began work in May on the 24 villages to be surveyed by BLM this summer, and they will continue work till bad weather hits in October.

The 24 villages are: Takotna, Nikoli, Telida, Gulkana, Gakona, Russian Mission (Yukon), Chogamiut, Marshall, Pilot Station, St. Marys, Andreafski, Kobuk, Shungnak, Tuluksak, Akiak, Kwethluk, Oscarville, Napakiak, Napaskiak, Bethel, Eek, Tuntutuliak, Kongiganak, and Kwigillingok.

"Much of Alaska has never been surveyed," said

Irving Zirpel Jr., Chief of BLM's Division of Cadastral Survey. "To make precise surveys possible where no surveys have ever been done before, we have to establish special horizontal control stations in specific locations and make our surveys from them." A horizontal control crew that does this work will be establishing control stations this summer in the areas of McGrath, Fort Yukon, Colleen River, Emmonak, and Cape Romanzof-Hooper Bay.

In addition, numerous Native Allotment claims will be surveyed this summer.

He added that Alaska is the most difficult state to survey in, due to lack of roads, short summer surveying season, and the state's vast size.

HAIDA CANOE PRESENTED TO SEALASKA

The graceful 18-foot canoe will be permanently exhibited in the Sealaska Galley Cultural Museum located on the plaza level of the building.

Acquisition of the Haida canoe is a culmination of efforts by Sealaska to find, recover and restore a priceless treasure of Southeastern Alaska cultural artifacts designed for inclusion within the new museum.

There were a few tense moments during the final days of work on the canoe when neither Sealaska nor

canoe makers Warren Peele and Clarence Peele, Jr. were sure the canoe would fit through the 36 inch Plaza doorway. A quick measurement of the canoe's beam-- 35 and three quarters inches. Half an inch to spare!

The official dedication and grand opening of the Sealaska Plaza, already assured of 100% occupancy, will be held July 15.

activities, ranging from electrification of Newtok and Nightmute, installation of a new generator at Chefornak, to provision of two apartments for teacher housing at Toksook. Toksook Bay was the central location for field testing of the Alaska Native Human Resource Development program's Business Management Curriculum.

CMC is presently working with various fishing companies to start planning for commercial taking of pollock. They will make

use of the reindeer freezer plant at Mekoryuk. (The plant has been closed for two years due to BIA's over-allowance of reindeer harvesting on Nunivak Island.)

"This will provide job opportunities and income which the people have severely missed since the reindeer plant closure," Harris said.

CMC has been a project advised and assisted by ANF's Village Management Assistance program, under a grant from the Donner Foundation.

SUMMARY: The Bureau proposes new regulations that would establish procedures to govern the determination that an Indian group is a federally recognized Indian tribe. The recent increase in the number of such requests before the Department necessitates the development of procedures to enable that a uniform and objective approach be taken to their evaluation.

DATES: Comments must be received on or before July 18, 1977.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: Various Indian groups throughout the United States, thinking it in their best interest, have requested the Secretary of the Interior to "recognize" them as an Indian tribe. Heretofore, the sparsity of such requests permitted an acknowledgment of a group's status to be at the discretion of the Secretary or representatives of the Department. The recent increase in the number of such requests before the Department necessitates the development of procedures to enable that a uniform and objective approach be taken to their evaluation.

The authority for the Commissioner to issue these regulations is contained in (5 U.S.C. 301), and Sections 463 and 465 of the revised statutes (25 U.S.C. 2 and 9), and 230 DM 1 and 2.

It is proposed to add a new Part 54 to Subchapter G of Chapter I of Title 25 of the Code of Federal Regulations to read as follows:

PART 54--PROCEDURES GOVERNING THE DETERMINATION THAT AN INDIAN GROUP IS A FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED INDIAN TRIBE
Sec.

54.1 Definitions

54.2 Purpose

54.3 Who may petition.

54.4 Where the petition is to be filed.

54.5 Notice of receipt of the petition.

54.6 Form and content of the petition.

54.7 Processing of the petition.

54.8 Action by the Commissioner.

Authority: 5 U.S.C. 301; secs. 463 and 465 (25 U.S.C. 2 and 9); 230 DM 1 and 2.

54.1 Definitions.

(a) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Interior or his authorized representative.

(b) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Indian Affairs or his authorized representative.

(c) "Bureau" means the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

(d) "Department" means the Department of the Interior.

(e) "Indian group," referred to also herein as "group," means any community of persons of Indian, Aleut, or Eskimo extraction.

(f) "Federally Recognized Tribe" means any Indian group within the United States that the Secretary of the Interior acknowledges to have had and should continue to have the status of a domestic dependent sovereign.

54.2 Purpose.

The purpose of this part is to establish a Departmental procedure and policy for determining which Indian groups should have the status of federally recognized Indian tribes. These regulations shall not apply to any group which has already been recognized by the Secretary of the Interior.

54.3 Who may petition.

Any Indian group in the United States which believes that it has the status of a federally recognized Indian tribe may submit within one year from the effective date of these regulations a petition requesting that the Secretary acknowledge such status.

54.4 Where the petition is to be filed.

A petition requesting acknowledgment that an Indian group has the status of a federally recognized Indian tribe shall be filed with the Commissioner of Indian Affairs in Washington, D.C. 20245.

54.5 Notice of receipt of the petition.

Within ten days after receiving a petition, the Commissioner shall acknowledge receipt of such petition and shall have published in the *Federal Register* a notice of such receipt, including the name and location of the Indian group submitting the petition and the date it was received. The notice shall also indicate where a copy of the petition may be examined locally. The notice shall invite comments concerning the petition, which comments shall be considered by the Commissioner in connection with his review as specified in 54.7 of this part, if received by him within sixty days of the date of the notice.

54.6 Form and content of the petition.

The petition may be in any readable form which clearly indicates that it is a petition requesting the Secretary to acknowledge that the Indian group has the status of a federally recognized Indian tribe. It shall include at least the following:

(a) A statement of the facts and arguments which the petitioners believe will establish that their group is a federally recognized Indian tribe which has been and should continue to be dealt with as such by the United States.

(b) A list of all current members of the group, and a copy of each available former list of members.

(c) A copy of the group's governing document or, in the absence of such written document, a statement describing fully the procedures which govern the affairs of the group and its membership standards.

54.7 Processing of the petition.

(a) Upon receipt of a petition, the Commissioner shall cause a review to be conducted to determine whether the group is a federally recognized Indian tribe which has been and should continue to be dealt with as such by the United States. The review shall include consideration of the petition and, to the

extent necessary, verification of the factual statements contained therein and an opportunity to present oral arguments.

(b) The Commissioner may require that the group provide additional information, especially about its members, including but not limited to the age, Indian ancestry, nature of tribal affiliation, and addresses of individual members. On the basis of this review the Commissioner shall make a written report to the petitioner and interested parties setting forth his findings and conclusions as to the group's status. All timely filed petitions shall be disposed of no later than three years from the effective date of these regulations.

(c) The Commissioner's report shall deal specifically with whether the group:

- (1) Manifests a sense of social solidarity.
- (2) Has as members principally persons of common ethnological origins.
- (3) Exercises political authority over its members.
- (4) Has a specific area which the group either presently inhabits or has inhabited historically.
- (5) Is not, nor are its members, the subject of congressional legislation terminating the Federal relationship.
- (6) Has been a party to a treaty or agreement with the United States, or is a successor in interest to an Indian tribe which was a party to a treaty or agreement with the United States, which treaty or agreement was ratified by Congress and remains in effect. For purposes of this paragraph, "successor in interest" to a tribe means an Indian group whose members are principally descendants of the tribe in question, which has evolved from the tribe by a continuous process of social evolution, and which has, as an entity, assumed at least some of the rights, obligations, and traditions of the tribe in question. If the group has been a party to a treaty or agreement with the United States, which treaty or agreement was not ratified by Congress, the Commissioner's report shall indicate, to the extent possible, the reasons for nonratification.
- (7) Has been designated a tribe by an Act of Congress, Executive Order, or judicial decision, or in the legislative history of a bill which was subsequently enacted into law.
- (8) Has, or has been treated by a state or by a Federal Government Agency as having, collective rights in land, water, funds or other assets, or collective hunting and fishing rights.
- (9) Has received services from any Federal or state agency (the report shall specify the exact nature and extent of such services, whether incidental or otherwise)
- (10) Has as members principally persons who are not members of any other Indian tribe.

54.8 Action by Commissioner.

(a) The Commissioner's report shall state his conclusion as to whether the petitioning group has had the status of a federally recognized Indian tribe and should continue to be dealt with as such by the United States.

(b) The Commissioner shall determine that an Indian group is a federally recognized Indian tribe whenever the group satisfies paragraphs (1-5) and (10) of 54.7(c) so long as at least one other paragraph of that section is also satisfied.

(c) The Commissioner shall determine that an Indian group is not a federally recognized Indian tribe if the group fails to satisfy paragraphs (1)(5) and (10) of 54.7(b) along with at least one other paragraph of that section.

(d) A summary of the Commissioner's report and his determination as to the group's status shall be published in the Federal Register and shall be subject to review by the Secretary, who may, by acting within thirty days of such publication, supersede that determination. If the Secretary takes no action within such thirty-day period, the Commissioner's determination shall be final, and become effective immediately. If, after review, the Secretary reaches a conclusion contrary to that made by the Commissioner, he may supersede the Commissioner's determination. The Secretary's determination will be final and notice thereof shall be published in the Federal Register.

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ACCESS ACROSS FEDERAL LANDS STUDIED

Information is being sought by a Congressional investigating team on the effects of federal laws on access to minerals located on non-federal lands. Alaska Natives and Native corporations, as the State's largest land-owners, are expected to be most impacted by such laws as the BLM Organic Act and D-2 legislation. The team is seeking specifics on what effects have been encountered, and on those expected.

Bill Davis, of the Office of Technical Assessment (OTA), told a group of land managers recently that, while a great deal of attention has been given to the question of getting to minerals on federal lands, a systematic examination has not been made of access across the federal domain to non-federal mineral holdings.

Primary attention is being given to physical access. For example, to get to a non-federal mineral deposit, a road might have to be built across land administered by the Department of the Interior. OTA is looking at the various laws and government practices which affect such a project.

A second, different kind of access question, split ownership, also is being considered. In this case, OTA is interested

STEVENS WOULD SPEED NATIVE FUND PAYOFF

The office of Senator Ted Stevens has confirmed that the Senator is considering the introduction of legislation which would make it possible to speed up payments into the Alaska Native Fund of monies due Alaska Natives under ANCSA. The details of the legislation have not been worked out as yet, and the Senator is not sure when the bill will be ready for introduction.

Word is that the State of Alaska is interested in enlarging its payments of the 2% override on oil royalties in order to fulfill its obligations to

the Natives in a shorter length of time.

(Recent figures from the Congressional Research Service on losses to Native corporations through inflation and investment yields foregone under the present method of payout are cited on page 2.)

ANDRUS MEETS WITH AFN BOARD

Interior Secretary Cecil Andrus may decide this week whether to appeal a U.S. District Court ruling requiring the Department to follow easement guidelines established by the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act.

Andrus made the statement last week at a meeting with the Alaska Federation of Natives Board of Directors, winding up a four day visit to the state.

Saying he "came to Alaska to look and listen and reach no conclusions," Andrus did say the Department's solicitor was reviewing Judge James von der Heydt's ruling and that a decision regarding appeal would be forthcoming, hopefully upon his return to the nation's capital this week.

Land Conveyances

AFN President Byron Mallott voiced concern over statements made last week by Assistant Secretary Guy Martin during hearings held by the House

Subcommittee on General Oversight and Alaska Lands. Martin told the subcommittee that a substantial part of the 40 million acres should be conveyed by the mid 1980's, fifteen years after passage of the Settlement Act. To date, Alaska Natives have received title to approximately 4.5 million acres of land.

Andrus told the Board the Bureau of Land Management had advised him that 70-80% of the conveyances could be accomplished within the next three years, providing the Bureau maintains its current staffing level. Andrus went on to say the Department of Interior would start pushing the

GERARD TO INTERIOR POST

Forrest J. Gerard, a member of the Blackfoot Tribe, has been nominated by President Carter to be the first Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Indian Affairs. According to Secretary of the Interior, Cecil D.

Andrus, Gerard was selected from a slate of some 40 recommended persons. Andrus commented that he was "delighted" with the Gerard nomination "to head this Nation's highest post relating to Indian affairs."

TIME ERODES SETTLEMENT VALUE

The economics division of the Library of Congress has totalled up some interesting figures at the request of the House Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs. They concern the general effects of inflation and earnings foregone as a result of the method of payout of \$462 million under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act. The values are as follows:

- the \$344.1* million already paid out was worth \$252.4 million in purchasing power of 1972 dollars (Table 1).

* (There is a discrepancy in figures between this total and the \$323.7 million shown on page 7.)

- the purchasing power of the remaining \$118 million in 1972 dollars if paid out as planned in 1972 dollars would be about \$75 million. If paid all in 1977 the value would be \$81.5 million (Table 2).

- the purchasing power of the \$118 million in 1977 dollars, if paid out over the next four years would be \$109.1 million (Table 3).

- an illustration of earnings foregone can be cited by assuming that the \$462 million was paid in a lump sum in 1972 and invested at 4 percent (the approximate short term Treasury bill rate). The value in 1977 would have been \$562 million. If the \$462 million had been invested in, say, Certificates of Deposit at 7 percent, the value in 1977 would have been \$648 million. (As we know, of course, some of the monies would have been allotted to per capita distribution, some spent on operating expenses of the corporations, some on capital expenditures, and some on actual investments.)

Finally, in using these data and the lines of argument that may flow from them, it is important to remember that an earlier payout would not have avoided the price level erosion of the value of the settlement, but would have allowed opportunities for sheltering the amount from the most adverse impacts of that inflationary period.

manpower available, and that there was "no reason for a prolonged time frame."

"Assistant Secretary Martin's remarks were cautious. Hopefully a majority of the conveyances will be completed by the mid-1980's," Andrus stated. "Right now we're looking at a three year time frame."

Mallott told Andrus that easements were the biggest stumbling block to implementation of the Settlement Act.

"There needs to be a new attitude within the Department of Interior," Mallott said. "In the past the Department has regarded ANCSA as a public lands act." Mallott said Judge von der Heydt's decision made it clear ANCSA was a Native claims settlement.

Co-Man Policy

Sticking with his policy of "looking and listening" while in Alaska, Andrus asked the Board their opinion of Governor Hammond's cooperative management system for the d-2 lands.

Mallott responded that AFN had no policy yet concerning cooperative management, but they were very concerned Native corporations not be denied economic development options.

Subsistence

On other d-2 related issues, Andrus told Board members his visit to a

southcentral village, which he couldn't identify by name, gave someone from the lower 48 a different perspective. Andrus said he talked with a number of villagers during his hour and a half visit and referred to the experience as a real eye-opener.

Andrus visited the village of Branch River earlier in the week with Governor

Hammond to gain a deeper insight into subsistence values in Alaska. Andrus discussed subsistence priorities with villagers and seemed responsive to needs.

"There's no question that the Secretary is sensitive to and will be responsive to the subsistence needs," Mallott said. "I think it's going to become a matter of language now."

Perhaps the most emotional and most discussed issue with the Secretary concerned land conveyances.

Richard Stitt of Sealaska summed the feelings of those present when he told Secretary Andrus the delays in land conveyances are damaging. Native interests more and more.

"All we're urging is that conveyances need to be pursued in a priority nature. We urge a commitment (on the part of the Department of Interior) to resolve these conveyances."

in the laws and practices which affect severed estates. For example, in some places the federal government owns the surface but a private party owns the subsurface mineral rights; this type of situation is being examined as an access matter.

OTA is interested only in onshore mineral deposits and is not examining oil and gas questions.

Land management and resource laws are central to the assessment. Although it is recognized that some laws have an indirect effect on non-federal mineral development, the main concern is with those having a direct effect on access. For instance, the Clean Air Act is considered a law with indirect effects; a mine on private lands

might be influenced if adjacent federal land required maintaining high air quality. On the other hand, the BLM Organic Act is considered a law with direct effects since it sets down the steps which must be taken before a right-of-way will be granted across federal lands.

According to OTA, its goal is objective analysis. The office makes no assumption that access is good or bad. It is concerned with the federal practices and laws which make minerals on non-federal lands both more available and less available. OTA is seeking information concerning both the positive and negative effects which may result from access through federal holdings, asking opinions of a wide variety of interested parties.

OVERSIGHT HEARINGS

"Convey Now" Say Natives

The Chairman of a House subcommittee investigating delays in transfer of lands to Natives under terms of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, called the performance of the BLM "shocking" and "disgraceful."

Congressman John Sieberling, (D - Ohio,) chairman of the House Subcommittee on Oversight and Alaska Lands, made the remarks after hearing Dan Alex of Eklutna report that his village corporation has had to spend 50.3% of the monies it has received under the Act in litigation, just to obtain the land it is entitled to by law.

Alex told the committee that at the present rate of land transfer, it will take 58 years for Eklutna to get all of its interim conveyances, and 2,500 years to get the patents.

In two days of hearings last week in Washington, D.C., the subcommittee heard a parade of witnesses from Alaska Native regional and village corporations outline the problems related to the delay in land conveyance, and call for the adoption of the recommendations of the American Indian Policy Review Commission, especially the portions calling for transfer of all Native lands by December 31, 1978, and the abolishment of the easement provisions of the Act.

Major problems cited over and over again by those testifying were: the attitude of the Department; delays, easements, navigability; and the tremendous cost of litigation.

"FULL REVIEW" PROMISED

Guy Martin, Assistant Secretary for Land and Water Resources of the Department of Interior, told the subcommittee that he had initiated a full review of land claims matters

Natives, the State, Land Use Planning Commission, and Interior Dept. personnel and others are slated if necessary. A final report will be prepared, hopefully by September 15, when the subcommittee has scheduled hearings on D-2 lands again.

John Borbridge, president of Sealaska Corporation and a member of the Indian Policy Review Commission, told the committee that the erosion of the value of the settlement and the economic costs to the Natives resulting from delays in conveyance are "staggering."

Figures furnished the committee by the Library of Congress research team indicate that the loss to the Natives by inflation and earnings foregone amounted to some \$226 million since passage of the Act. (See page 2.)

By far the most poignant and distressing testimony on the human cost of the delays came from the various villages, such as Galena, Ruby and Hoonah. Because of the need for land for village expansion and the construction of municipal facilities of various sorts, these villages

all await the 1280 acre reconveyances required under section 14(c) of the Act. But because Interior has not conveyed the land to the village corporations, these corporations cannot in turn make the reconvey-

Indian Policy Review Recommendations:

The recommendations of the American Indian Policy Review Commission, presented to Congress on May 17th, contained a special section of recommendations on Alaska, according to John Borbridge, Jr., AIPRC Commissioner and President of Sealaska Corporation.

Among the recommendations:

- • legislation is needed on tribal definition. Congress should prescribe the order of preference in which application for benefits under Federal laws and programs will be received from the several kinds of Alaska Native organizations, and should confirm the Tlingit-Haida Central Council, Tanana Chiefs Conference, and similar groups as the general and supreme governing body of a single tribal entity.

- • legislation to limit easements on Settlement Act lands to definitely defined easements across such lands and at periodic points that are necessary under treaty obligations and to provide access to public lands.

- • limitations on environmental impact statement requirements were called for and a December 31, 1978 deadline for conveyance of Settlement Act lands was proposed.

- • Congress was urged to honor its promise to advance payments to relieve the adverse impact to Natives due to delay in construction of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline. (Buckley Amendment)

- • the Commission also stressed the Natives' rights to make use of their lands for subsistence purposes without interference, and suggested exemption from state and local taxation for lands that are undeveloped, leased or unproductive.

- • Congress was asked to determine whether tax exemptions and the period of inalienability of stock currently provided by the Settlement Act should be provided.

- • clarification of interpretation of revenues under Section 7(i), revenue sharing, of the Settlement Act was requested.

ances to the municipality. A host of vitally needed improvements are stalled: schools, airports, housing projects, and municipal buildings. Private businesses cannot get title, hence cannot get financing.

The greatest stumbling block is easements. An estimated 115,000 acres will be taken from the Natives for this purpose. Sieberling suggested that legislation might be introduced calling for the Department of Interior to provide "in lieu" lands to make up for this loss.

He said his committee will communicate with the Department of Interior urging immediate conveyance of village core townships as a number one priority.

Sieberling appeared to look favorably on some reimbursement for land selection costs, and on possible immediate lump sum payment of Alaska Native Fund monies to overcome the effects of inflation losses. He agreed that the ANCSA is a Native claims act rather than a D-2 Act, and that the Native conveyances should be made before D-2 lands are reserved.

"It is my hope and intent to resolve the D-2, easements, and Native land transfer problems during this session of Congress," he asserted. "But if adjustments have to be made, they will not be at the expense of the Natives; I am committed to that."

IRS RULINGS

"What Congress has given, the Internal Revenue Service is attempting to take back," according to Calista testimony read into the record.

Recent rulings of the IRS have disallowed: pre-opening costs, land selection costs, and village training and education programs.

IRS has also taken the position that monies and non-monetary considerations in the exploration benefits from oil exploration contracts related to land selection are includable in gross income subject to taxation.

"Under pending litigation under 7(i) it is possible that this income is subject to 7(i) distribution." Even if this income is found to be subject to 7(i) distribution, the 70% which the corporation may not keep would still be taxed before distribution, then again taxed a second time when the receiving corporation gets it.

Calista testified that these IRS rulings would cost its regional corporation almost \$3 million in one year alone (FY 1973 - 74).

EFFECTS OF DELAY IN CONVEYANCES

ON THE VILLAGE MUNICIPALITIES...

Ruby

"A school was to be built in Ruby, the village right up-river from Galena. It was to be built on land which the village corporation would have transferred to the village government under 14(c)(3) if title had been transferred. In order to acquire the land to build this one school the process was ridiculous.

First—the state who is to build the school had to apply to BLM under section 22(i) of the Act.

Next—under BLM's interim management policy, BLM had to:

First, develop a special lease format under the Organic Act, requiring sending the matter back to D.C. for development;

Then, obtain the concurrence of the region and village corporations.

In order for the concurrence to be issued by the village corporation, it had to:

First, come to an understanding with the village government that the school site was to be conveyed to the city for community expansion purposes under the Act;

Next, submit the matter to the regional corporation for review and advice as required by section 14(c)(5);

Then, hold a joint meeting with the village city council to approve the agreement;

Then, issue a letter of non-objection to BLM for the lease.

The village government not only has to participate in the process I've just mentioned, but it also has to come up with an agreement with the state to convey it the land when title is received. It, too, must express its non-objection to BLM for the lease.

The state, which initially files for the lease with BLM, must negotiate the agreement with the city. It must check out its funding source on each individual project—which sometimes involves a federal agency, which then gives rise to a whole other set of reviews and policy determinations—in order to make certain it can build or operate the project on land for which it doesn't have title.

The regional corporation (Doyon, in this instance) has to review the agreements under section 14(c)(5) ANCSA. It has to negotiate with the state and BLM as to the wording of the lease to make certain its rights as the subsurface owner are protected. It, too, must issue a letter of non-objection to BLM for the whole transaction.

BLM then goes through its procedures to determine whether it can issue a lease and under what conditions. And finally a lease is issued.

Now, had the land been conveyed as the Act states that it should have been, there would be a simple three-step procedure:

- 1) the state requests the land from the city;
- 2) the city and state agree as to the school site;
- 3) the city conveys the land to the state.

In my example, we were dealing with a school, but this process is repeated time and time again for any project which requires land to be used."

Eklutna

"It has been a very frustrating experience trying to get our corporation on a viable footing. Under the Act we get a small amount of money in proportion to the responsibilities for making our corporation viable. We are not the typical Alaska village. Eklutna now is in part, a part of the Municipality of Anchorage. We are faced with the large task of generating the capital by 1991 of just paying the taxes that will become due on land that we do not yet have. It seems that every time we have met the requirements for the transfer of land we learn of new requirements to be met or of new reasons why we cannot receive land."

"Eklutna, Inc. has 1600 acres of an entitlement of 115,000+ acres, or 1.39% of its entitlement. Back in 1974 we published in a local paper, four consecutive times, that we were to receive about 5,000 acres. (Because of protests from the State and borough) BLM saw fit to retain 3400 acres. Failure of BLM to transfer the 3400 acres has had a negative impact financially on Eklutna as can be seen by the letter from Roger Bates of Jack White Real Estate Company..."

The relevant portion of the letter reads: "If in 1977 you used a value of \$3,000 per acre, the land could have a value of as much as \$10,200,000. When you consider that you would have to use prudent development so that you would not flood the market with real estate and development was done in orderly fashion, the lost revenue to Eklutna, Inc. would probably be from \$1,000,000 to \$1,750,000 in the preceding three years. One must realize that the land is some of the finest ground in the area with good soils and very desirable for both residential and commercial development."

Seldovia

Economic losses to the Seldovia Native Association by reason of non-conveyance are staggering. Based on a current timber sale and a timber survey by Louisiana-Pacific, \$88,686,113.40 worth of marketable timber stands on Seldovia-selected lands, most of it unavailable to the corporation for development. Of their 187,391 acre entitlement, Seldovia has received only 13,728.5 acres to date.

"Although we selected (our land) primarily for timber, we also realize the value of waterfront land... Being on the Kenai Peninsula, much of this is high value recreational land, and well-suited for home development. A good part of the waterfront land fronts the Lower Cook Inlet OCS sale area, which makes it ideal for industrial uses for the petrochemical industries. Of course, not having title, we cannot make any commitments with industry, though interest has been shown in this area..."

Hoonah

"The purpose of the Act is simple—to settle Native land claims. We have surrendered our claims contingent on, among other things, the promised land conveyances. The delay in making the required conveyances has caused our corporation to suffer economic hardship. We cannot go forward as a viable, competitive economic unit of society until we have the land to which we are entitled.

"More specifically, we cannot borrow money for the development of timber resources until we have those resources surveyed, and we cannot afford to spend approximately \$45,000 for a timber survey until we know which land to have surveyed.

"Furthermore, we cannot finalize SANTCO, our proposed Southeast Alaska Native Timber Company, until we know the extent of our resources..."

"Upon receiving patent to the designated lands the village corporations are obligated to convey not less than 1,280 acres to any municipal corporation in the Native village. However, because Huna Totem has not yet received its land conveyances, this cannot be done.

"While the city of Hoonah is small in size compared to local communities, we have recently constructed 65 new homes and are planning for 35 more single family dwellings. Plans are also being finalized for 17 units of elderly housing. Consideration is being given to developing a new business/shopping area and constructing a cold storage facility to support our fishing industry. These plans are stymied because the city of Hoonah does not have available land for expansion until we convey the 1,280 acres, and we cannot because we have not received our land conveyances from the Federal Government. Surely these delays were not envisioned when the Act was passed by Congress."

CHENEGA BUYS CHARTER BOAT

Chenega Corporation has bought a new charter vessel, the *Chenega Bay*, a 26-foot fiberglass sedan cruiser built by Pleasurecraft Marine of Tacoma.

Under the command of Ken Hawkins, the *Chenega Bay* will go into the business of charter fishing trips from Seward this summer, and from Cordova this fall for hunting trips.

Chenega's first successful charter fishing boat, *Chenega*, sank last year; the insurance settlement was used to reinvest in the new vessel.

CIRI J.V. FOR BETHEL UTILITIES

Cook Inlet Region Inc. (CIRI) has joint-ventured with Alaska Constructors, Inc. to install sewer and water distribution systems in Bethel. Work began on the project the first week in June. All pipes will be elevated and insulated for arctic weather. About 240 buildings will be connected to the system; 60 of them had to be raised on their foundations to insure proper drainage. The project was necessitated after a fire in 1975 destroyed the Bethel power plant and all underground utilities froze.

PORT GRAHAM CORPORATION

Port Graham Enterprises, Inc., a subsidiary of the Port Graham Corporation, has purchased 7.5 acres in downtown Homer. Plans for the real estate include two apartment complexes, to be completed by November. The remaining acreage is being studied for possible subdivision or more apartments. Port Graham Enterprises is headquartered in Homer; its general manager is Durente Tabios.

Port Graham Corpora-

tion also owns the 86 foot fishing vessel *Beluga*, which is currently tendering in Cook Inlet; and owns and leases a 3000 square foot office building in Port Graham. They also own and lease heavy equipment, mostly for local village work.

LAND CLAIMS RECORDS SOUGHT

The Alaska Native Foundation has launched a project to locate and preserve records relating to the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971, particularly the campaign for its enactment. The collection will serve as a means of preserving the records in a central location and thus will become a major resource for study of the Settlement Act and the Native role in its enactment.

Persons and organizations who were involved in the development of the legislation will be asked to donate relevant records of Native associations and personal records to this collection, which will be under the administration of the Foundation.

The first phase of the project, locating the records so as to determine the space needed for the

collection and a search for a permanent repository for the materials, is being underwritten by the Bureau of Indian Affairs. Later phases will involve gathering the documents, arranging and describing them, and publication of inventories.

Barbara S. Smith, a trained historian and archivist, has been named project director. Anyone with information on such records is urged to call the Alaska Native Foundation, 274-5638.
