

RE: HB 264

The State Affairs Committee considered the Sponsor Substitute for House Bill 264 and, as the report indicates, passed it out with a majority do pass recommendation. One member however requested that I indicate to you by memorandum that the funding for this bill -- roughly \$20,000 per airport -- may be high. In addition it was pointed out that the operations and maintenance costs were not identified. Because of the late date I did not want to hold this bill up while the fiscal note was prepared, however, I did agree to bring these two matters to your attention.
