III. ANALYSIS (See Fiscal Note Preparation Instructions, Section III)

Sections 1 - 3 have no budget impact except in the event of a disaster. This funding is received from the Governor's Emergency Fund.

Section 5 & 7 will require expenditures of \$330.0 in FY84, \$197.0 in FY85, and \$454.0 in FY86. Beginning FY87, the expenditures will decrease each year as current (1980-81) members drawing the old bonus payment will begin to retire or leave the Guard for other reasons. As these older members retire or drop out, the new program will have completed paying 33 1/3% of the new members. Attached to this fiscal note is a breakdown of the payments to be paid FY 84-87.

Section 6 extends reimbursement of tuition to retired members. About 15 retired members would use this benefit. The average reimbursement is \$125.00 for active members. Shown above as \$5,000 each year.
