COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL # 703 (L&C)

"An act relating to the use of communications media under the Administrative Procedure Act."

CS for House Bill No. 703 allows the use of communications media for hearings and meetings under the Administrative Procedure Act.

Analysis

This bill would enhance the opportunity for public input into state administrative deliberations by allowing use of communications media. People living in remote locations, whether members of administrative bodies or interested citizens, will be able to participate in hearings or meetings with much less trouble and expense if this bill passes. It is a cost effective and efficient way for the department to conduct business and take public testimony on an issue.

Contractual monies presently budgeted for in FY'83 for telephone conference calls could be utilized for payment of teleconference services. Use of the Legislative Teleconference Network is anticipated at minimal cost, during those months the Legislature is not in session. For approx. 6 mos. each year, we anticipate utilizing the LTN two times each month at a cost of \$18/site; with boards usually consisting of 5 to 7 members, with majority as listed below:
 30 min. - 60 min. meetings; Anch., Fbks, & Juneau sites = \$350.00

During those months the LTN is not available on a guaranteed basis, other teleconferencing methods are available. General costs for a 30 minute teleconference call for a 7-member board would be: \$385.apprx.
 Anticipate utilizing these services two times per month, 6 months/yr. = \$4,620.00
