395 Bylsma suggested holding bills over until HB 813 is in committee.

403 Bob Cooksey, NEA Alaska - encouraged taking body of ^{SB} ~~HB~~ 813
& incorporating it into a CS for one of the other bills.

Explained ^{SB} 813 is left out of bill. Encouraged moving
bill.

445 Arnoldt offered Comm sectional analysis of bills.

452 Bob Greene, Ak School Bds Assoc - tends to agree w/ prin
testimony that emphasis shd be on ^{SB} ~~HB~~ 813; explained
his reasoning. School Bds concern is primarily w/ fiscal
impact. Prefer to see bill that includes employee
contn & phase in of benefits over period of time.

on manner of pymt. Wanted consideration for future
yr funding. Suggested 2 plans.
