III. ANALYSIS (See Fiscal Note Preparation Instruction, Section III)

Basic assumption of fiscal note is applicants for photographic ID cards are required to use existing facilities of the Department.

Fiscal note based on estimate of 50,000 fishermen, of which 10% do not currently have photographic identification. Therefore, 5,000 would have to obtain ID cards. Film for issuance of 5,000 ID cards, at \$.79 each, equals \$3,950.00.

If bill not effective until FY83, then the \$3,950 would not be required until FY83 instead of FY82.

For FY 83-87, an estimated 250 duplicate or new ID cards will be issued annually.

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the regulation of the taking,
7 purchase, or sale of certain fishery resources; and
8 providing for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 16.10 is amended by adding new sections to read:

11 Sec. 16.10.265. PURCHASE OF FISH FROM PERMIT HOLDERS. (a) It is
12 unlawful for an individual while acting as a fish processor or primary
13 fish buyer, or as an agent, director, officer, member, or employee of a
14 fish processor, of a primary fish buyer, or of a cooperative corporation
15 organized under AS 10.15 to intentionally or knowingly purchase raw fish
16 from a seller who does not hold an entry permit or an interim-use permit
17 issued or transferred to the seller in accordance with AS 16.43.

18 (b) An individual who violates (a) of this section is

19 (1) upon a first conviction, guilty of a class B misdemeanor
20 and shall be sentenced to a fine of not less than \$1,000 nor more than
21 \$5,000, and may be sentenced to a definite term of imprisonment of not
22 more than 90 days;

23 (2) upon a second conviction, guilty of a class A misdemeanor
24 and shall be sentenced to a fine of not less than \$5,000 nor more than
25 \$10,000, and may be sentenced to a definite term of imprisonment of not
26 more than one year;

27 (3) upon a third or subsequent conviction, guilty of a
28 class A misdemeanor and shall be sentenced to a fine of not less than
29 \$10,000 nor more than \$25,000, and may be sentenced to a definite term

1 of imprisonment of not more than one year.

2 (c) The commissioner of revenue shall impose upon a fish processor,
3 primary fish buyer, or cooperative corporation organized under AS 10.15,
4 a civil fine equal to the value of fish purchased in violation of this
5 section by (1) the fish processor or primary fish buyer if the fish
6 processor or primary fish buyer is not a corporation; or (2) an agent,
7 director, officer, member, or employee^{in policy making position} of the fish processor, of the
8 primary fish buyer, or of the cooperative corporation. Value is based
9 on the average price paid to fishermen at the time of the violation.

10 (d) The commissioner of revenue may suspend or revoke a business
11 license issued under AS 43.70.020 or a license to engage in the business
12 of processing or buying raw fish if the licensee or an officer, director,
13 or employee in a policy-making position of the licensee has been con-
14 victed of three or more offenses under this section. Proceedings to
15 suspend or revoke a license are governed by the Administrative Procedure
16 Act (AS 44.62).

17 (e) An organization may not be criminally prosecuted under (a) of
18 this section.

19 *def. added* (f) As used in this section, "individual" means a natural person.
20 Sec. 16.10.267. POSSESSION OF PERMIT AND IDENTIFICATION BY SELLER.

21 (a) When a fisherman sells fish the fisherman shall possess

22 (1) an entry permit or interim-use permit issued or trans-
23 ferred to the fisherman under AS 16.43, or other document authorized by
24 regulation to be used in place of an entry permit or interim-use permit;
25 and

26 (2) an identification card that has been issued to the fisher-
27 man by a state or federal agency and that bears a photograph of the
28 fisherman.

29 (b) If requested by the purchaser of the fish or by a peace

1 officer, the fisherman shall present for inspection the identification
2 card, entry permit, interim-use permit, or other document required to be
3 in the fisherman's possession under (a) of this section.

4 (c) Examples of a suitable identification card required under
5 (a)(2) of this section are a motor vehicle operator's license issued
6 under AS 28.15.111 and an identification card issued under AS 18.65.310.

7 (d) An individual who violates or assists in the violation of this
8 section is, upon conviction, guilty of a misdemeanor and is punishable
9 by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for a first conviction, and a fine of
10 not more than \$10,000 for a second or third conviction. Upon a third
11 conviction, the person forfeits all interim-use and entry permits held
12 by him and loses eligibility for future issuance or transfer of interim-
13 use or entry permits for a period of three years. Upon a first or
14 second conviction under this section, the court may in its discretion
15 order a forfeiture of interim-use or entry permits held by the person,
16 as well as a loss of eligibility for future issuance or transfer of
17 interim-use or entry permits, or order a suspension of fishing rights
18 under interim-use or entry permits held or to be held by the person for
19 a period of not more than three years.

21 labor shall print posters that contain notice of the requirements of
22 AS 16.10.265. The commissioner shall distribute the posters to fish
23 processors, primary fish buyers, and cooperative corporations organized
24 under AS 10.15 for the purpose of buying raw fish.

25 (b) A fish processor, primary fish buyer, or cooperative corpora-
26 tion organized under AS 10.15 for the purpose of buying raw fish shall
27 display in a prominent place on its business premises posters provided
28 by the commissioner of labor under (a) of this section.

1 Sec. 16.10.296. DEFINITIONS. In AS 16.10.265 - 16.10.296 [AS 16.-

4 (2) "fish" means any species of aquatic finfish, inverte-
5 brates and amphibians, shellfish, or any other raw fishery resource, in

9 engage in a business for which a license is required under AS 43.75.-

16 (a) A person who violates or assists in the violation of a provi-

18 upon conviction, guilty of a misdemeanor and is punishable by a fine of
19 not more than \$5,000 for a first conviction, and a fine of not more than
20 \$10,000 for a second or third conviction. Upon a third conviction, the
