Recently I have been hired as the Project Director of the Senior Citizens' Center in Dillingham. Prior to that I worked for the Bristol Bay Native Association for three years as director of the regional Senior Citizens program.

In regard to CS for House Bill 640, I urge your committee to pass this legislation.

In small communities in Alaska, Bingo and the sale of pull tabs helps generate funds to provide services. We have used the proceeds from our games to continue the transportation service we have for the elderly and to provide nutritious meals. Also, school groups have earned money for class trips to explore career opportunities.

In other words, the money earned is very necessary for us to help continue our programs. We also use proceeds to meet our 15% local match requirements for the Federal Government and our local match requirements for the State grant we receive.

With Federal budget cuts a reality, we are dependent more than ever on these funds. Please do not take this source of revenue away from us. We have many volunteers who spend every Tuesday night helping out with these games. These games also provide a source of recreation in a small community--some alternative to going to the bars.

We would greatly appreciate your support on this.


