8 * Section 1. AS 16.20 is amended by adding new sections to read:

9 Sec. 16.20.340. PURPOSE. The purpose of AS 16.20.340 - 16.20.-
10 360 is to establish the area described in AS 16.20.360 as the Mata-
11 nuska Valley Moose Range. The primary purposes of the Matanuska
12 Valley Moose Range are to maintain, improve and enhance moose popula-
13 tions and habitat and other wildlife resources of the area, and to
14 perpetuate public multiple use of the area, including fishing, graz-
15 ing, forest management, hunting, trapping, mineral and coal entry and
16 development, and other forms of public use of public land not incom-
17 patible with the purpose stated in this section.

18 Sec. 16.20.350. DESIGNATION OF MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY. (a)
19 The Department of Fish and Game is responsible for the management of
20 fish and game resources on the state land and water described in
21 AS 16.20.360 consistent with the purposes of AS 16.20.340 - 16.20.360.

22 (b) Management of the surface and subsurface estate is the
23 responsibility of the Department of Natural Resources. After adequate
24 public hearings the Department of Natural Resources shall develop and
25 adopt a management plan for the Matanuska Valley Moose Range that
26 shall reflect the concurrence of the Department of Fish and Game. The
27 management plan shall be adopted, implemented, and maintained within
28 three years of the establishment of the Matanuska Valley Moose Range.
29 The management plan shall be revised, if necessary and appropriate,

1 under the same procedure followed for initial adoption. The plan
2 shall provide for roadside recreation sites, including picnicking and
3 camping areas.

4 (c) The Department of Natural Resources may, after consultation
5 with the Department of Fish and Game, adopt regulations governing the
6 public use of the area. The regulations must include provisions for
7 multiple use, as defined in AS 38.04.910(4) and for public multiple
8 uses listed in AS 16.20.340. Regulations adopted for the Matanuska

Subject: HCS SSSB 225 (Res)

I have introduced SB 225 establishing the Matanuska Valley Moose Range in response to declining moose populations in the Valley, a perceived need to preserve public use areas, and to slow development impacting these activities.

The bill, as passed by the Senate, (16 -2 on April 12) includes a drafting error relating to the Chickaloon Bench Subdivision which is proposed by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). It was neither my intent nor that of the Senate Resources Committee to exclude the subdivision from the Moose Range and enable its disposition. (See attachments #1 and #2).

There has been unanimous local support for the passage of SB 225, and the inclusion of the Chickaloon Bench subdivision lands in the Moose Range. The House Resources Committee adjusted the bill with compromise language which would allow disposal of the subdivision in five years. Chickaloon area residents oppose this and I must do as well. Even though the DNR has spent some \$300,000 for survey and platting of the subdivision, there will be far greater impacts upon the Matanuska-Susitna Borough in providing for roads, schools, and essential services for those Alaskans who obtain land in the disposal. I ask that the Finance Committee consider the attached draft bill (attachment #3) which includes the subdivision lands in the Moose Range, precluding their disposal.

SB 225 is one of my priority bills now pending before the House. Regardless of the arguments offered by the DNR on this bill, it is imperative the measure go to the Governor's desk in the form I propose to you.

I apologize for this inconvenience and greatly appreciate your assistance.

DATE: April 16, 1984

It has come to my attention that a technical error was made by legal staff in the preparation of the CS for SSSB 225 (Resources). This bill, which creates the Matanuska Valley Moose Range, is my priority bill now pending before the House.

The effect of the error would be to exclude the proposed Chickaloon Bench Subdivision Disposal, scheduled by the Department of Natural Resources, from the Moose Range.

This exclusion was neither my intention nor that of the Senate Resources Committee.

There has been considerable discussion on whether to include the proposed disposal in the Moose Range or to let DNR proceed with its disposition. The Resources Committee adopted the CS with the understanding that the Chickaloon Bench area would remain in the Moose Range and the disposal would not be conducted.

Given this error, I would suggest the following amendment:

Page 5, Line 5

Delete: "excluding ASLS 82-221"
Line 7

Delete: "excluding ASLS 82-221"

Dear John and Dick:

SB 225, which establishes approximately 130,000 acres in the Matanuska Valley as the Matanuska Valley Moose Range, received Senate Resources Committee approval on March 30th. The Resources Committee Substitute for SB 225 has been adopted by the full Senate, and is currently awaiting your committee's consideration.

An error in the legal description portion of the bill has been called to my attention. Page 5, Subsection 12, describes an area commonly known as Chickaloon Bench. The effect of the error would be to exclude a portion of the Chickaloon Bench from the Moose Range. This does not reflect the position of the Senate Resources Committee nor the final action of the Senate on this bill. Page 5, lines 5-7 should read:

Sections 1-12
Section 14, N1/2
Sections 15-21

This is to notify the Finance Committee that there are three drafting errors in House Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for Sponsor Substitute for Senate Bill 225 (Resources). The final draft does not represent correctly the actions of the House Resource Committee.

Attached is the corrected copy of the House Resources Committee version of SB 225. The final draft deleted language from the Senate bill that should not have been deleted. Therefore the following changes should be made:

Page 1, Line 13, after the word "area, insert "and"

Page 5, Line 5, after "sections 1 - 12" insert "excluding ASLS 82-221"

Page 5, Line 7, after "sections 15 - 21" insert " excluding ASLS 82-221"

The above changes return the bill to the original Senate version this committee received. Within the amendment the House Resources Committee put on this bill, (page 7, lines 7 - 14) there also is a drafting error. On page 7, line 10, the date should be July 1, 1989. instead of July 1, 1994.

The House Resources Committee has passed out HCS SSSB 225 (Res), to create the Matanuska Valley Moose Range, but several errors in drafting have been pointed out to me. I understand that the Chairman of the Resources Committee will be communicating with you to point out these mistakes, but I wish to be sure that you know the language that was agreed to by the Department.

The Committee intended to pass out the Senate version of the bill [CS SSSB 225 (Res), dated 4/3/84], with the addition of language embodied in Sec 16.20.370 of the proposed bill. In drafting, the language of the amendment and the bill itself changed somewhat, and the product does not represent the compromise agreed to among the various parties, including the sponsor and the members of the House Resources Committee.


Three changes to the bill before you would restore the bill to reflect the negotiated agreement among the parties.

25 (b) Management of the surface and subsurface estate is the
26 responsibility of the Department of Natural Resources. Actions by the
27 Department of Natural Resources that affect the habitat shall be in
28 conformity with a management plan proposed and adopted by the Depart-
29 ment of Fish and Game, after adequate public hearings. The management

1 plan shall be revised, if necessary and appropriate, under the same
2 procedures followed for initial adoption.

3 (c) The Department of Natural Resources may, after consultation
4 with the Department of Fish and Game, adopt regulations governing the
5 public use of the area. The regulations must provide for multiple use
6 by the public, as defined in AS 38.04.910(4), including, among other
7 uses, fishing, grazing, hunting, trapping, and recreation.
8 Regulations adopted for the Matanuska Valley Moose Range shall not
9 apply to private land within the boundary described in AS 16.20.350.

10 (d) Portions of the area important for fish and wildlife habi-
11 tat, breeding, and migration must be managed to sustain fish and
12 wildlife resources in perpetuity, according to the principle of sus-
13 tained yield.

14 (e) The area shall be open to mineral entry, under reasonable
15 regulations that the Department of Natural Resources may adopt, in
16 consultation with the Department of Fish and Game.

17 (f) The commissioner of natural resources may acquire in the
18 name of the state, by negotiated purchase only, without an option of
19 first purchase, title or interest in real property lying within the
20 boundaries of the Matanuska Valley Moose Range.

19 The Department of Fish and Game is responsible for the management of
20 fish and game resources on the state land and water described in
21 AS 16.20.360 consistent with the purposes of AS 16.20.340 - 16.20.360.

22 (b) Management of the surface and subsurface estate is the
23 responsibility of the Department of Natural Resources. After adequate
24 public hearings the Department of Natural Resources shall develop and
25 adopt a management plan for the Matanuska Valley Moose Range that
26 shall reflect the concurrence of the Department of Fish and Game. The
27 management plan shall be adopted, implemented, and maintained within
28 three years of the establishment of the Matanuska Valley Moose Range.

2 shall provide for roadside recreation sites, including picnicking and
