STATEMENT OF INTENT

There is a recognized state government role for support of arts projects and groups in general, and professional, regional theatre serving Alaska in particular.

However, one purpose of state assistance, where appropriate, should be to act as a stimulus or catalyst for support from the private sector.

It is the intention of the \$1,000,000 appropriation, which will be administered by the Department of Commerce and Economic Development, Office of the Commissioner, to establish a pilot challenge grant program to encourage greater private sector participation and involvement with the Alaska Repertory Theatre. The Theatre will be enabled to seek financial support from the business community, foundations, endowments, individuals and other sources of non-state revenue, exclusive of or in addition to box office income. For every dollar raised in this manner, the State challenge grant in an equivalent amount will be available, subject to the limitations of the appropriation.

The appropriation lapses to the extent not utilized during the fiscal year. It is intended that the Theatre will provide the Department with records providing satisfactory evidence that private sector donations entitle the Theatre to receive funds from this appropriation on a dollar-for-dollar basis. Nothing in this appropriation shall be deemed to affect the Theatre's eligibility under other programs.

RE: Mary's Igloo Relocation

I would like to give you a brief history of the Mary's Igloo relocation issue so that you may understand why I am requesting the funds for the design be reappropriated from the Department of Commerce and Economic Development, Division of Energy, to the City of Teller.

Chapter 90, SLA 81 included \$50,000 for "Mary's Igloo - design of an energy efficient community in conjunction with relocation." The money was appropriated to the Department of Commerce and Economic Development, Division of Energy. The Division contracted with the Department of Community and Regional Affairs to complete a preliminary feasibility study by April 1, 1982, for \$13,000 which included taking a survey of the number of people who wanted to relocate. No actual design work was done (copy of the contract attached). The Division of Energy, in November 1982, wrote to the Mary's Igloo Corporation requesting them to make comments on a draft request for proposal for a design study to be funded with the remaining \$37,000. To date, nothing further has been done on the study and the Department has not decided whether they will fund the design project at all. The Mary's Igloo Corporation would like to do a pilot project on the land they own in the Pilgrim Hot Springs area, and until a design study is completed they cannot proceed. I would like to request that the remaining \$37,000 be reappropriated to the City of Teller in order that this work can progress in a timely manner.

In our opinion your review and comments will not prevent you from participating in or offering a proposal on this project.



This is to request permission to use our \$600,000 FY 83 Municipal Grant money for a community hall and an elderly center, two separate buildings, instead of a city hall. The rationale for this change is as follows. Our current community hall is a small, unsafe log structure. It does not meet sanitation standards. Galena is a regional center. At far too many functions, even local parties, it is packed with people. While we definitely need a new city hall, the community feels quite strongly that a community hall is more urgently needed. Last year, the Council did not go for a community hall as Loudon Village Council was attempting to obtain funding of \$600,000 for a community hall and felt they would be successful. However, they were unsuccessful.

The Galena City Council and Community feel quite strongly that erosion needs to be our number one priority for fund requests. With this need to give priority to erosion, it may be a long time before Galena will be able to request other capital projects. Thus, it is the consensus that a community hall should be built before a city hall.

In terms of the elderly center, they simply want and need a small structure. The current community hall would be unsafe and not adequate. There is strong community sentiment that the two could not be combined together. Thus, the Council felt with careful planning, they could squeeze some money out of our community hall budget for the elderly center. If the two were combined together, there would be added cost involved in the set-up for a combined structure anyhow. Also, the elderly are located in new townsite. They feel that the elderly center needs to be in new townsite where they can get to it. The general community feeling has been that the community hall belongs in old townsite.

We appreciate your attention to our community needs and look forward to hearing from you. We are anxious to proceed ahead.

Enclosed is a rough sketch as developed by Loudon Village Council last year. The City Council has not approved a plan yet, but this will at least give you a tentative plan.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION ⑧

This project would provide for the design and preparation of bid ready documents for the Kodiak Senior Center.

A planning study for this project was completed by Galen Grant and Associates in March of 1983. This study provides schematic drawings and has helped to solidify the ideas and support of the Kodiak community.

This funding would provide for the next stage of the center which is the completion of the bid-ready documents.

Normally design is considered 7-8% of total cost. The project is estimated 1.6 million. Since only bid ready documents are called for at this point, the inspection and change order portion of the design would not be necessary at this time.

This project has received extensive support in the community of Kodiak which hosts a senior citizen population of over 300 people. Much consideration of future operating costs was taken into account when developing the planning study for this project.

This project would be a direct grant to the City of Kodiak under the Municipal Grants Account, AS 37.05.315.

A) Analysis of Need:

The Senior Citizens of Kodiak Inc. have pursued the development of comprehensive services and facilities for the elderly of Kodiak Island since the inception of the organization in 1973. In working through these various projects, it became apparent to the board that there still exists in the community gaps in services and facilities. In the Spring of 1981, the board invited representatives of the Department of Administration, Department of Health and Social Services and Community and Regional Affairs to meet with them and members of the Kodiak community to discuss the options Kodiak may have in addressing the needs of the elderly citizens. The representatives from the various departments of State government felt that more information was necessary to document the gaps; and, it was decided that the Senior Citizens should apply for a planning grant from the Department of Community and Regional Affairs.

As provided in the procedures of the Division of Housing, the organization circulated survey questionnaires to the elderly population of Kodiak Island. A summary of this information is attached. After this grant was submitted and approved, the Senior Citizens' Board of Directors appointed a 10 person Steering Committee to study the need for residential care and ancillary facilities. A research Assistant was hired to carry out the day to day activities of the grant and to coordinate the efforts of the Steering Committee. At this point, the Senior Citizens who had originally filled out the survey were contacted to see if they were still interested in housing. Of the original 77, only 12 to 15 could be counted as certain residents. Three operational budgets were submitted for consideration to the Steering Committee for approval; and these budgets and a cover letter were sent to the Department of Health and Social Services to determine the availability and access to funds once the project was constructed. The uncertainty of funding once the project was constructed led the Steering Committee to explore other avenues of residential care for the Seniors on Kodiak Island. At this point, the Seniors are pursuing the feasibility of a Pioneers Home. Since this resource is not appropriate to the constraints of this planning grant, the Seniors asked for clarification from Community and Regional Affairs concerning the parameters of the grant. The Seniors were granted an exception to the housing planning because it was apparent that at the present time there was no further need for housing. Kodiak Island Housing Authority had just begun the construction of a 48 unit low income housing complex with designated areas for Seniors and Disabled. Bayview Terrace, the existing Senior subsidized housing had vacancies. Furthermore, in the six villages on

Kodiak Island, there were vacancies in the existing H.U.D. housing. With the housing issue at a standstill, the Senior Citizens Steering Committee was able to study other options that would concentrate on the merits of providing the necessary ancillary services to the Seniors in need.

In order to understand the necessity of an independent facility to house the Senior Citizens of Kodiak, it must be realized that this organization has been functioning for ten years. It started as a grass roots project with a desk in the donated space of the Koniag Regional Corp. office. After four months, it moved to a back room in the Kodiak Baptist Church. This space was completely inaccessible to the Seniors because of the number of steps and lack of privacy. Again the Seniors moved; this time to a three bedroom apartment in subsidized housing where the Senior Citizens of Kodiak Inc. paid fair market price for the rent of such space. The organization remained there until Bayview Terrace was constructed in 1979. The Seniors have occupied the Community Room in Bayview Terrace (a Senior subsidized 55 unit housing complex) since then. Of course the fact that the Center occupying the present space is secondary to the facility poses a real problem to the program because it is not visibly seen to the Seniors who live in the Community.

The constraints of the program in its present location are space, privacy and access. The space factor has been a large concern for some time. A small apartment which serves as the office area for four staff members is cramped and limited. The reception area is in the middle of the dining area as is the transportation desk, craft area and exercise area. The kitchen is family size and serves over 30 Seniors daily. Other than a small storage area which is on another floor in the Senior Housing complex, this comprises the area available to the Senior Citizens of Kodiak Inc. (all of it under 2000 sq. ft.). Where space is limited, there is no privacy. For many Seniors, this poses a real concern. They often feel that to share their problems behind a screened wall is to tell the world. No doubt, there is need to be concerned about their privacy. Access is difficult for Seniors in the Community who do not live in Bayview Terrace. The entrance to the building does not access itself directly to the area used by the Senior Citizens of Kodiak Inc. This inconvenience is small only to those who use it regularly. To a shy Senior in the Community, it presents a real obstacle to a regular use.

In the examination of the need for residential care facilities, it was learned that there are several members in the community who ideally would benefit from such a facility. However, as has been previously noted, operational costs were the problem. One of the most important aspects of the proposed SENIOR CENTER will be the delivery of In-Home Support Services and potentially adult

day care services. These two programs will certainly fill the gap and allow Kodiak to assist its elderly in remaining in their own homes near their family and friends. The new facility will provide space for the homemaker/supervisor to administer this program. The exercise/health screening room will support this activity and enhance it. Should adult day care be determined a priority, space could be provided for that activity. It is important to note the cost of various levels of assistance to elderly persons. Such a comparison can give insight into the desirability of senior programs in general and particularly in-home support services.

However, without this support available in the community, the potential institutionalization is greatly increased.

Other services including nutritious meals, transportation, etc. facilitate and enhance an elderly person's opportunity to remain in the community. It is interesting to note that at a recent Valentine's Day Party, the center honored seniors over the age of 80 years. The Kodiak area has 39 octogenarians. Of that number, 10 elders are daily participants in the activities and services of the Senior Center. Further, a breakdown of the living arrangements for these elders is as follows:

The percentage of those residing in an institution is 18% of this age group. As was noted above, 10 elders are daily participants at the center representing 25% of the population.

B) Input by Seniors and Community Leaders to the Project

Throughout the planning process, the Senior Citizens of Kodiak Inc. has sought and utilized input from members of the community, and specifically Seniors in the community. The very first communication was the housing survey. After the initial response, the community was publicly and Seniors were individually invited to all Steering Committee and Board meetings which were specifically related to the issue of housing or a proposed Senior Center. There have been public service announcements to remind members of the community to public hearings concerning the new facility. There have been newspaper articles to update the community as to the progress of this project. There have been regular articles in the Senior Citizens newsletter to keep the Seniors informed and to invite them to future meetings. All of this publicity has been designed to actively seek input from those interested in the project. Fortunately, it has worked. The Senior Citizens feel this project has been supported widely from the community as well as Seniors on the Island.

A questionnaire was sent to all Seniors in the community and on the Island to elicit input into the design of the proposed Senior Center. There was a large response to the questionnaire. From the feedback, the architect had a definite idea of the areas considered important to the Seniors who would be using the facility. There have been three meetings with the architect since the initial visit. Each meeting has been a forum for Seniors to refine their priorities in the proposed Senior Center. With this in mind, one must realize that a practical, but independent facility is the primary goal of the Senior Citizens of Kodiak Inc.

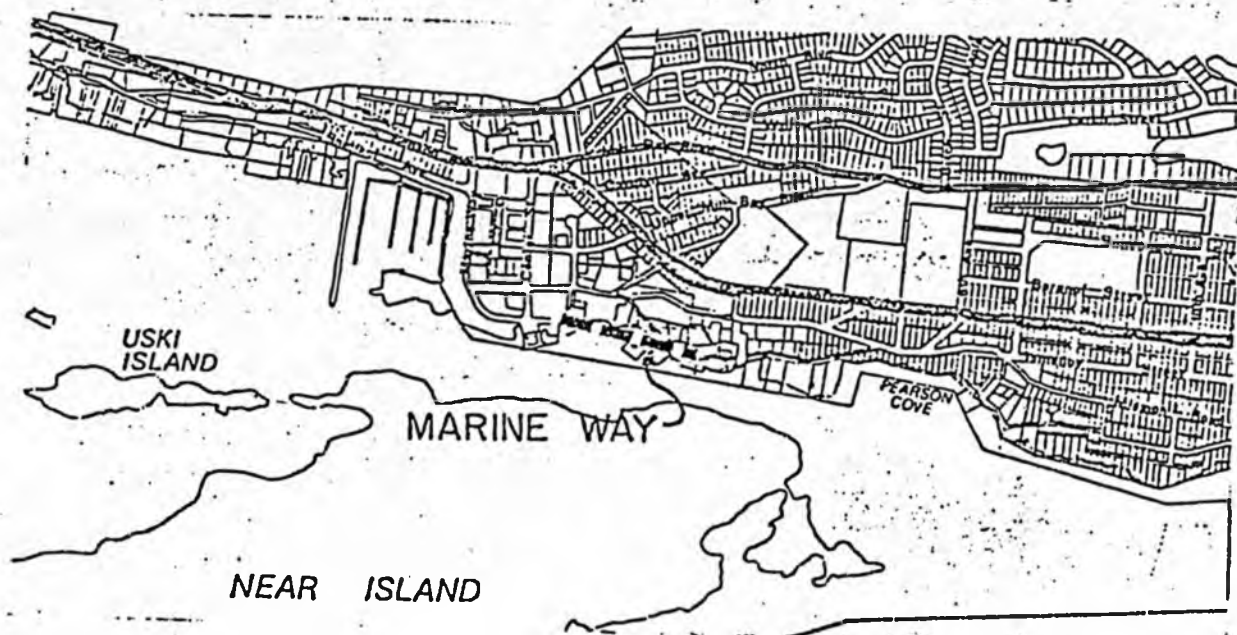


This project would provide for the construction of a sidewalk on the east side of Mill Bay Road from 11th to Upper Mill Bay.

PEDESTRIAN OVERPASS - MILL BAY ROAD/MAIN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

There are now at least two reasons why the proposed pedestrian overpass planned for crossing Mill Bay Road at the Main Elementary School, appears not to be feasible. The first is that there appears to be no public desire for the overpass; and second, the \$100,000 appropriated for the overpass is much less than it would take to build it.

Accordingly, the City and Borough now propose that these funds be utilized for a sidewalk and curb and gutter in this same vicinity, which would be used primarily by students. Said sidewalk and curb and gutter would run along the southeast side of Mill Bay Road, from 11th Avenue to Upper Mill Bay Road. Engineers for both the City and Borough have estimated the cost at \$72,500.

This letter is intended to confirm the projects discussed with you and Senator Eliason, and which the assembly requested your assistance in securing State funding for this coming session of the Legislature. The projects are numbered in their order of priority.

1. BLUE LAKE WATER SOURCE

This project is estimated to cost a total of \$6 million, of which we require an additional \$3,320,000. The following are the funds currently available.

EXECUTIVE PROJECT SUMMARY

Pedro Bay Electrification

For the past four years the community of Pedro Bay has been actively pursuing alternatives for electrification of the community. The alternatives investigated include small scale hydro electric, diesel generation and possible inter-tie to the future Bristol Bay electrification project. To date, each of these alternatives has proven unfeasible since we could not reasonably expect that the community could support the cost per KWH cost that would be necessary to provide economic justification. However, there is now an alternative that will meet our requirements and capabilities.

The recent completion of the Iliamna-Newhalen-Nondalton Electric Cooperative (INNEC) with its state of the art power plant, capability of providing generation requirements for the foreseeable future (20 years), and proven reliability of buried and underwater distribution, provides a this alternative.

We have been working with INNEC in determining the feasibility of this project and are confident that for a total project cost of \$840,000 reliable electric power can be provided to our community. This cost is substantially below that of the construction of a separate plant in Pedro Bay with the associated subsystems that would be required, such as oil storage, water wells, grounding systems, etc. Further, such a system would show the economics of tying into a large system which already meets the design requirements for inter-tie into any future Bristol Bay electrification project.

The proposed system would provide power to ___ residential dwellings within the community and sufficient power outlets along the 25 miles of Iliamna Lake frontage to allow for development of this property for recreational and tourism use. The system would also provide power for the new school facility and the water and sewer system that is now under construction.

A copy of the Initial Feasibility Study and Cost Analysis is attached and additional information is available in the offices of Representative Adelheid Hermann and Senator B. Mulcahy. This study was recently completed and 15.4% has been added to the base price to cover administrative and overhead costs for INNEC. At the current time, funds in the amount of \$150,000 remain with APA for a hydro feasibility study from the 1982 legislature. We would anticipate rewording the legislation for these funds so that they can be used as a part of the overall project, thus the overall appropriation for this project would be \$690,000.

Gentlemen:

We have been granted some funds to do a feasibility study of electrifying the communities of Pedro Bay and Kakhonak via an intertie line to INEC. This letter is offered as our initial accumulation of local informations, personal reconnaissance and prepared cost estimates.

It is hoped that this material is adequate to do an initial evaluation of the viability of this approach. The letter format was chosen as an inexpensive and expeditious way of conveying our current thinking on this matter. We have done a detailed cost estimate for a connection to Pedro Bay first. The connection to Kakhonak is an almost identical problem.

On January 12, I made a low level flight from Iliamna to Pedro Bay with Trig Olsen, the Manager of INEC, Trig has lived in the area most of his life and operated aircraft and boats along this route for many years.

The shoreline is low and rocky, with many rocky islands, points, and small bays. The evident rock outcropping is interpreted to indicate shallow bedrock along much of the shoreline, with thick tundra overburden. This is undoubtedly interspersed with some peat bogs and old stream beds with gravel bases. The mountains rise rapidly from the shore, limiting the routing options.

Trig indicates that the water is fairly shallow, 10' to 40', from the shore to just beyond the islands where it drops off rapidly. This again limits our choices in underwater cable routing to a near shore course.

A sounding map was later located done by the University of Washington Fisheries Institute. This map confirms the water depth assumptions and also clearly shows a shallow route to Kakhonak. A more refined sounding map is available and currently being sent to us.

There appears to be about twenty-five homes and a school right at Pedro Bay with two or three homes along the proposed tie line route. These prospective customers are all near the shore. It is my assumption that this community can be served with single phase power.

Several line construction methods would seem appropriate to consider:

1. Conventional wood pole line, single phase, overhead;
2. Lightweight steel tower, single phase, overhead;
3. Underground cable plowed along the shore; and
4. Underwater cable layed offshore.

Based on my preliminary impressions, let me elaborate on the various methods.

1. CONVENTIONAL WOOD POLE LINE

This type of construction requires relatively heavy equipment, at least a backhoe. It requires a crew of at least 50% trained linemen. This terrain does not appear to be conducive to standard pole setting because of the evident shallow bedrock. The areas of peaty material would be too soft to support poles. It would appear best to build such a line by working from a barge which could carry material and equipment. The crew would need to commute by skiff each day.

It is possible that a more favorable route could be found back from the shore but this would complicate the construction logistics.

2. LIGHTWEIGHT STEEL TOWER

This type of construction would utilize lightweight steel towers, set and guyed on the bedrock. This can be done with hand carried equipment and a four man crew. It takes advantage of the rock outcrops and can be constructed by

spotting material along the route with a barge. The construction needing only a large skiff.

3. CABLE PLOWING ALONG SHORELINE

Again, the terrain does not look good for this option. Near the shore the shallow bedrock would present an insurmountable problem. Further back from the shore a gravelly route might be found, but would require clearing of the overburden. There appear to be many spots where the heavy equipment required would need to be ferried across small bays. This would get quite expensive.

4. UNDERWATER CABLE LAYED OFFSHORE

This technique would involve laying standard high voltage "URD" cable in the shallow areas near the shore. Placing such cable in fresh water lakes is fairly common practice and there exists several installations 15 to 20 years old. Lake Hood in Anchorage, Big Lake and Nancy Lake in the Matanuska Valley. Depth would be held at 20 to 40 feet if possible. At two or three mile intervals the cable would be brought up on a convenient island or point and provided with a sectionalizing cabinet. This would allow isolation of problems and facilitate repair.

My initial opinion is that the first three methods would be much more expensive than laying an underwater cable. This is primarily due to the requirements for specialized heavy equipment, long construction time, and extensive use of a barge over that long construction period.

The underwater cable laying can be done rapidly with a relatively small barge or fishing boat. It can be done with local equipment and a high percentage of local labor.

I offer the following estimate as the least cost alternative.

COST ESTIMATE - Underwater Cable Layed Offshore - Pedro Bay Tie Line

All estimates assume that engineering and construction be handled on a force account basis, managed by Iliamna-Newhalen Electric Cooperative. Maximum utilization of local equipment and labor will be required to keep cost low.

If a formal engineering - contractor relationship is required with full bonding and all union labor, labor and engineering cost estimates should be doubled and all material and transportation cost estimates should be increased by 50%. This is a reflection of high risk and mobilization expense.

This is assuming reasonable cooperation between the Native Corporations, BLM, and the Corps of Engineers. This is based on our prior dealings in this area.

TIE LINE CONSTRUCTION

This is envisioned to entail the use of a landing craft type boat capable of carrying over 100,000 pounds, beach loading, and a flat cargo area to carry a backhoe.

The cable would be trenched into the beach with the backhoe or protected with conduit in rocky areas to prevent ice damage. The boat could lay the cable directly off the back, splicing being done on the boat. The cable route would be recorded with Loran C.

The construction crew would consist of two linemen, two laborers, and an engineer. The boat's crew is included in cost of the boat. A backhoe would be needed.

The crew would work 6-hour days each week. The line crew would commute by skiff each day, staying in either Iliamna or Pedro Bay. The use of a float plane may be more expeditious and less costly.

Maintenance would be minimal unless there was cable damaged by a boat anchor or such. If we assume a \$10,000 problem every 5 years this would amount to \$2,000/year.

The alternative to the tie line would be installation of a small diesel plant and fuel storage. This would need to be about 100 kW, (two 50 kW units). A reliable number would be about \$1500/kW for plant and fuel storage.

The main plant at Iliamna will produce about 12 kWh per gallon while a smaller plant at Pedro Bay will probably produce about 8 kWh/gallon. At \$2.00/gallon this would be a differential of 8¢/kWh.

A plant operator would be required at Pedro Bay. Some of his time would be spent doing meter reading and service repairs which would be present with either power supply. Such an individual would cost the cooperative about \$40,000 annually, let us assign 50% of his time to the plant operation.

This is a very crude economic comparison intended only to show that the two methods of providing power are roughly comparable, depending on interest rates, there exist a tremendous number of variables and considerations not mentioned here.

KAKHONAK

It is thought that a shallow route (100' or less) exists to Kakhonak. This route would start at Newhalen, go southwest to Ten Mile Island, then follow a crescent shaped path across the lake to Lookout Mountain and Kakhonak. This route takes advantage of a string of islands and relatively shallow water. This route depth is verified by the Fisheries Research map.

Although this route has not been carefully examined it is thought to be easier than the Pedro Bay route. Water depth is thought to be less than 100' along the entire route.

If these assumptions are true the cost estimates for a tie line to Kakhonak would be very close to the cost for the Pedro Bay Line. The distance is very close to equal.

As indicated in our Letter of Proposal we feel that this initial information should be assessed by all those concerned before spending any more on detailed design. I hope this is adequate for this purpose. Please call or let me know if I can provide further information or clarify that already offered.

IN CONCLUSION


The intent of this document is to provide a basis for initial evaluation of the tie line concept. Final feasibility will require several specific items.

1. More accurate evaluation of loads.
2. More accurate route selection. This could be done by boat using a depth sounder.
3. Better information from cable manufacturers regarding the performance of their products in water over 100 feet.
4. Better definition and pricing for required shunt reactors.

The final route selection would be the only item which could significantly affect the construction costs. At this time I feel we have assessed the best knowledge available about the lake bottom conditions, but only a depth check profile will confirm our assumptions.

This letter is a request in essence for an additional \$50,000.00 from the legislature to complete our electrical project, for which has been appropriated \$130,000. The actual total needed is \$100,000.00. If the legislature will reappropriate two local items, then half of the needed amount is already available, provided the Dept. of Community and Regional affairs gets permission to release the funds for the new electrical purpose.

\$10,000.00 was appropriated for airport lighting. As you realize our expansion problem caused by the location of the airport we are reluctant to improve it, until it is relocated. This \$10,000.00 can therefore be used for our electrical project.

\$40,000.00 was allocated to relocate our dump. This amount is not sufficient to solve the present dump problems, and so it is further requested to also use this allocation for the current electrical project.

Attached are letters to Mark Lewis. The single page letter, with the council's letterhead, was prepared by the council. The four page letter was prepared on the councils behalf by an electrical engineer, as we do not have the expertise required by the Dept of Community and Regional affairs, for preparing such a project. Also attached is a resolution from the council asking for both the supplementary amount of \$50,000.00 and the reappropriation of \$50,000.00.

This letter is in response to your January 13, 1983 letter requesting information on our requests for State grant funding. The following projects are energy related and very important to the Village:

A. Project Description

1. Expansion of electrical distribution system.
 2. Power house and new generators.
-
1. Electrical Distribution Expansion

This project is critically needed to provide safe, reliable power to the entire village of Koliganek. We are presently replacing our existing electrical distribution system through the core of the Village. This is because the present system is old, the poles are substandard and in poor condition, voltages are irregular and frequently low and generally the system is not up to code and is unsafe.

The new system will completely replace the existing system and provide more reliable power with higher voltages and transformers to avoid voltage drops now existing. The Village has expanded to the east and west of the core area, however, and there is insufficient monies at present to supply power to these two more recent expansion areas that would serve an additional six families and any new residential growth. We are, therefore, requesting that additional monies be made available as soon as possible. In view of the fact that this project will cost ~~\$50,000~~, perhaps a RDA grant could be made available quickly. *100,000*

2. Power Generation System

The village is presently buying power from the School District

generation system. This system will certainly be outgrown within the next several months when the new distribution system is built and the load in town outgrows what the school is able to produce. This is due to the fact that several new projects are currently under development now; a new community center, equipment maintenance building, and an average of four new homes a year. In addition to these new loads, the new electrical distribution system will allow residents to turn on appliances such as freezers, that aren't in use now. All this adds up to a need for new generator capacity.

Additional reasons for new generators and a generator building are the historical reluctance of the School District to supply power to villages and the convenience and reliability of having another power source in the event one system breaks down.

B. Time Table for Project Completion

1. Electrical Distribution Expansion

If RDA monies can be granted by August, 1983, this project could be complete by December, 1983.

2. Power Generation System

It has been suggested that generators and switchgear all be included in a module, similar to those presently used by schools in Alaska and AVEC. The module could be completely built in Seattle or Anchorage and shipped to Koliganek. The Village could prepare the foundations in a short time.

A short one or two pole line extension and transformer to step up the power could be installed in probably a week. A waste heat recovery system could be installed in approximately one month.

It is estimated that the system could be installed from the time the module is ordered in as little as three months, providing the module can be shipped to Koliganek during the barge season.

C. Budgetary Needs

1. Electrical Distribution Expansion

Expansion of the distribution system, including design, engineering, and construction; ~~\$90,000~~ \$100,000

This figure was arrived at estimating for the following items:

4600 feet of primary line
25 poles
3 transformers
7 services
1500 feet of triplex secondary
6 anchors and guy assemblies
4 stub poles for secondary
Engineering and design costs
Supervision and local labor
Street lights
Transportation and freight
Mobilization and demobilization
Equipment rental costs

2. Power Generation System

It is estimated the generation module, including building, switchgear, and generators, engineering and design, transformers and short line extension will cost \$235,000. An additional \$90,000 is requested for a waste heat recovery system for a total of \$325,000.

D. Operation and Maintenance Costs

Both proposed projects will be covered by the operation and maintenance system operated by the Village.

Operations and maintenance costs are fuel, operators, and replacement of capital equipment sinking fund. The villagers are presently paying 37¢ per kWh for power.

We envision the generator building being located next to the new maintenance building and bulk fuel storage area. This will allow for the installation of a waste heat recovery system to heat the equipment maintenance building and possibly the community building and the school facility.

E. Economics

Both projects will have the same impact on the economic development of the community. Electricity is a basic service of community infrastructure and right now it is substandard and not able to serve the needs of the residents. Most types of economic activity require higher electrical use like running a saw, welder, or freezer equipment.

At such time as the Village ties all the homes, school, Alascom, and community buildings, as well as any future development or services such as runway lights, the Village will have a viable economic power company entity.

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F. Local Employment

Both projects will create short and long term jobs. Construction of the distribution expansion and foundation for the generation facility will be supervised by the Contractor, but will be built with local workers. As far as long term jobs are concerned, the burden of maintaining the facilities will fall on the Village, creating maintenance position(s). At the current time, there are meter reading and billing functions that will continue.

G. Impact on Life, Health, and Safety

The additional service provided by the electrical expansion built to code, as well as the reliability of the new generation facility, will definitely improve the life, health and safety of the Village. The new systems will enable the Village to accommodate airport lights, street lights, additional refrigeration, heat, etc.

We feel the two projects above are very important for the 150 members of our Village and request your help in gaining funds for them.





This memo comes in conjunction with my previous meeting with DCRA-HAD Director Barbara Morse-Quinn regarding the Commercial Fishing Loan activity within the Dillingham Field Office.

The activity in this area has been greatly increased recently, and since I am not salaried by the Department of Commerce, Division of Loans and Veterans Affairs, my work load for the Division of Housing Assistance under the Department of Community and Regional Affairs must take first priority. The contacts which the Dillingham Field Office has made either by telephone or personal contact, requesting information or assistance has been tallied beginning in the month of June, and is reported as follows:

With the growing amount of time taken up by my involvement in the fishing loan programs, my work load has increased tremendously. It has become increasingly difficult to justify my work with the program while giving the housing loan program my prioritized attention.

Although both Bob Richardson and Marion Hardy have visited Dillingham at various times, this has only begun since September. Very few people have responded to their advertised arrival and come to the office to ask questions or request assistance. The small turnout may be attributed to the following reasons:

1. The first visit made by Mr. Richardson occurred during the AFN convention. I, myself, attended the conference along with many individuals who may

have had an interest in speaking with a representative from the Department of Commerce, Division of Loans and Veterans Affairs.

2. A language barrier exists between English and Yup'ik speakers in our region. Many native people who do not speak English are hesitant to speak with someone they are not familiar with.
3. Many local people do not feel comfortable discussing their personal financial status with a person they do not know.
4. Many of the people who most need assistance live in the outlying villages and are not always able to, or available to, come in to Dillingham at the convenience of the visiting representatives.
5. Weather at times prevents people from coming in to Dillingham to speak with representatives. In actuality, this happened at least once during a visit by Ms. Hardy.

Because of the small number of people requesting assistance during Mr. Richardson and Ms. Hardy's visits, the Department of Commerce may think that there is not a need for a loan officer in Dillingham. After their visits, however, individuals interested in the program have come for assistance and information on commercial fishing loans. It has been a real problem getting the people into the office at the same time as the representatives.

During the 1982 Legislative Session, under SCS CSHB 643, Chapter 141, Section 41, the sum of \$40,000 was appropriated from the General Fund for a Fisheries Loan Officer to be located in Dillingham. On the same bill, under Section 53, the sum of \$3,500 was appropriated for office space for that same loan officer. Newly elected Representative Adelheid Herrmann, an active proponent of the bill, had unsuccessfully requested the loan officer position be filled. This was further reiterated by Interim Senator Nels A. Anderson, Jr., who had written a letter dated September 23, 1982. Obviously, there has been no reply to these inquiries. (A copy of this letter and any subsequent memos are attached.)

On this date, December 14, 1982, I have contacted our newly elected Representative Adelheid Herrmann requesting she check on the matter. I will keep your office fully informed on any pertinent information received on this situation in the future.

RE: HB 309--Reallocations, Section 16

The sum of \$6,350,000 was appropriated to the Fisheries Enhancement Loan fund last year, with the stipulation that the funds be used for a hatchery facility in conjunction with a hydroelectric project. However, no such project exists, and there are no plans for such a facility in the near future.

This reappropriation will maintain the original intent of the appropriation: fisheries enhancement. Furthermore, the Governor, in his proposed budget, has funded this program at a \$6,500,000 level, compared with \$17 million in FY'83. The reallocation will alleviate a good deal of the financial constraints for this program in FY'84.
