This bill includes ten amendments to AS 4.11 and AS 4.16, which are mostly "housekeeping" amendments with two exceptions.

Section 1 of the bill increases from 30 to 90 days the minimum number of days for which businesses with liquor licenses must operate. If the premises is under construction or cannot be operated for another reason that is not the fault of the owner the license may be renewed.

Section 9 of the bill amends AS 4.11.506(b) (1) to remove the requirement that the board use registered mail to notify all package stores in the state of the results of every local option election.

The other amendments either add cross references to sections or eliminate inconsistencies between sections.

Dear Senator Kerttula:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 18, of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill relating to the licensing and regulation of the sale and distribution of alcoholic beverages.

This bill, which was requested by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, includes nine mostly technical housekeeping amendments to AS 04.11, "Licensing," and one technical amendment to AS 04.16, "Regulation of Sales and Distribution." The most substantive of the amendments made by this bill is at sec. 1 of the bill.

Section 1 of the bill increases from 30 days to 90 days the minimum number of days for which all businesses with liquor licenses must operate each year. Businesses that do not operate for the minimum period are denied license renewal unless the premises are under construction or cannot be operated for another reason that is not the fault of the owner.

Section 9 of the bill amends AS 04.11.506(b)(1) to remove the requirement that the board use registered mail to notify all package stores in the state of the results of every local option election. The present requirement is too costly and unnecessary.

The other amendments in the bill are more technical in nature and either add cross references to other sections of AS 04.11 and 04.16 or eliminate inconsistencies between sections (such as between AS 04.11.330(a) [denial of license renewal] and AS 04.11.320(a) [denial of initial license]).

I join with the board in urging passage of this bill.
