SUBJECT: HB 644

The district court judges discussed HB 644, and our recommended wording is as follows:

(b) If a person released under the provisions of this chapter fails to appear before the court as required or violates the conditions of his or her release, upon the issuance of an arrest warrant by the judge or magistrate the surety or its agent may arrest the person.

If the wording contained in HB 644 isn't changed, arguably it would require a separate warrant directed to the surety alone, along with or instead of the warrant held by the police. The problems of false arrest that could occur with two warrants outstanding would be tremendous.

I'd be glad to discuss this further with you.
