
SUPPORT

MEMORANDUM

TO: House Resource Committee

FROM: Dan Beck 

RE: HB 527

During this past interim I worked for the House Resources Committee as an aide working out of the Delta Junction Legislative Information Office.

The Delta Fish and Game Advisory Committee requested that Representative Shultz introduce legislation that would clarify the definition of resident in AS 16.05.940 (19) for the purpose of obtaining fishing and hunting license.

Their motive in requesting this measure was to alleviate problems in enforcement and to remove portions of the statute that were irrelevant.

In researching the need for this measure I found no one who had any idea what purpose the deleted section provided and all parties contacted at Fish and Wildlife Protection agreed that the addition of the words referring to the preceding twelve months would help with enforcement.
