Dear Senator Bennett:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 23, of the Alaska Constitution, and in accordance with AS 24.08.210, I am transmitting an executive order that transfers the fire-service training program from the Department of Education (DOE) to the Department of Public Safety (DPS). Sections 1 and 2 of this Order remove that function from DOE, and sec. 3 gives it to DPS.

This function was added to the statutes for the Department of Education by secs. 1 and 5, ch. 86, SLA 1979. It appears that the program would be more appropriately located in the Department of Public Safety, and the commissioners of both of those departments, as well as fire departments around the state, support the transfer. It is one of the recommendations of the Fire Prevention and Control Task Force, in its December 1984 report.

Under its general authority to administer grants, to contract with school districts, to promote vocational education, and to administer the state's education program (AS 14.07.020(13), 14.07.030, AS 14.35, and AS 44.27.020), The Department of Education has handled grants for fire-service training. To assure that appropriate grant administration continues, this Order's proposed AS 18.70.020(4) includes a specific reference to grants.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 62

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 23, of the Alaska Constitution, and in accordance with AS 24.98.210, I order the following:

* Section 1. FINDINGS. As governor, I find that it would be in the best interests of efficient administration and the health and safety of the public to transfer the fire-service training program from the Department of Education to the Department of Public Safety.

* Sec. 2. AS 14.07.020(i2) is amended to read:

(12) provide educational opportunities in the areas of vocational education and training, and basic education[, AND FIRE-SERVICE TRAINING] to individuals over 16 years of age who are no longer attending school;

* Sec. 3. AS 44.27.020(1) is amended to read:

(1) administer the state's program of education at the elementary, secondary, and adult levels, including, but not limited to, programs of vocational education and training, vocational rehabilitation, library services, correspondence courses, and adult basic education, [AND FIRE-SERVICE TRAINING,] but not including degree programs of postsecondary education;

* Sec. 4. AS 18.70.020 is amended to read:

Sec. 18.70.020. DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY. The Department of Public Safety shall

(1) aid in the enforcement of all laws and ordinances and the rules and regulations adopted under AS 18.70.010 -- 18.70.100 and all other laws relating to fires or to fire prevention and protection; [, AND SHALL]

(2) encourage the adoption of fire prevention measures by means of education; [, AND SHALL]

(3) prepare or have prepared for dissemination information

1 relating to the subject of fire prevention and extinguishment; and
2 (4) administer the state fire-service training program,
3 including the administration of grants for such training.

4 * Sec. 5. This Order takes effect March 15, 1986.
