THE HOUSE HEALTH, EDUCATION AND SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEE

The House Health, Education and Social Services Committee notes that during the past four years the ability of the Archives to carry out its statutory function has been severely impacted due first to divisional budget cuts compounded by across-the-board cuts during the state's fiscal crisis, and secondly to the Department of Administration's transfer of positions to Purchasing to meet requirements of the new procurement code. In as much as the records maintained by Archives are of great legal and fiscal, as well as historical import, the House HESS Committee recommends that funding for Archives be restored and stabilized at the 1986 level.
