



I've enclosed a copy of an Anchorage Times editorial from February 8, 1988, that speaks directly to the question of what to do with the permanent fund.

Please recall that I sponsored (along with 13 members of the Senate) SJR-40, providing for a constitutional amendment to use 40% of the Permanent Fund earnings for dividends, 30% for inflation proofing, and the remaining 30% to be deposited into a newly created budget reserve fund. The concept became popularly known as "40-30-30."

After reading the Times editorial and evaluating the results of the Dittman survey along the Railbelt, I still believe the legislature would be wise to adopt and put before the voters something along the lines of the 40-30-30 plan.

Permanent Fund warnings

PEOPLE OFTEN vote their pocketbooks, which should be no surprise to the politicians.

New evidence of this old truism came in the results from a poll by the Dittman Research people. It showed that almost two-thirds of the people contacted in the Railbelt area favor spending the excess earnings of the Permanent Fund.

If the economy declines even further, 43 percent of those responding said they would approve spending some of the fund's principal — not just the earnings.

Pollster David Dittman has tracked public feelings about the Permanent Fund over the years. He says this new \$20,000 poll — paid for by the state Senate — is the first showing that people were willing to use the corpus of the fund.

There's a message in that for the legislators and the administration.

Clearly people hurt by the depressed economy are get-

ting nervous about the state retaining a savings account that now contains more than \$9 billion at the same time individual Alaskans and hundreds of Alaska businesses and employers are going bankrupt.

THE UNEASINESS is compounded by the fact — as we mentioned in these columns last week — that the politicians, even after all the years the fund has been in existence, still have not clearly identified its purpose.

The new Dittman poll provides urgency to what we suggested editorially: that it's time for the state, at long last, to define just what the fund is supposed to do — and what use is to be made of the earnings.

It's simply not enough to keep saying that it's for a rainy day or to perhaps cover the expenses of the state at some nebulous time in the future.

SUBJECT: HB 79 Public Hearing/Teleconference

At the public hearing held Wednesday, March 18, 1987, on the HB 79 - An act relating to art in public places, there was an indication that a possible teleconference hearing was planned at some future date.

As you are aware oil revenues are still down and the state continues to look for ways to save money throughout the budget. Alaska's economy is depressed and the state is exploring ways to put Alaskans to work. The state is also looking at ways to keep state monies in the economy to reap the maximum benefit from the multiplication effect of those dollars. The State of Alaska does not now enjoy maximum benefit from those dollars. In one year alone the state spent \$750,000 on the program and 75% of those dollars were awarded to artists outside the state. Those monies need to stay in Alaska and HB 79 provides a constitutional mechanism to accomplish this end.

HB 79 does reduce the amount of state dollars allocated to the percent for art program but it also restricts the competition for those dollars to resident Alaskan artists. This bill continues to recognize the value of art in our Alaskan culture

The 14th Legislature passed a bill identical to HB 79. The vote in the House was 29 yes votes and the Senate was 11 yes votes. This bill is just one step in reducing the cost of a government program while also assuring that state money remains here at home. HB 79 could be categorized as an "arts jobs" bill. This bill also provides accountability for the artwork selections for the public. Adding more public members to the selection committee provides greater public accountability for the artwork selections.

I respectfully ask that HB 79 be voted on and passed out of your committee with individual recommendations to the House Finance Committee. I would like for the bill to have a chance to be voted on by the House before we adjourn this session.
