University of Alaska, Fairbanks**

The number of students who would qualify for assistance under HB14 is based on a review of the student enrollments for Fall 1990 and Spring 1991 semesters. All qualifying students are projected to carry a full-time class load and to not have a criminal record. The number of students who qualify is expected to increase 10 percent per year.

General funds required to offset the loss in student fee revenue or federal receipts. The amount is listed in the grants line of the fiscal note. (Students who would qualify under HB14 currently are eligible for federal grants funds to cover tuition.)

RE: Scheduling of HB 14

I would like to request that you schedule HB 14, tuition waivers for high school graduates, at your earliest convenience. The bill and back-up information is attached.

HB 14 would give free tuition to an undergraduate in the University of Alaska system if that person: has been a state resident for two years; has graduated from high school not more than two years prior to entering college with a 2.5 cumulative GPA during high school; has a parent or legal guardian living in Alaska; has earned 21 credits in high school; has earned an 18 composite score on the American College Test (ACT); has no criminal record; has applied for federal financial aid; and is in financial need.

The bill outlines requirements necessary to maintain the scholarship and also outlines qualifications necessary to receive this grant.

This past week I spoke with Jane Maynard, the Director of the Commission on Postsecondary Education, and she has indicated that the Postsecondary Education Commission will be supporting this legislation. The current educational focus nationwide is on early college awareness programs and incentive efforts. One of the Commission's top priorities is an early college awareness effort. The executive committee meets early next week and it is my hope that a formal endorsement of HB 14 will follow.

NEA-Alaska supports and encourages your favorable consideration of this legislation. It is extremely positive and is a concept which represents great potential for public education in Alaska.

It is our hope that eventually all qualified high school graduates in Alaska will be able to attend the University of Alaska tuition free and that the student loan program will eventually become truly needs based.

HB 14 provides a clear incentive for students, especially those who don't always aspire to post secondary education, to continue their education beyond high school. It will clearly enhance their productive potential, reinforce needed self-esteem, and give them hope for the future when their personal financial circumstance might not be encouraging.

As such, it is likely that HB 14 will be a positive factor in the collective effort to diminish the number of students who are at risk of dropping out of school before they have completed high school.

The Committee may want to consider sub-sections (a),(3) and (d) in the context of whether they act in combination to preclude eligibility for a student who has been emancipated prior to age 21. If so, it might be wise to try to find a way to accommodate this particular circumstance.

Thank you for your consideration of our position.

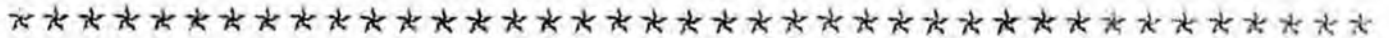

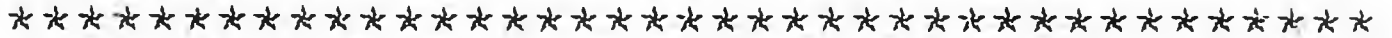

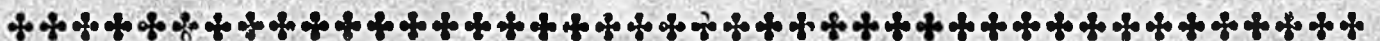
