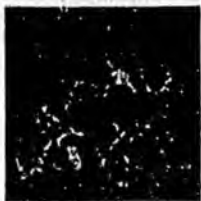

## SPONSOR STATEMENT

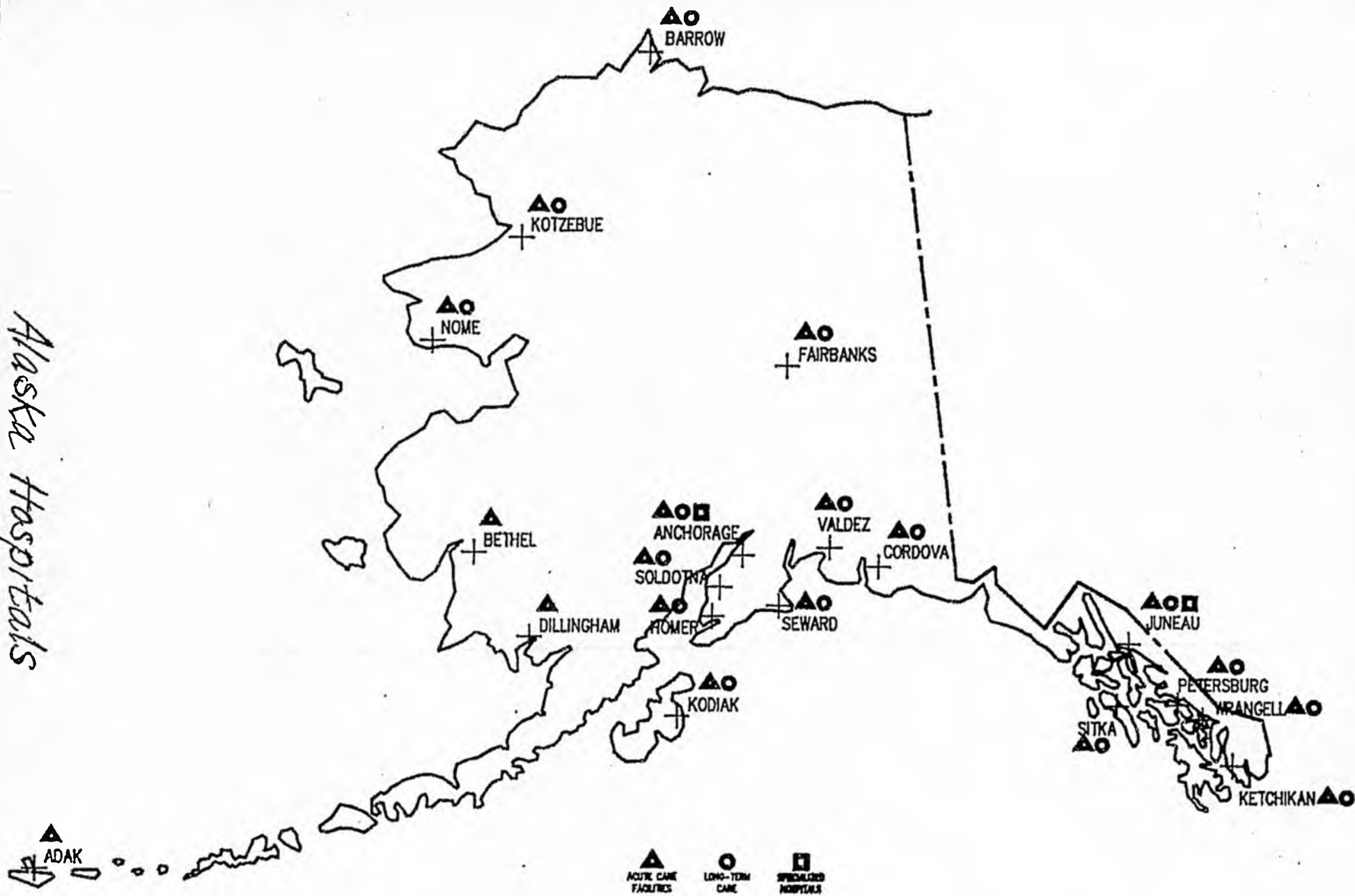
HCR 53 encourages hospitals in the state of Alaska to establish residency programs for persons being trained as physicians. No hospitals in Alaska have a residency program.
