John Sandor was born in 1926 in Washington State. He received his BS Degree from Washington State University in 1950 and a Masters Degree in Public Administration under a conservation fellowship from Harvard University in 1959.

Sandor has been a resident of Alaska and worked in professional natural resource assignments within the state for over 20 years. He served as Regional Forester for the U.S. Forest Service in Alaska from 1976 to 1984, was a member of the Alaska Land Use Council from 1981 to 1984, and was appointed to the post of Commissioner of the State of Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation in December 1990.

Sandor was the Charter Chair of the Natural Resources and Environmental Administration Section of the American Society for Public Administration. In 1979, he was presented the Alaska State Conservationist Award by the Alaska Federation and Sportsmen's Council. In 1987, he received a Natural Resources and Environmental Administration Award for Distinguished Service from the American Society of Public Administration.

He is an Elected Fellow of the Society of American Foresters and is presently serving on the National Policy Committee of the Society. Before his state appointment, Sandor served as the Executive Director of the Alliance for Juneau's Future, which was organized in early 1989 to work to further environmentally sound economic development projects, improved transportation access and to assure an ample supply of energy for Southeast Alaska.

John and Lee Sandor were married in Juneau in 1956 and have two daughters.






- (1) Present (FY 92) organization chart for the Department of Environmental Conservation and the organization chart planned for implementation about July 1, 1991.

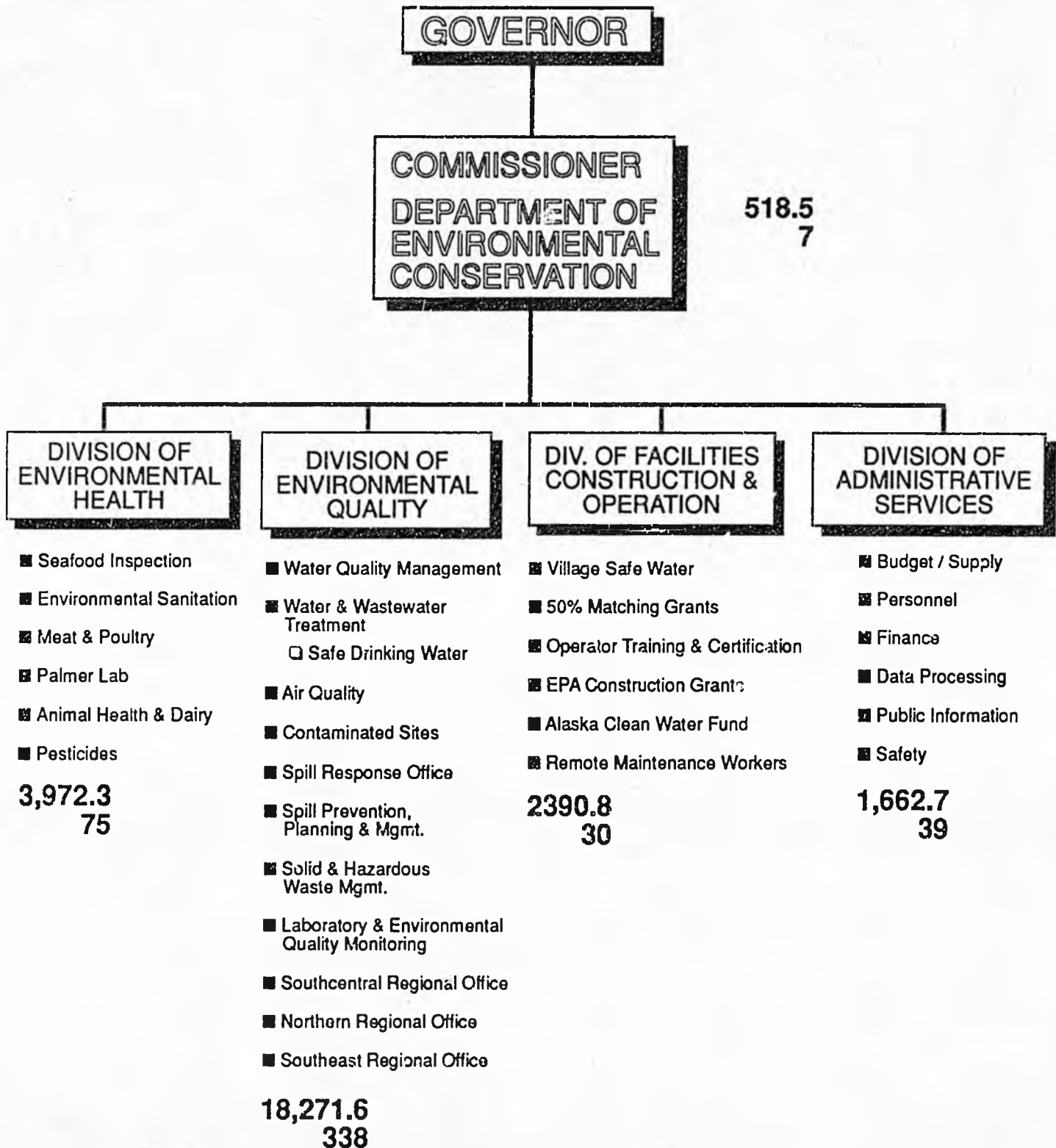

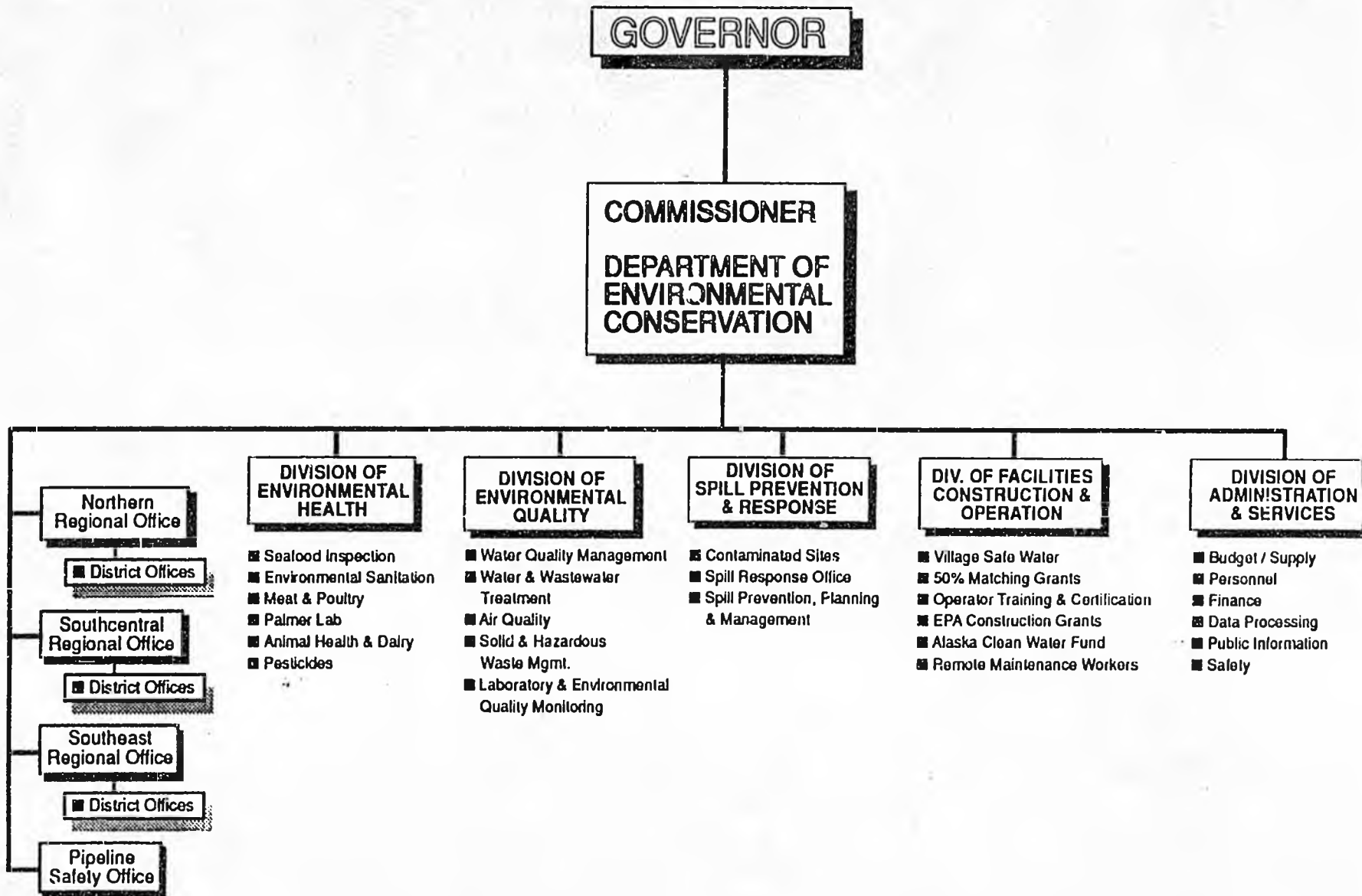

COMMISSIONER JOHN A. SANDOR'S SPEECH, APRIL 21, 1991
ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION OBJECTIVES ON EARTH DAY 1991

INTRODUCTION

On this the 21st Anniversary of Earth Day, it is appropriate to again take stock of our community and state's progress in environmental protection and to set specific environmental objectives for the year ahead.

Alaska remains a focal point of national and international interest as an extraordinary region with remarkable natural resources, ecological diversity and a rich cultural history. Alaska with its vast natural resource base, offers the potential of great promise to our nation and the world, but resource development must also provide for environmental protection if this region's potential is to be sustained through the next century.

Thus, as we define our objectives for the year ahead, we must also keep an eye on the next century. Economic and environmental objectives must be integrated if the promises to both present and future generations are to be realized. These objectives must go hand in hand.

We must also give special attention to each and every community within our great state. For a variety of reasons, not every community has been able to achieve the quality of life many of us take for granted. We are, after all, one land and one people. We must work together for the benefit of all our people, today and for the future. It is with these thoughts in mind that the Department of Environmental Conservation developed its objectives for the year ahead.

1. EXXON VALDEZ OIL SPILL CLEAN-UP AND RESTORATION

The completion of clean-up work and the continued restoration of resources damaged by the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill is one of the top priority objectives of the State of Alaska in the year ahead. The Federal and State agencies are working closely together with the private sector to complete damage assessment studies and to continue restoration efforts in Prince William Sound, Cook Inlet, Kodiak Island and other coastal areas damaged by this disaster. The Settlement Agreement for the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill provides for this continued restoration work.

2. PREPARING FOR FUTURE OIL AND HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE SPILLS

Alaska must apply the lessons learned in the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill. Prevention efforts are being undertaken to reduce the chances of accidents which lead to such spills. Contingency plans and response efforts will continue to be improved in the year ahead. We want to put the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill behind us, but be certain we are prepared for the incidents whenever and wherever they occur.

3. DEVELOPING SAFE WATER AND WASTE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS

Every Alaska community should have safe drinking water and safe sewage disposal systems. However, over 60 Alaska communities do not meet these basic needs. In fact, many of these communities report serious health problems from unsafe water or improperly treated sewage. In fact, the back-log of needed, water and sewer system projects exceed 120 million dollars. Furthermore, the planning, maintenance and operation work associated with these projects will require special training for local community residents. It is estimated that it will take from 3 to 5 years to achieve this objective. This special effort will begin this year, and be incorporated as a part of a rural development initiative led by the Department of Community and Regional Affairs.

4. IMPROVE THE MANAGEMENT OF SOLID WASTE

Alaskans, like most other Americans, generate a great deal of waste products. Disposal of solid waste is a growing problem for most of the communities in Alaska. A number of communities have taken positive steps to reduce the production of wastes by conservation and recycling measures. The best way to manage waste is to reduce production of solid waste and to recycle waste products where it is feasible to do so.

The Department of Environmental Conservation will work with local communities in developing cost-effective solutions to this growing environmental problem.

5. IMPROVE THE MANAGEMENT OF HAZARDOUS WASTE

Hazardous waste production and disposal is another serious environmental problem. Again, the first priority effort will be directed to preventing the production of such materials where it is feasible to do so. Attention will also be directed to improving the methods for treating such wastes. Finally, where it is necessary to dispose of and store such wastes, the State of Alaska is beginning the process of locating several, hazardous waste treatment and storage sites within our State. Presently, hazardous wastes must be shipped to the lower forty eight states with substantial hazards and expenses associated with such shipments.

The cleanup of contaminated and hazardous waste sites is a related environmental problem. There are over 3,000 waste sites in Alaska on public and private land that have the potential of polluting ground water or creating other health hazards. Many of these sites are on Defense Department lands or were formerly used defense department sites. Some date back to World War II. The State of Alaska will be working with the Defense Department agencies in evaluating and cleaning up these sites.

Priority attention will also be given to cleaning up contaminated sites that are located on State and Community lands.

6. WORK WITH INDUSTRY TO ASSURE ENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND PROJECTS

In the face of declining oil revenues, Alaskans are seeking new opportunities for economic development. Alaska has the resource potential to help meet our nation's energy needs. The development of the potential oil reserves in a part of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge (ANWR) offers great promise to meeting these needs. Other economic development projects are also being proposed. Within this community such historic mining properties as the AJ, Kensington and Jualin Mines are being explored with the possibility of reopening these properties.

The development of such projects must meet Federal, State and local government laws and regulations. The Environmental Impact Statement process provides an opportunity for individuals and organizations to identify concerns, and these must be addressed in the process. Sound economic development and environmental protection must go hand in hand.

These are a few of the major environmental protection objectives of the Department of Environmental Conservation for the coming year. Most of these objectives impact both large and small communities, and the ADEC has initiated a major effort which will formally bring the Community and State governments in a partnership to deal with environmental problems and issues.

The DEC has already signed formal Cooperative Agreements with the Ketchikan Borough, Unalaska and Sand Point. Draft agreements have already been prepared with Fairbanks and North Pole; also the Kenai Peninsula Borough and St. Paul. These formal Cooperative Agreements commit the ADEC to cooperatively work with each of these communities to develop practical, cost-effective solutions to the environmental problems within those communities.

By Earth Day 1992, we hope to have at least 50 communities covered by these cooperative agreements.

Finally, the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation will celebrate its twentieth anniversary this coming June. The ADEC has a proud history of accomplishments these past two decades. On behalf of this fine organization, I invite you to participate in the coming celebration of the ADEC's anniversary this coming June.

Gentlemen:

I refer to the "ACTION ALERT", (copy enclosed), which was distributed by mail and forwarded to this office with the March 28, 1991 issue of THE NORTHERN LINE. Although the author of this leaflet is not shown, it is printed on Alaska Environmental Lobby, Inc. letterhead and was distributed by the Northern Alaska Environmental Center, Nonprofit Organization Postage Permit No. 201 from Fairbanks, Alaska.

A member of the Alaska State Legislature has called my attention to a letter received from a constituent which was apparently in response to the "Action Alert" request to "Write or call your state senators and representatives today. Ask them to oppose confirmation...."

This "Action Alert" attributes three positions or actions by or to John Sandor. All three are false as noted below:

FIRST FALSE STATEMENT

- John Sandor, as the former top Forest Service official in Alaska, wanted to clear-cut all of the magnificent ancient forests of the Tongass: *"It is desirable to liquidate the existing decadent climax stands as soon as possible."* He did everything he could to carry out that philosophy, including "pre-roading," a policy of building government-subsidized logging roads, even in areas which were not slated to be cut -- just to destroy the Wilderness potential and make sure that they would eventually be logged.

ACTUAL FACTS

During the period John Sandor served as Regional Forester in Alaska from 1976 to 1984, he was responsible for development of the Tongass Land Management Plan. The Southeast Alaska Area Guide was developed in 1977 and the Draft Environmental Impact Statement for the Tongass National Forest was published in June of 1978. The Regional Forester's Recommendation, published in March, 1978 specifically recommended that 3,724,000 acres be designated as Wilderness and that 4,119,000 acres be managed in a roadless state. This represents 52% of the total Tongass National Forest area. Additionally, the Regional Forester recommended restrictions for timber harvest and roading on the remaining areas of the Tongass. These recommendations would assure that more than two thirds of the Tongass National Forest would not be harvested or roaded during the 100 year rotation planned for the Tongass.

It should be noted that John Sandor was named the STATE CONSERVATIONIST in 1979 by the Alaska Wildlife Federation and Sportsmen Council in recognition of his conservation leadership.

SECOND FALSE STATEMENT

- John Sandor is co-founder of the Alliance for Juneau's Future, and served as its Executive Director. The sole purpose of this organization is to promote mining in the Juneau area, despite the resulting grave toxic pollution.

ACTUAL FACTS

The Alliance for Juneau's Future was formed to promote economic diversity, including mining; improve transportation access; assure an ample supply of energy for the community and for other purposes which would be beneficial to Juneau's future. John Sandor served as Executive Director, but was not in the group of business, labor and civic leaders who founded the original organization.

THIRD FALSE STATEMENT

- John Sandor, as Commissioner of DEC, has played favorites with the oil industry by secretly turning over draft government regulations, so that the industry could suggest modifications before the documents were released to the public.

ACTUAL FACTS

John Sandor, as Commissioner of DEC, did not give or turnover draft regulations to any single party or industry group, but ordered steps which assured Department regulations would be coordinated with other government agencies with appropriate public involvement by diverse interests throughout Alaska.

Although these "Action Alert" statements were mailed with THE NORTHERN LINE by the Northern Alaska Environmental Center, the "Action Alert" is printed on Alaska Environmental Lobby, Inc. letterhead. Also, because the "Action Alert" does not include the name of an author or editor, it is unclear who authored this material or authorized its distribution by mail with THE NORTHERN LINE.

Accordingly, I am writing both of you as Executive Directors to determine:


1. Who is responsible for publishing or printing this "Action Alert"?
2. Who is responsible for distributing this leaflet with THE NORTHERN LINE?
3. What was the total distribution of this leaflet by mail or by other means?

Additionally, this is a formal request that immediate action be taken to correct the false information included in these statements. This correction should be published in the next issue of THE NORTHERN LINE and any other publication source. The facts noted above can be verified by public documents from the U.S. Forest Service (Tongass statements); Alliance for Juneau's Future, Inc. and the Department of Environmental Conservation (regulations statement).

The publication and distribution of this false information is not only damaging to the individual to whom these false statements are attributed, but is also damaging to the public interest.

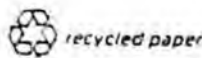
The job of the Commissioner of DNR is to manage the use of Alaska's land, forests and oil and minerals, including the administration of Alaska's State Parks.

- John Sandor is co-founder of the Alliance for Juneau's Future, and served as its Executive Director. The sole purpose of this organization is to promote mining in the Juneau area, despite the resulting grave toxic pollution.

- John Sandor, as Commissioner of DEC, has played favorites with the oil industry by secretly turning over draft government regulations, so that the industry could suggest modifications *before* the documents were released to the public.

I am writing to urge you to deny confirmation of the nominations of John Sandor as commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation and Harold Heinze as Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources.

The legislature needs to remind Mr. Hickel that he is a minority Governor. 61% of the voters supported other candidates. He has no mandate to dismantle programs to protect our air, water and natural resources. He has no mandate to appoint commissioners dedicated to exploitation of our resources.

John Sandor, as Regional Forester, practiced "dominant use" of the forest. Not only was timber considered the primary resource, it was managed for the almost exclusive benefit of two multinational corporations who were not only liquidating our forests but were putting our resident mills and loggers out of business. Clearcutting of forests was pursued at the expense of fish and wildlife, water quality and soil protection.

His policy of pre-roading, at taxpayers expense, was not only a waste of money but was designed to assure that every acre of the forest was to be eventually logged.

John Sandor was also responsible for the Alaska Regional Guide. It not only violated the Multiple Use Sustained Yield and National Forest Management Acts but "gutted" the protective provisions of the Southeast Area Guide.

While I am not personally acquainted with Harold Heinze as I was with John Sandor, I find the appointment of an oil man as commissioner of Natural Resources to indicate a lack of consideration for important renewable resources. With oil reigning supreme (and it's close to that now) the future of our renewable resources will be increasingly at risk. Oil and minerals need to be recognized as non-renewable, a one-time resource, and their extraction should not be allowed to jeopardize our fish and wildlife, air and water quality nor continue to produce unregulated hazardous waste.

The philosophy of Mr. Heinze as shown by his public statements shows us a man dedicated to all-out resource exploitation with little or no concern for the future.

With commissioners such as these, Alaska would soon face years of conflict such as we saw on the National level during the years of Watt and Burford.

I urge you reject the appointments of John Sandor and Harold Heinze.


Dear Senator Jones:



Comic book conservation II

Just when you think it's safe to take seriously the literature produced by the many environmental groups active in Alaska, they toss their credibility out the window like a non-recyclable soda bottle.

In the past, most of the examples came from Lower 48 groups using exaggeration as a means of fund-raising. One group's representative once recounted to us that his boss told him: "Do you want to be accurate, or do you want to raise money?"

The most recent example of overstatement doesn't involve fund-raising. It involves character assassination in the form of an "Action Alert" from the Alaska Environmental Lobby, Inc. In it, the reputations of two of Gov. Walter J. Hickel's commissioner nominees are viciously attacked in an effort to drum up opposition to their confirmation by the Alaska Legislature. Here's how the "alert" begins:

"The James Watt style of government is thriving in Alaska. Governor Walter Hickel has put the foxes in charge of the chicken coops. The Alaska Dept. of Conservation (sic) and the Dept. of Natural Resources are now under the control of some of industry's most aggressive proponents of resource exploitation."

Besides apparently not knowing the name of the Department of Environmental Conservation, the anonymous author goes on to attack Harold Heinze, whom Gov. Hickel has nominated to head DNR, and John Sandor, his choice for DEC.

We don't know Mr. Heinze, the former head of ARCO Alaska, but we, unlike the anonymous author, are willing to give him the benefit of the doubt. After all, it only seems logical to have someone in the job who knows one end of a drilling bit from the other. That is especially true since the stated goal of this administration is to lobby for opening the coastal plain of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge to oil exploration.

We do, however, know Mr. Sandor, and to see him attacked through the use of innuendo and false charges is more than a little disgusting. In our opinion, of the people nominated to Gov. Hickel's Cabinet, Mr. Sandor is the best of the best. Anyone who knows him personally or professionally knows him to be fair-minded and honest. Add to those qualities his decades of experience with the U.S. Forest Service and his dedication to conservation (he has received the State Conservationist award from the Alaska Wildlife Federation and Sportsmen Council) and you have a top-flight individual who will do Alaska proud and protect its environment to the fullest extent of the law.

The anonymous person who wrote the attacks on Mr. Heinze and Mr. Sandor is asking that the people of Alaska use the "information" he (or she) provides and write to their legislators in opposition to their confirmation.

We won't get into the unsubstantiated allegations leveled against Mr. Sandor. Suffice it to say that they are not even worth repeating and are totally inaccurate.

After reading it, about the only thing worthwhile about this "alert" is it was printed on recyclable paper. We suggest recipients of it do just that and toss it in the recycling box.

COMMISSIONER JOHN A. SANDOR'S SPEECH, APRIL 21, 1991
ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION OBJECTIVES ON EARTH DAY 1991

INTRODUCTION

On this the 21st Anniversary of Earth Day, it is appropriate to again take stock of our community and state's progress in environmental protection and to set specific environmental objectives for the year ahead.

Alaska remains a focal point of national and international interest as an extraordinary region with remarkable natural resources, ecological diversity and a rich cultural history. Alaska with its vast natural resource base, offers the potential of great promise to our nation and the world, but resource development must also provide for environmental protection if this region's potential is to be sustained through the next century.

Thus, as we define our objectives for the year ahead, we must also keep an eye on the next century. Economic and environmental objectives must be integrated if the promises to both present and future generations are to be realized. These objectives must go hand in hand.

We must also give special attention to each and every community within our great state. For a variety of reasons, not every community has been able to achieve the quality of life many of us take for granted. We are, after all, one land and one people. We must work together for the benefit of all our people, today and for the future. It is with these thoughts in mind that the Department of Environmental Conservation developed its objectives for the year ahead.

1. EXXON VALDEZ OIL SPILL CLEAN-UP AND RESTORATION

The completion of clean-up work and the continued restoration of resources damaged by the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill is one of the top priority objectives of the State of Alaska in the year ahead. The Federal and State agencies are working closely together with the private sector to complete damage assessment studies and to continue restoration efforts in Prince William Sound, Cook Inlet, Kodiak Island and other coastal areas damaged by this disaster. The Settlement Agreement for the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill provides for this continued restoration work.

2. PREPARING FOR FUTURE OIL AND HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE SPILLS

Alaska must apply the lessons learned in the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill. Prevention efforts are being undertaken to reduce the chances of accidents which lead to such spills. Contingency plans and response efforts will continue to be improved in the year ahead. We want to put the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill behind us, but be certain we are prepared for the incidents whenever and wherever they occur.

3. DEVELOPING SAFE WATER AND WASTE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS

Every Alaska community should have safe drinking water and safe sewage disposal systems. However, over 60 Alaska communities do not meet these basic needs. In fact, many of these communities report serious health problems from unsafe water or improperly treated sewage. In fact, the back-log of needed, water and sewer system projects exceed 120 million dollars. Furthermore, the planning, maintenance and operation work associated with these projects will require special training for local community residents. It is estimated that it will take from 3 to 5 years to achieve this objective. This special effort will begin this year, and be incorporated as a part of a rural development initiative led by the Department of Community and Regional Affairs.

4. IMPROVE THE MANAGEMENT OF SOLID WASTE

Alaskans, like most other Americans, generate a great deal of waste products. Disposal of solid waste is a growing problem for most of the communities in Alaska. A number of communities have taken positive steps to reduce the production of wastes by conservation and recycling measures. The best way to manage waste is to reduce production of solid waste and to recycle waste products where it is feasible to do so.

The Department of Environmental Conservation will work with local communities in developing cost-effective solutions to this growing environmental problem.

5. IMPROVE THE MANAGEMENT OF HAZARDOUS WASTE

Hazardous waste production and disposal is another serious environmental problem. Again, the first priority effort will be directed to preventing the production of such materials where it is feasible to do so. Attention will also be directed to improving the methods for treating such wastes. Finally, where it is necessary to dispose of and store such wastes, the State of Alaska is beginning the process of locating several, hazardous waste treatment and storage sites within our State. Presently, hazardous wastes must be shipped to the lower forty eight states with substantial hazards and expenses associated with such shipments.

The cleanup of contaminated and hazardous waste sites is a related environmental problem. There are over 3,000 waste sites in Alaska on public and private land that have the potential of polluting ground water or creating other health hazards. Many of these sites are on Defense Department lands or were formerly used defense department sites. Some date back to World War II. The State of Alaska will be working with the Defense Department agencies in evaluating and cleaning up these sites.

Priority attention will also be given to cleaning up contaminated sites that are located on State and Community lands.

6. WORK WITH INDUSTRY TO ASSURE ENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND PROJECTS

In the face of declining oil revenues, Alaskans are seeking new opportunities for economic development. Alaska has the resource potential to help meet our nation's energy needs. The development of the potential oil reserves in a part of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge (ANWR) offers great promise to meeting these needs. Other economic development projects are also being proposed. Within this community such historic mining properties as the AJ, Kensington and Jualin Mines are being explored with the possibility of reopening these properties.

The development of such projects must meet Federal, State and local government laws and regulations. The Environmental Impact Statement process provides an opportunity for individuals and organizations to identify concerns, and these must be addressed in the process. Sound economic development and environmental protection must go hand in hand.

These are a few of the major environmental protection objectives of the Department of Environmental Conservation for the coming year. Most of these objectives impact both large and small communities, and the ADEC has initiated a major effort which will formally bring the Community and State governments in a partnership to deal with environmental problems and issues.

The DEC has already signed formal Cooperative Agreements with the Ketchikan Borough, Unalaska and Sand Point. Draft agreements have already been prepared with Fairbanks and North Pole; also the Kenai Peninsula Borough and St. Paul. These formal Cooperative Agreements commit the ADEC to cooperatively work with each of these communities to develop practical, cost-effective solutions to the environmental problems within those communities.

By Earth Day 1992, we hope to have at least 50 communities covered by these cooperative agreements.

Finally, the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation will celebrate its twentieth anniversary this coming June. The ADEC has a proud history of accomplishments these past two decades. On behalf of this fine organization, I invite you to participate in the coming celebration of the ADEC's anniversary this coming June.

The Alaska Environmental Lobby opposes the confirmation of John Sandor as Commissioner of the DEC.

Since his appointment as Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), Sandor has shown that his background in resource development makes him unsuitable for his job. His past as a pro-development activist is in direct conflict with the mission of DEC as a "watchdog" of those industries which can and will destroy the clean environment we Alaskans value so greatly.

As Regional Forester for the USFS (1976-84), John Sandor ignored the expertise of USFS's research staff and instead made decisions based on preconceived opinions. This bias led to poor public policy decisions.

Under Sandor, the regional office tried to refute research results of the USFS Forest Research Lab which showed clearcutting of old growth stands destroyed deer overwintering habitat. USFS biologist Dr. O.C. Wallmo wrote

"During the time I was in Juneau there were several efforts from the **Regional office** and the timber industry to quash, discredit, or ridicule results of wildlife research conducted jointly by the Forest Sciences Lab and Alaska Department of Fish and Game." ¹ "Sandor made an effort through Bob Tarrant to **suppress our research reports.**"²

As Regional Forester, Sandor proceeded with timber sales even though they were environmental and economic disasters. The Bradfield River sale resulted in "violations of State Water Quality Standards," "slope failures and severe surface erosion" and a degradation of spawning habitat.³ Furthermore, "the U.S. treasury lost \$260 million between 1977 and 1984 on sales of timber from the Tongass."⁴

With a disregard for environmental procedures, USFS encouraged development of the Quartz Hill molybdenum mine during Sandor's tenure. In the late 1970's, the approval of road construction along the Keta River to access bulk sampling sites was overturned on appeal by the Secretary of Agriculture. Although the passage of ANILCA required an EIS for both the bulk sampling and road access in addition to an EIS for the mine itself, this was ignored and bulk sampling was allowed to occur before the completion of the EIS. USFS was sued and again the plaintiffs prevailed.⁵

During the final stages of the EIS process for Quartz Hill, there was extreme concern that by siting the access road along Wilson Arm, tailings would eventually end up in the fjord. Borax gave repeated assurances that this would not be the case and

the road was constructed. *In 1990, Sandor as executive director of Alliance for Juneau's Future endorsed the disposal of the Quartz Hill mine tailings in Wilson Arm, asking that EPA rule in favor of this site. However, EPA has denied a NPDES permit for this disposal and the project is on hold.* ⁶

Since his retirement, John Sandor has been an outspoken pro-development activist aggressively supporting the very industries he is now to watchdog.

In 1989, Sandor co-founded and directed, until his appointment, the Alliance for Juneau's Future, a Juneau based industry advocacy organization and an outspoken proponent of re-opening the AJ gold mine. He wrote in an Alliance membership appeal, "Our [Alliance's] first objective is to assure re-introduction of mining to our economy - specifically starting with the environmentally sound Echo Bay-AJ project." ⁷ He gave this unconditional support for a mega-industrial project before BLM's draft environmental impact statement was released in 1991.

Since his appointment as DEC Commissioner, John Sandor has shown disregard for the public process and an overriding bias toward industry.

In February, DEC gave Alyeska a sneak preview of new oil spill regulations prior to public review. Soon after, the decision was made to withhold the release of the regulations until further changes were made. An ombudsman's investigation into this subversion of the public process is currently underway.

Furthermore, Sandor has asked EPA to speed up the process by which Alaska can site temporary and permanent hazardous waste facilities.⁸ This interest in developing hazardous waste disposal sites when it has not been determined that the type and level of hazardous waste generated in Alaska warrant such a solution shows a short sighted approach and a prevailing concern for the best interest of polluting industries rather than the public. This is especially ironic given the high importance DEC has placed on safe drinking water which in many Alaskan communities is contaminated by hazardous substances.

Dear Charlie:

Enclosed are copies of letters from me to Director Bob Ethington, PIW, and Project Leader Don Schmiege, Juneau, regarding the recent review of wildlife-related problems in southeast Alaska conducted by Bill Longhurst and Les Roblinette. The deficiencies in their report, which have been noted by many people in Alaska, were to be expected considering their time constraints and unfamiliarity with the biotic setting and human social milieu. Bill and Les deserve their eminence in the wildlife profession. My criticisms are not intended to demean them generally, but I do consider it a distinct impropriety for them to have presumed to be authoritative in that situation. Their errors and misconceptions will be rebutted in Alaska. Aside from these two letters, I won't pursue them further unless specifically requested to.

My concern is the manner in which the Station endorsed and collaborated in the implementation of the review. Having gone through the traditional process of formulating a research program and securing approval of it from Washington (for the unit description and problem assignments) and the Station (for problem analyses, sequence of studies, and study rationale and design), the work unit scientists should feel secure in assuming that their efforts are sanctioned and supported within their Station, regardless of outside criticism. If such criticism warrants reconsideration of the relevance or quality of the research, that possibility should first be broached within the Station among the scientists involved, the unit leader, and program assistant director, and ultimately the director. Concurrence with the critics might result, but the responsible administrators would then know what they were talking about.


In the present case, the Station, via the program assistant director, endorsed the Region's proposal for the Longhurst-Roblinette review, and assumed a major role in setting its format, including the inquiry into the research program, without such prior consideration of the program within the Research Work Unit and Station. Neither the assistant director nor the director or interim acting director ever, at any time, availed himself of his prerogative and obvious opportunity to discuss the rationale and design of current and planned studies, to observe study locations and sampling procedures, or to discuss the analysis, interpretation, and implications of data. Consequently, none of those persons is capable of determining the relevance of that review to the Unit's program, or its accuracy.

That fact no longer affects me personally, and these letters should not be interpreted as personal vindication or recrimination. I do, however, have a deep concern over the integrity and credibility of the Forest Service research branch and the freedom of its scientists to conduct research and report results without fear of coercion from elements that don't like the implication of the results. During the time I was in Juneau there were several efforts from the Regional office and the timber industry to quash, discredit, or ridicule results of wildlife research conducted jointly by the Forestry Sciences Lab and Alaska Department of Fish and Game. In another instance, the National Forest attempted to discredit findings from forest insect and disease research. Earlier, Region 10 objected to the release of certain results of silviculture research that failed to support a sale plan. These are documentable facts.

Nevertheless, while I was in Juneau, I was impressed with an increasing recognition of the public and other State and Federal agencies that research conducted by the Forestry Sciences Laboratory was not conceived to agree or disagree with the desires of any factional interests in the forest resources. Many of those persons are well aware, however, that the Station's collaboration in the Longhurst-Robinette review and several other actions of apparent similar intent were accommodations to the Region's and the timber industry's displeasure with findings that did not complement timber management policy.

The resulting loss of credibility should be of great concern to the Forest Service. Though recent experience doesn't give me faith that it will be, the least I can do as a still-faithful ex-employee is to register my own concern and hope for the best.

Dear Bob:

The purpose of this letter is to comment on the preliminary report of W. M. Longhurst and W. L. Robinette, A Review of the Interrelationships between Forest Management and Wildlife on the Tongass National Forest. I will acknowledge, however, that I was not requested to appraise their report and did not receive a copy of it through Forest Service channels or from Longhurst and Robinette. The copy that I have was provided by Alaska Department of Fish and Game.

Separately, I have written a detailed commentary on all of their references to the research program conducted jointly by RWV 1652 and ADF&G. A digest of those notes will be sent to Don Schmiege. Here, I will synthesize my general reaction to the report as it might reflect on 1652's program and comment at greater length on the effect on the morale of Station scientists of external inquisitions endorsed by the Station without prior evaluation of their research within the Station.

As for the Longhurst-Robinette references to Station-ADF&G research, my general conclusion is that they simply neglected to gain sufficient familiarity with our program to review it intelligently. On the occasion of their preliminary visit, we furnished them several documents to acquaint them with the overall program. Later, Dr. John Schoen (ADF&G collaborator) and I explained, and responded to their direct questions regarding, studies and results. Beyond an airplane ride with Dr. Schoen to observe radio tracking of deer and a brief orientation walk with Al Harris and me in forest near Juneau, they obtained no on-the-ground experience with our research. Consequently, their ignorance of the objectives, methods, technical and logistical problems, and results or progress of individual studies, and the relation of those studies to the long-term program, renders many of their judgments erroneous or irrelevant and much of their advice valueless.

For the Station or the Region to assume that, in their superficial look at the situation, they could perceive technical and conceptual problems in the program that were beyond our capacity in full-time assignment to the job was hardly flattering to us. That we had already considered, adopted, coped with, or rejected all of their suggestions can be documented. But, verification of that fact to Station administrators would require that those administrators manifest a conscientious interest in their own programs rather than giving sole ear to its detractors.

I consider the Station's failure in that regard to have been a serious dereliction in the present case. You are no doubt aware that the controversy over PNW-ADF&G deer research stems from Regional Forester John Sandor's displeasure with our initial findings on the preference of deer for climate, forest habitat and certain qualities of such habitat. Sandor made an effort through Bob Tarrant to suppress our research reports (a documentable fact, by the way). He also invited Dale Jones, Director of Wildlife Management, WO, to review our program. Dale suggested the review by Longhurst and Robinette. When Sandor initiated that review, the Station, via Ken Wright, endorsed it, and Ken took over leadership in planning it. At that time, and now, Ken had no first-hand familiarity with our research. The only direct feedback I had ever gotten from Ken on my program was that the problem analysis for deer research was too long for him to read (1), though he eventually approved it.

Our program was developed in accordance with established requirements. The problem analysis was reviewed and approved by the Project Leader and the Director's office, study plans and progress by the Project Leader. Formal cooperative relations and functional relations with ADF&G were reviewed and approved similarly by both agencies. In that the Director's office did not address questions or criticisms directly to us, and the Program Assistant Director showed no interest in the progress of studies and findings, we could only assume that we were fulfilling the expectations of the Station.

For the relevance, propriety, and adequacy of our research to be called in question by the Regional Forester, who knew even less about it, and these doubts to be endorsed so willingly by the Assistant Director, was shattering to my faith in the organization. More important, however, it is a manner of operating that will be inimical to the productivity of Station scientists in Juneau if it continues.

Now that I'm out of the organization, that is my major concern. I am satisfied with and proud of what John Schoen and I and our helpers accomplished while I was in Juneau. However, there still is much to be learned, and no honest scientist can promise that studies of unanswered questions will yield answers that will please any chosen faction. If they do not, and the Station supports the objecting factions while ignoring the validity of the research results, it will further obstruct the acquisition of knowledge required for responsible management of forest resources. Implications of the truth may be an uncomfortable onus for National Forest administration, but the Stations have no ethical right to collaborate in warping research programs or results to suit management policy.

For whatever my experience and judgment are worth, I consider the Longhurst-Robinette report to be largely a hastily-contrived mishmash of misconceptions, misunderstandings, and hearsay that should not be accorded any credibility. I am informed, however, that personnel in Region 10 and the Tongass Forest are already picking from it and touting those excerpts (that seem - out of text, anyway) to support their preconceptions. I fervently hope that the Station will not contribute to the inefficacy of its Alaska research program by condoning that.

October 17, 1980

Through someone's wisdom, or perhaps by chance, the Station has in Don Schmiede an eminently qualified and responsible person as leader of RWV 1652. He and my successor, Tom Hanley, a well-trained, objective, productive, and properly experienced wildlife scientist, are capable of conceptualizing, planning, and executing a research program appropriate to the needs of Southeast Alaska. I presume they will make changes in the program which I instituted. I urge you to give them the respect that is their due and that is essential for the maintenance of a research unit that can serve all public interests conscientiously. If that is your interest, too, I can assure you that their knowledge and advice will provide more unbiased, responsible guidance than you can get from the Regional Forester, the timber industry, or more fly-by-night imported "experts."

will take into account streamside harvesting, leave strips, yarding across streams, potential windfall into streams and the introduction of logging debris during and after the harvest operations.

Guidelines under FSH 433.11 and 433.12 specify that road locations near natural drainages are to be avoided; cut and fill slopes are to be seeded immediately after construction; and stream crossings are to be in areas where minimum bank and channel disturbance will occur.

Rock and barrow pit locations, under FSH 433.13 guidelines, are to be located away from streams where possible. Gravel removal from active stream channels is prohibited.

In reference to regeneration and accelerated channel instability, Forest Service policy (FSM 2471.22) prohibits clearcutting in areas where adequate regeneration will not occur in 5 years. Since natural regeneration is to be relied upon, unstable floodplain areas conflict with policy.

An access road to the upper reaches of the North Bradfield River has been improperly constructed in crossing V-notches, colluvial deposits and streams. As a result, road segments have been obliterated by colluvial debris and streamflow. Furthermore, considerable runoff (streamflows) has been diverted down road surfaces. Slides #7 and #8 show where colluvial debris within a V-notch has removed the road prism. Slide #6 shows runoff diverted down one road segment. Slides #9, #10, #11 and #12 depict improper drainage and resulting road washouts. All these soil disturbances have resulted on accelerated erosion/sedimentation and represent violations of State Water Quality Standards (turbidity and suspended sediment).

Guidelines under FSH 433.11 and 433.12 specify the location of roads near natural drainages are to be avoided; cut and fill slopes are to be seeded immediately after road construction; excessive fills near stream channels are to be avoided; and natural road drainage by use of out-sloped dips are to be installed. Furthermore, it recognizes that up to 90 percent of the accelerated sediment due to harvesting occurs from roads.

In conformance with the Forest Service Handbook 2509.23, temporary roads are to be located to minimize erosion and stream pollution. Present and proposed roads are located along unstable floodplain soils and across landslide prone slopes.

* Slope failures and severe surface erosion has resulted from roading and harvesting activities across V-notches, oversteepened slopes and snow avalanche paths in the upper reaches of the North Bradfield River. This is documented by slides #13 through 20. Approximately 18,300 cubic yards have been eroded from the road prism and cut slopes. Approximately 1.7 acres of land have been removed from timber production for an estimated 100 years plus and an additional 3.5 acres suppressed for 50 to 100 years. Most of the slope debris and eroded material has entered the mainstream of the North Bradfield River in the form of accelerated sediment. Spawning habitat has been affected.

As specified in FSH 433.2, unstable soils where harvesting will accelerate landsliding, increase soil erosion hazards and/or adversely affect other resources should be avoided until practical methods are available to protect the soil

Research results indicate that the removal of overstory vegetation on slide prone soils and the accumulation of logging debris in V-notches are a major cause in accelerating mass wastage. Such potential conditions exist in the Bradfield Basin, especially in the upper stream reaches.

Timber management guidelines recognize these hazards as stated in FSM 2482.2 and 2482.21.

"Research has shown that debris avalanches and flows (hereafter referred to collectively as "landslides") may increase in number and frequency on steep slopes following logging. They usually occur on slopes of 67 percent or more. They are larger and more numerous on areas with the bedrock dipping parallel to the slope; areas with the bedrock presenting its edges to the slope experience large landslides less frequently. Side drainages that have downcut and produced oversteepened slopes are particularly susceptible to sliding. These have a characteristic V-notch shape. Logging debris left in the bottom of these drainages aggravates the land-sliding problem."

Unstable slopes and streambanks in the upper reaches of the East Bradfield River represents a high risk to water quality and downstream spawning habitat.

CURRENT IMPACTS

- * Roading and harvesting have resulted in adverse impacts to the soils, water and fisheries habitat.

Throughout the lower reaches of North Bradfield River, harvesting has occurred on floodplain alluvial soils; roads and bridges were located near meander bends; and barrow material was taken from stream gravel bars. The result has been stream removal of roads, bridges, logging debris, and residual vegetation. Remnants of bridges, stumps and other material have formed debris dams, creating areas of channel scour and deposition (accelerated stream sedimentation). The silting of spawning areas are highly suspected. Channel meandering and braiding have been accelerated on floodplains, making regeneration and stability difficult to impossible. In Appendix D, slide #1 shows the braided, meandering nature of the North Bradfield River and the location of a road near an unstable meander bend. This road has been washed out at least once and is flooded annually. Slides #3 and #4 show barrow pit location on a gravel bar. This practice results in the accelerated contributions of fine sands and silts to streamflow and spawning substrates. Slide #5 is representative of the type of debris moved by streamflows after harvesting.

Forest Service policy recognizes streamcourse protection as a vital Multiple Use goal. During sale preparation and planning, measures are to be developed to protect streams for fish production, wildlife, watershed and recreational values. As directed by FSM 432.2, emphasis is given to salmonid spawning, rearing and shelter areas including intermittent streams if utilized. Measures primarily relate to erosion control and logging debris management. Erosion prevention will consider soil properties; volume and velocity of water produced due to harvesting; stream crossings; gravel barrow from streamcourses; road layout and drainage; and rock pit locations. Report criticizes Tongass

WASHINGTON - Mandated harvesting in the Tongass National Forest is costly and "irrational public policy," according to a Wilderness Society report released today.

The 200-page study of the U.S. Forest Service's management of the Tongass indicates that "excessive logging and roadbuilding ... is destroying an ecosystem of incalculable value."

Wilderness Society President George T. Frampton Jr. said the report will be used to lobby Congress to change provisions of the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act that require the Forest Service to spend at least \$40 million a year to supply 4.5 million board feet of tim-

ber per decade.

The forest service "is squandering millions selling timber at a loss," said former Sen. Gaylord Nelson, counsel to the Wilderness Society.

The U.S. Treasury lost \$260 million between 1977 and 1984 on sales of timber from the Tongass, according to the report. In 1983 and 1984, the Tongass timber program lost 91 cents for each taxpayer dollar spent.

"This is public policy gone astray," said Alice Rivlin, Wilderness Society board member. "They had a good intention of providing jobs, but the economic world has turned against this industry. What was once dubious economics has now become indefensible."

Losses from the Tongass are "bound to grow over time because of chronically weak markets for South-

timber management

east Alaska's timber products and the fact that future harvests will have to rely on less accessible and less value stands," the report said.

Pulp made from the trees is used to make rayon and cellophane, outdated products that have been superseded by similar materials made from petroleum products. One result has been that "the market value of pulp exported from southeast Alaska declined by 49 percent between 1960 and 1984."

Aside from the economic problems of harvesting the Tongass, there are ecological problems, the Wilderness Society said.

"The Tongass shelters some of the last significant stands of northern hemisphere virgin rain forests found anywhere on Earth. These stands are a rare, endangered, irre-

placeable and priceless resource," the report said.

"Wildlife habitats and traditional subsistence lifestyles will be lost, salmon fisheries degraded and recreation and tourism values and related employment diminished if the current timber program remains in place," the society said.

The society is expected to call for cutting the timber harvest from 450 million board feet annually to 150 to 200 million board feet. In addition, the environmentalists want a moratorium on logging and roadbuilding in key fish and wildlife areas.

ANILCA calls for a review of the Tongass in 1985, which the Forest Service has completed. That report will be the subject of hearings in May.

This is in further response to Public Notice No.: AK-004043-6, regarding the proposed reversal of a November 9, 1988 EPA decision to issue a Draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit to U.S. Borax. It should be noted that the November 9, 1988 EPA decision was consistent with EPA's formal acceptance of the preferred alternative as described in the Quartz Hill Project Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) record of decision that was released on October 24, 1988. The USDA Forest Service was the lead agency in the preparation of this FEIS; the EPA an active participating agency in that process.

In response to our May 24, 1990 Freedom of Information Act and related requests, the EPA has thus far not provided any record of consultation with State of Alaska officials on this proposed action. However, an official of the EPA stated that the Acting Administrator of EPA did have a telephone conversation with an official of the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation before EPA announced its proposed decision. The Alliance has also received another report of EPA meetings regarding the proposed reversal of the EPA decision before the decision was announced. If the EPA did have such meetings or discussions with organization or agency representatives, the Alliance requests a listing of such contacts be included as a part of the Hearing Record.

The Alliance has also learned that the USDA Forest Service was not informed or consulted regarding the proposed change in the EPA position. In fact, the enclosed May 8, 1990 letter from Regional Forester Michael Barton of the USDA Forest Service, notes that he was "astonished by this unexpected action on behalf of EPA". In a follow-up request for information, the Alliance has learned that the EPA, as of July 6, 1990, has not yet responded to this May 8, 1990 request from the Forest Service.

The EPA's proposal to reverse its 1988 decisions on the NPDES Permit and the Operating Plan FEIS is seriously flawed. The process by which this proposed decision was reached merits formal review by the United States Congress and/or the General Accounting Office. Although the EPA has not fully complied with our May 24, 1990 and related Freedom of Information Act requests, enough information has been obtained to reveal that EPA may not be in compliance with the various laws, regulations and administrative procedures applicable to this proposed action.

For example, the Alliance believes that the EPA's decision may be arbitrary and capricious under section 10(e) of the Administrative Procedures Act. The Preferred Alternative in the FEIS was accepted by the EPA; the Draft NPDES Permit, which had been tentatively approved by the EPA, mitigated against possible water quality violations by restricting the term of the permit to five years. The analysis given in the May 7, 1990, fact sheet does not provide a basis for denying the initial five-year permit. There is also no basis for EPA to "change" the FEIS Preferred Alternative.

Because of the implications of the proposed EPA action, the Alliance would appreciate your addressing the following questions regarding your tentative decision to deny the NPDES Permit for Borax to discharge submarine tailings into Smeaton Bay/Wilson Arm:

1. Does the tentative decision to deny the NPDES Permit indicate that the EPA is opposed to submarine tailings discharge per se?
2. Please describe the situation under which the discharge of marine tailings would be permissible from EPA's point of view.
3. If EPA is not opposed to a submarine tailings discharge per se, to what extent would those tailings have to be dewatered for EPA to approve their discharge? If the tailings were dewatered, would EPA have jurisdiction over such a discharge under the Clean Water Act and its Memorandum of Agreement with the Corps of Engineers?
4. Would the EPA approve submarine tailings discharge if the discharge was in accordance with the State Water Quality Standards?
5. Would you please detail the baseline work and other studies which EPA would need in order to make a decision on whether or not to grant a permit to discharge marine tailings?



The Alliance also notes that EPA Regional Administrator Robie Russell's December 28, 1989 letter to Vice President C.A. Hesse of U.S. Borax outlines the process by which a final NPDES Permit could be granted. Please include a copy of Mr. Russell's letter in the Hearing Record. Mr. Russell's letter also makes reference to the Sierra Club Legal Defense Fund's (and other organizations) appeal of the mine development decision for the Quartz Hill Project. EPA's proposed action appears to have been based on points included in this appeal. It should be noted that this appeal is under review by the Chief of the USDA Forest Service, the lead agency in the FEIS process. EPA Administrator Russell's December 28, 1989 letter clearly acknowledges the Chief of the Forest Service's responsibility in reviewing and acting on this appeal. The Acting Administrator's proposal to reverse the 1988 EPA decisions appears to pre-empt or pre-judge the decision of the Chief of the Forest Service on this pending appeal. Accordingly, the proposed action by the Acting Administrator should be withdrawn until the hearing before the Chief of the Forest Service is completed.

The Alliance for Juneau's Future requests that the EPA's November 9, 1988, decision to issue an NPDES permit for Wilson Arm/Smeaton Bay be reinstated.

Enclosed is a PETITION in opposition to the proposed action by the EPA.

Transcription of KTOO-FM news story by Sherri Kochman,
April 18, 1991

There are two versions of a letter addressed to the Bureau of Land Management from Rusanowski on the AJ project. The April 14th letter describes the Impact Statement as inadequate in many areas and premature in drawing some conclusions. The letter dated a day later and actually sent to the BLM applauds the study as a sound document. Rusanowski called the changes just part of the process:

"The changes that you see between the two letters are part of the consolidation process. The material that was deleted is already contained within our page-specific comments, and the cover letter is designed to focus on major issues and concerns and we're trying to be as clear as we could in expressing those issues and concerns since we had the other materials already covered."

Attached to the cover letter are 68 pages of comments prepared by the Division of Governmental Coordination on the draft impact statement. Those were not changed when the cover letter was rewritten and Rusanowski said he is attaching all of the original agency comments as they were first submitted to the Division. Comments from the Departments of Fish and Game and Environmental Conservation were highly critical of the study. Included were statements that not enough information was gathered to support the conclusion that Sheep Creek is the best place for tailings disposal, and they questioned whether enough was known about Gastineau Channel tidal action to use it as a mixing zone for diluting tailings discharge. Putting those comments next to the cover letter which says that the DEIS is sound appears contradictory, but Rusanowski doesn't see it that way:

"I don't see that as a contradiction I see that as a clarification of the State's position and a uh, an expansion on the information available for the BLM to work with in addressing our concerns and issues." (Dr. Paul Rusanowski, Dir., DGC)

John Sandor, commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation agrees. Sandor met with Rusanowski and other resource commissioners on Tuesday.

Fish and Game commissioner Carl Rosier said the AJ comments were reviewed at the meeting, and he had been assured that the critical agency comments would be forwarded to the BLM. But as those criticisms head to the BLM, the press release applauds the project and says that the controversial tailings pond in Sheep Creek valley could be an asset as a recreation spot. Deputy Press Secretary John Manley says the Governor has not seen the press release or the cover letter.

John Howe of Alaskans for Juneau, a group that opposes the project called the changes in the cover letter a political move:

"We see that as at best a very premature, a dangerous thing to say when considering a document that has real importance to the health and safety of the people of Juneau." (John Howe, Alaskans for Juneau)

"Any conjecture as to why the letter may change so much in the two versions?" (Sherri Kochman, KTOO News)

"Well I'm sure there's political pressure, as opposed to good scientific research that is influencing this." (John Howe)

Another local group, the Alliance for Juneau's Future supports the AJ plan. Sandor previously headed up that group, but does not see that as a conflict with his work as commissioner:

"At the time I, uh, was um, executive director of the Alliance for Juneau's Future it had not yet, um, taken a position with respect to the project, it has now." (John Sandor, Commissioner, DEC)

With the State's comments in, the BLM will move forward in preparing the final impact statement and the question is how the agency will use the State comments. In Juneau, I'm Sherri Kochman.

JOHN SANDOR: THE FOX GUARDING THE HENHOUSE?

■ **NAME:** John Sandor

■ **AGE:** 63

■ **PRESENT JOB:** Commissioner, Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation. Appointed three months ago.

■ **PREVIOUS POSITIONS:** Founder and executive director of Alliance for Juneau's Future (1980-1990); the group strongly favors reopening the A-J Mine. Alaska Regional Forester, U.S. Forest Service (1976-1984)

■ **EDUCATION:** Bachelor's degree in forest management, Washington State University

■ **REPUTATION:** Longtime Tongass National Forest planner K.J. Metcalf says the regional branch of the agency was in "complete disarray" when Sandor came aboard. Sandor, he says, was able to turn things around. "We ... came up with some really good guidelines for forest practices."

But in time, Metcalf adds, those practices eroded and "all the decisions were made in favor of timber." Roads were built "where roads had no business being."

■ **WHAT THOSE ON THE SIDELINE SAY:** "(Sandor) created a runaway bureaucracy, (as regional forester) and stayed busy building roads to nowhere, offering up timber for sale that was way in excess of the market," according to Bart Kohler, executive director of the Southeast Alaska Conservation Council.

"(Sandor's appointment) means not only mining but all industry will be treated fairly," said Steve Borell, executive director of the Alaska Miners Association.

"(His amendment of the Bradford River timber sale) resulted in an environmental disas-

ter." ... We had whole islands washed away. Salmon were spawning in ditches. It was just a nightmare," said Joe Mehrkens, former Forest Service official, now executive director of the Southeast Alaska Natural Resource Center.

"He works pretty well in the political arena, so he's just not blatantly going to indicate what he will do. He's clearly pro-development. That's not a secret," according to K.J. Metcalf, team leader of the first Tongass Management Plan, now retired after 26 years with the Forest Service.

■ **WHAT SANDOR SAYS:** "It would have been more accurate if I had been depicted as a multiple-use advocate. ... It's certainly fair to characterize me as an advocator of not only the protection but the development of resources."

On what his involvement will be regarding the DEC permits sought by Echo Bay to develop the A-J mine: "I don't expect to play a personal role. ... I don't see the administrator of DEC doing anything but taking the advice of the professionals."

On his attitude (as former executive director of the Alliance for Juneau's Future) toward developing the A-J mine: We support the concept that the A-J mine can be reopened and operated in an environmentally sound manner.

■ **WHAT GOV. WALTER HICKEL SAYS:** "When we look back after four years of leadership by this administration, one of our proudest accomplishments will be our environmental record. John Sandor will lead that effort."

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

The undersigned natural persons of the age of nineteen (19) years or more, acting as incorporators of a corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation") under the provisions of the Alaska Nonprofit Corporation Act (AS 10.20)(hereinafter referred to as the "Act"), adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is Alliance for Juneau's Future, Inc.

ARTICLE II

The period of duration of the corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE III

Purposes and Powers

Section 1. Purposes. The purposes for which the corporation is organized are as follows:

(a) To encourage responsible local economic development, improved transportation access and to assure an ample supply of energy resources for the City and Borough of Juneau (hereinafter CBJ) and surrounding areas. To help shape CBJ's future as it moves into the new century.

(b) To reintroduce the development of mining as a stable and viable industry in CBJ. To encourage other responsible

(3) wilful or negligent conduct involved in the payment of dividends or the repurchase of stock from other than lawfully available funds; or

(4) a transaction from which the director derives an improper personal benefit.

Section 8. Dissolution. Upon dissolution of the corporation its assets shall be donated to the Juneau Chapter of the Alaska Miners Association.

In follow-up to my discussions with you and Mr. Alvin Ewing of your Anchorage office, the State of Alaska is committed to proceed with plans to assume greater responsibility for the clean up of hazardous waste sites within our State.

At our SEA meeting yesterday, I outlined our commitment to these specific objectives:

1. To work with the EPA in the location and development of at least two and preferably three approved hazardous waste treatment and disposal sites that would meet State of Alaska and Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) siting requirements. It is our understanding that the siting process ordinarily takes two or more years. We want to work with your agency in expediting this process as much as possible so that we may act more effectively in dealing with hazardous waste within our State. In the meantime we want to work with EPA in obtaining a permit for a temporary storage facility in Alaska.
2. To work with EPA and the local communities in identifying a priority and timetable for discovering, evaluating, classifying, and cleaning up these hazardous waste sites. The State of Alaska wants to take the lead in the investigation and clean up of those sites that are not on EPA's Superfund National Priority List. As you know, Alaska has both the authority and funds to deal with many of the hazardous waste sites that EPA cannot clean up due to its priority system and funding limitations. I am also very



interested in exploring the possibility of additional federal funding under the Superfund Core Grant to further develop an independent State hazardous waste cleanup program. The State of Alaska intends to work cooperatively with communities in dealing with these problem sites. We are also committed to utilizing privately owned waste-treatment facilities and services for the cleanup programs whenever it can be assured that the work of such firms will meet both federal and State standards.

3. To work with EPA to ensure rapid investigation and clean up of the national Priority List sites. It is my understanding that there are six such sites in Alaska, four of which are federally owned sites, and two of which are privately owned. The two private sites are Alaska Battery Enterprises and Arctic Surplus, both of which are in Fairbanks. EPA has already taken action at both of these sites, and any State actions would have to be in accord with EPA's Superfund requirements. Rather than assert State lead for these two sites, I feel it would be in the best interest of Alaska for ADEC to provide oversight and advice to EPA to ensure a rapid and effective clean up. You may expect an application for a support agency cooperative agreement for EPA funding of ADEC's oversight of EPA's clean up at Alaska Battery. We understand that EPA will consider any advice the State may have on the cleanup options, but there appears to be little advantage in changing the lead agency designation. Accordingly, our decision is to work with the EPA in completing the work at that site. If further clean up at Alaska Battery is necessary, we will ask that EPA carefully consider temporary storage of any hazardous waste for final disposal or treatment with the State. We want to avoid the hazards and costs of transporting this hazardous waste to other states. I will make a decision on ADEC's participation at Arctic Surplus depending on the relationship that we develop at the Alaska Battery site.

We appreciated working with your representatives on this and other issues.

REGIONAL FORESTER JOHN SANDOR'S RECOMMENDATION FOR LAND USE DESIGNATIONS IN THE TONGASS LAND MANAGEMENT PLANNING PROCESS. THIS AND OTHER ALTERNATIVE PROPOSALS WERE SUBMITTED TO THE ADMINISTRATION AND CONGRESS. CONGRESS, IN THE ALASKA NATIONAL INTEREST LANDS CONSERVATION ACT, APPROVED AN ALLOCATION FOR THE TONGASS THAT PROVIDED THE MANAGEMENT DIRECTION WHICH THE FOREST SERVICE FOLLOWED AFTER THE PASSAGE OF ANILCA.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This recommendation would provide for the current demands of the timber industry, salmon enhancement programs, mining developments, and community interests while maintaining many of the forest's most important wilderness, fish, wildlife, and recreation areas in a natural state. The proposed allocations will achieve a good balance between amenity and commodity values while maintaining timber-related employment opportunities. Provisions for reconsidering a number of key issue areas now allocated to LUDs III and IV are included.

Sandor.


The Alliance was founded in April of 1989 by a group of concerned Juneau citizens to promote environmentally responsible economic development. After several months as an all-volunteer organization, John Sandor was selected as the organization's first executive director because of his broad experience and expertise in resource management. John Sandor is widely respected for his integrity and professionalism within the public and the private sector. As the executive director of the Alliance, John Sandor's credibility and commitment to environmentally sound development assisted the organization's growth during its early years and encouraged constructive dialogue regarding Juneau's economic development.

The Alliance has grown to a broad based, multi-purposed group of over 600 members devoted to diversification of Juneau's economy. Our concerns are varied and diverse within the context of environmentally responsible economic development. We have strongly supported important aspects of our community's development such as DIPAC, revision of the Tongass NF Land Management Plan, enhanced airline service to Juneau by Canadian airlines, new road access to Juneau and improvement of the Alaskan Marine Highway System. We have attached a full list of our purposes and objectives as approved by our Board of Directors.

The Alliance did not take a position on the A-J Mine until late March of this year - nearly four months after John Sandor left the organization. The Alliance decided only after a careful review of the A-J Mine Draft Environmental Impact Statement that the mine proposal should be allowed to go forward. The reviewing committees, composed of over 70 Alliance members, formulated a number of recommendations and

suggestions designed to strengthen the Final EIS and sent them to the Bureau of Land Management. The Alliance is circumspect in selecting projects to support. We require a high level of civic responsibility and strong community enhancement from the project.





Dear Commissioner Sandor:

I am writing to respond to your letter of April 25, 1991, addressed to Bill Glude, executive director of the Alaska Environmental Lobby (AEL). I've been executive director of AEL since October of 1990. Perhaps you do not recall our hour long meeting of January 16, 1991, at your Juneau office and then our meeting at AEL's 1991 legislative reception on February 8, 1991. Please address all further correspondence to me.

The Alaska Environmental Lobby, Inc. is a coalition of 20 Alaskan environmental groups which provides a unified voice to the Alaska legislature on issues of concern. The Alaska Environmental Lobby always strives to provide the public with accurate and fair information.

We oppose your confirmation as Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation because during your career you have demonstrated a consistent bias favoring development over environmental concerns. We believe this bias will make it extremely difficult for you to carry out your duty to protect the environment from the hazards of development.

It is unfortunate that you take exception to the content of the action alert. We intended no personal attack and to the best of our knowledge the information is correct. Furthermore, your letter provided no specific reasons to question the accuracy of the information.

For example, you characterized your tenure as Regional Forester of Alaska and your authorship of the 1979 Tongass Land Management Plan as indicative of your "conservation leadership." We agree that you were the overseer of the Tongass management plan, which was by and large adopted by Congress in the 1980 Alaska Lands Act. But rather than demonstrating conservation leadership, the Tongass timber program was an unprecedented environmental and fiscal disaster, attracting national and international media attention and ultimately being overturned by the passage of the 1990 Tongass Timber Reform Act.

As we pointed out in our action alert, the Tongass timber program, which was written and implemented under your jurisdiction as Regional Forester, needlessly destroyed vital fish and wildlife habitat. According to a 1989 Congressional report accompanying the Tongass Timber Reform Act: "Between 1979-84,... the Forest Service policy was both a waste of taxpayer money and an insult to responsible

resource management."* Nor was Congress alone in this opinion. No less than 16 southeast Alaska communities, the United Fishermen of Alaska and all other southeast fishing organizations, the Sealaska Corporation, and virtually every southeast Alaska conservation group joined to condemn the Tongass timber management program and urge its reform.

In response to your second allegation of falsehood, that you were not a founder of the pro-mining Alliance For Juneau's Future, we refer you to the Alliance's articles of incorporation (dated 5/22/89). They very clearly list you as the initial registered agent, as one of three initial directors, and as an original incorporator.

Lastly, you claim that in your duties as Commissioner you did not provide Alyeska Corporation an advance copy of draft regulations governing oil spill contingency planning. In contrast to your statement, the *Anchorage Times* on February 21, 1991, reported that your agency gave Alyeska a "preview" of the regulations on January 24. The ombudsman's office is currently investigating this irregularity. Although you may not have been the employee who personally delivered the draft regulations to Alyeska, we insist that you -- as Commissioner -- take responsibility for the actions of your employees.

We cannot respond further because your letter failed to clearly state which specific portions of which statements you believe to be false. If you can provide us with documented information supporting your letter, we will be pleased to examine it and further discuss your concerns.

As a cabinet official, you serve at the highest level of state government and your actions must receive the highest level of scrutiny -- including a free and unfettered debate over your qualifications and past performance. We believe that working well with the public, even those people with whom you disagree, is a critical qualification for anyone working in state government.

The AEL has always attempted to work with public officials, voicing the concerns of our constituents and trying to see that our guiding principal of protecting the environment is incorporated in public policy.





Regarding the appointments of Harold Heinege as Commissioner of the Dept. of Natural Resources and John Sandoz as the Commissioner of the Dept. of Environmental Conservation, I do not think either Mr. Heinege or Mr. Sandoz should be confirmed as commissioners of these state departments. I do not think they have the state's best interests as their priorities. Their past statements and records show they are both pro oil company at the state's expense. Their records and statements seem to say the state's natural resources of something to be gotten rid of, that they are of no use or value to the state. 

If you're just counting letters, please add this one to the "two thumbs down on John Sandor for Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation" stack. If not, please, read on.

Mr. Sandor is the perfect choice for this administration's chief of DEC; in other words, entirely inappropriate. With so many state agencies under Mr. Hickel's administration saying "yes" to all kinds of natural resource development, DEC's role as environmental watchdog is more critical than ever to preventing and mitigating environmental damage. With someone like John Sandor at the helm, DEC is unlikely to offer any hope as Alaska flies into the jaws of it's "Bright Future"©.

Mr. Sandor's pre-DEC record is enough to generate skepticism regarding his commitment to environmental integrity: as the Tongass Regional Forester, promoting clear-cut logging, especially of old-growth, beyond the call of duty; as a member of the Juneau Mining Advisory Committee, voting against environmental protections in the city's mining ordinance; co-founding the Alliance for Juneau's Future to promote development of a mining project whose environmental effects have yet to be adequately estimated (we're all entitled our vision of Juneau's future, but doesn't this indicate a conflict of interest?). Now add to that some actions since he has arrived at DEC—quashing staff comments on the Tongass Land Management Plan, proposing a department re-organization plan that would politicize regional office enforcement actions, suggesting that extra-departmental entities (polluting industries perhaps?) be allowed to participate in DEC staff evaluations, attempting to soften staff criticism of the AJ mine Draft EIS, and the release from his office of new regulations to Alyeska Pipeline Service Co. prior to their public release—and that skepticism turns to outright distrust. What happened here? Couldn't Hickel get James Watt for the job?

I'm not proposing that we need Dave Foreman (or even John Howe) for the post, but the appointment of John Sandor is scandalous. Now more than ever, DEC should be led by someone who shows some commitment to its purpose: environmental protection. Please, please think of this when it comes time to vote on Mr. Sandor's confirmation, and vote against it. And please remember that MOST Alaskans did NOT vote for the gentlemen who now sit in the offices of Governor and Lt. Governor, so there is no mandate for their agenda. Dear Dick,

I am writing to ask you to do whatever you can to reject the appointments of John Sandor and Harold Heinze as commissioners.

During controversial confirmation hearings it seems that someone always chimes in that a governor or President (as the case may be) should be allowed to pick his cabinet without interference from the legislative body, allowing him to pursue his agenda. I reject this argument. The power of the legislative body to confirm or not confirm is central to the concept of checks and balances which provides stability in our form of government by preventing a misguided chief executive from running amuck.

I bring this up because I feel the Hickel administration has spawned an era when it is critical that the legislature take its power over confirmation most seriously, and that it stand up and stand firm by exercising its power to deny confirmations which are not in the best interests of the state.

John Sandor has been appointed to an agency which is charged with the responsibility of protecting public health and welfare and the integrity of the environment. For DEC to fulfill that responsibility it must act on professional judgement, not on a political agenda and not according to personal whim. Having watched Mr. Sandor for many years while he was USFS Regional Forester for Alaska, I have no doubt what-so-ever that his administration of DEC will turn DEC into an absolute failure. The price of this failure is one the citizens of this state may have to pay for decades to come -- such is the nature of oil spills, hazardous waste, and hazardous discharges and emissions.

One anecdote I can offer is very relevant to the confirmation. After many years of preparation, the Forest Service issued the Tongass Land Management Plan (TLMP) in 1979. Among other things TLMP set up the four Land Use Designations (LUDs) with which you are familiar, and zoned each part of the Tongass with one of those classifications. An Interdisciplinary Team (IDT) of individuals representing the various professions within the Forest Service

(forestry, soil science, hydrology, habitat biology, etc) prepared the draft zoning assignments. The IDT zoned the Kadashan River drainage, one of the most controversial areas on the forest, as LUD II. This designation would exclude logging during the ten year life of TLMP (at which time it could be reconsidered), in recognition of the area's great importance for fish and wildlife and its fragility.

Solely by his executive fiat, John Sandor reversed his IDT's decision and designated Kadashan as LUD III — open to logging. There was nothing in law or regulation which dictated or even suggested that this reversal was called for; it was simply Mr. Sandor's personal whim. Mr. Sandor then pressed his agency to open Kadashan to development without delay. This action resulted in immediate, successful litigation by the Southeast Alaska Conservation Council which closed a major arterial logging road which was substantially under construction when the court's order was issued. Mr. Sandor's "personal" decision cost the federal government many millions of dollars in contract payments, tied up a district court for a considerable period of time, and was an extreme burden on the public which had to call him to task. In the end, federal law passed last year specifically gave Kadashan permanent LUD II designation, just as the IDT had originally planned. More importantly, Kadashan is but one of Mr. Sandor's fiduciary failures. Others have also been the subject of successful litigation, and others beyond those got by but bear a dear price which will be paid by future generations.

The problem is not entirely poor judgement on Mr. Sandor's part, but also the extreme degree to which he either bids for or is influenced by industry, and his well known advocacy for new mining ventures in Juneau demonstrates that he bids not only for the timber industry. The legislature must not allow Hickel to emasculate the Department of Environmental Conservation with Sandor's appointment.

I have no reluctance what-so-ever in saying that Mr. Sandor is unfit to serve as Commissioner of DEC. He is!

The choice of Harold Heinze as DNR Commissioner is equally flawed. He is not and will never be a true "trustee" of Alaska's primary assets, her resources. He will line the pockets of his industry and its sister industries with the wealth of those assets, and the state will be much the poorer for it. This is not to say that industry should not have access to some of the state's resources, but I foresee a wholesale sellout. I am reminded of what happened in Wyoming under Interior Secretaries Morton and Watt. Vast coal deposits were leased at lower prices than you can possibly imagine, in quantities sufficient to supply the coal industry's wildest demand projections for many, many decades to come. There was no planning. Everything was on the block. Any hope for responsible coal mining was dashed because no care was given to where leases were offered, other than that coal was present. The most suitable sites for mining, all things such as impacts and mining economics considered, are mixed in with the worst. Economics, not impacts, will drive the industry's decisions from here on out on where to mine. There is no assurance that the impacts will not be environmentally devastating, since there was a planning vacuum. I fear that Mr. Heinze will do "to" Alaska, for a variety of extractable or removable resources, just what Morton and Watt did "to" Wyoming.



I am very concerned about a number of Governor Hickel's appointments and urge that you oppose the ones indicated below. Mr. Hickel has appointed a number of ideologues whose credential in many cases seemed not their knowledge and abilities, but their willingness to unwaveringly adhere to the administration's political extremism. 
You will soon be holding hearings on Gov. Hickel's nominations for the Dept. of Environmental Conservation and Dept. of Natural Resources. I believe both nominees are poor choices, and their confirmation should possibly be blocked.

The Dept. of Environmental Conservation has a responsibility to protect our states environment from damage and misuse, and to be an advocate on behalf of the people of the state for the long term conservation of our natural resources. John Sandor comes from the old school of the Forest Service that saw its mandate to utilized as much forest as possible, and as it turns out, in a very short sighted manner. The new schools of forestry coming up through the ranks have a different philosophy, and are seeing our environment as a complex system that has to be managed very carefully for long term diversity and health, and not for short term development and profit. It would be unfortunate if the State of Alaska chose Mr. Sandor as a guardian of not only our forests, but all our natural resources. The Department needs a leader who is dedicated to the ideals of conservation and the environment. There are others responsible for development, and the two should be separated.

The Dept. of Natural Resources certainly needs to represent both sides, for development and conservation of the resources. 

As you are no doubt aware, Governor Hickel has chosen Harold Heinze to be his Commissioner for the Department of Natural Resources, and has chosen John Sandor to be his Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation. I am normally in full agreement that an incoming Governor needs to have speedy confirmation of department heads -- individuals that share that person's philosophy and can speak for him on a wide variety of issues. In all honesty, however, the two above candidates are so utterly one-sided in their viewpoints that I must question their legitimacy for the jobs for which they have been selected.

Both men are obvious proponents of industry's points of view, and have little feeling for environmental values. 



Your committee will soon be holding confirmation hearings on John Sandor's appointment as Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation. I have reviewed his record and reputation with my contacts among Alaskans statewide, to ensure that my recommendation to you is based on accurate, first-hand information from those who have worked directly with him on environmental issues.

The unanimous reaction of environmentally-concerned Alaskans to the Sandor appointment has been outrage. His reputation among those who have dealt with him is that he has been a strident advocate of resource development without a balancing concern for environmental responsibility.

He has no credibility at all among those who have worked on environmental issues. Perhaps most disturbing, my contacts within the Department of Environmental Conservation indicate that he is widely perceived within the agency as hostile to the agency's mission, and that morale has sagged dangerously with his appointment. In early comments to the press, he indicated that he viewed DEC as a multiple-use agency. DEC's mandate is to monitor and enforce for environmental protection, NOT multiple use. Such comments reveal a deep misunderstanding of the purpose of his agency.

I am certain that John is a fine person, and I duly note that his reputation is excellent among my contacts whose politics emphasize resource development as the top priority. Is he, then, a person who can serve as a peacemaker: one who can act as a bridge between varied concerns? Unfortunately, my contacts indicate that he has not built a reputation for being able to work with the environmental side of resource issues. If he has the ability to be a statesman, it has not been demonstrated yet.

The Commissioner of Environmental Conservation must be someone with impeccable "green" credentials and commitment to the mission of the Department. John Sandor lacks credibility among the key constituencies for his agency, and thus cannot function effectively as Commissioner. I strongly urge you to recommend against his confirmation.





We have strongly supported important aspects of our community's development such as DIPAC, revision of the Tongass NF Land Management Plan, enhanced airline service to Juneau by Canadian airlines, new road access to Juneau and improvement of the Alaskan Marine Highway System. We have attached a full list of our purposes and objectives as approved by our Board of Directors.







- A resolution by the governor and legislature stating that as a state we will, from the top down:
 - actively promote clean, non-destructive industry;
 - aim to become a world leader and authority on industry and businesses that maintain natural integrity;

LARRY EDWARDS 5/3/91

During controversial confirmation hearings it seems that someone always chimes in that a President (or Governor) should be allowed to pick his cabinet without undue interference from the legislative body, allowing him to pursue his agenda. In the case of Mr. Hickel's appointment of John Sandor, I urge the legislature to reject any such notion. The power of the legislature to confirm or not confirm is central to the concept of checks and balances, and provides stability to democratic governments by preventing a mis-guided chief executive from running amuck.

The appointment of John Sandor is clear indication that Wally Hickel is running amuck. DEC is charged with the responsibility of protecting public health and welfare and the integrity of the environment. This is a vital responsibility, and to be successful the agency must execute the law fully and must function above politics. The agency must act on professional judgement, not on political motivation. It is the legislature's responsibility to assure that whoever is appointed as Commissioner has a heartfelt dedication to lead the agency in fulfilling statutory policy both in spirit and letter. John Sandor is not that man. This is the time to invoke the "check" of checks and balances.

Having watched Mr. Sandor for many years while he was Regional Forester for Alaska, I have no doubt and every assurance that his administration of DEC will be an absolute failure. The price of this failure will be paid by the citizens of Alaska not only during his tenure, but very likely for many decades (if no generations) to come -- such is the nature of hazardous wastes, oil spills, and toxic discharges to air and water.

I offer this relevant anecdote about Mr. Sandor. After many years of preparation, the Forest Service issued the Tongass Land Management Plan (TLMP) in 1979. Among other things it established four land classifications (known as Land Use Designations, or 'LUDs'). Every watershed is classified as one of these LUDs, which range from LUD I (~~identifying congressionally designated wilderness~~ ^{DESIGNATED WILDERNESS AREAS}) to LUD IV (open to intensive logging). The draft TLMP classifications were made by an Interdisciplinary Team (IDT) composed of Forest Service professionals with expertise in a variety of areas, such as forestry, soils, hydrology, and wildlife habitat. The IDT decision was that the Kadashan

River drainage be classified LUD II, which is closed to logging. Mr. Sandor rescinded the IDT's decision, and by executive fiat he designated Kadashan LUD III — open to logging.

There was nothing in law or regulation which dictated or even suggested that a LUD III designation was called for; the LUD III designation was simply made on Mr. Sandor's personal whim. Mr. Sandor then commenced construction of a major arterial logging road through the drainage, and that action resulted in immediate, successful litigation by the Southeast Alaska Conservation Council. Mr. Sandor continued construction until SEACC obtained an injunction. On all counts -- Mr. Sandor's single-minded LUD-III designation, his letting of the construction contract under threat of suit, and his continuance of construction after litigation was begun -- on all of these counts, Mr. Sandor's action cost the federal government many millions of dollars, and if not stopped would have resulted in severe damage to resources. Last year Congress made the original IDT proposal law by making Kadashan a Congressionally designated LUD-II area.

Mr. Sandor's decisions on Kadashan were wrong at every step, and were contrary to the recommendations of his staff professionals. Not only were his decisions on Kadashan disparaged by his professionals, but also by the other two branches of government — Congress and the courts. — Why? — The reason is that Sitka's Alaska Pulp Corporation was fighting tooth and nail to get into Kadashan and log it. Kadashan was the number-one place that APC wanted to get into. Simply put, Mr. Sandor went to bat for a logging company rather than follow a proper course of action charted by his professionals.

Kadashan illustrates but one of Mr. Sandor's fiduciary failures. Other policies and decisions instituted by Mr. Sandor while he was Regional Forester are at the core of other successful litigation throughout the Tongass National Forest. Mr. Sandor retired before this litigation was brought, but he is responsible for much of it. DEC has the important roll of TRUSTEE — that is the word in the statutes — of TRUSTEE of the health and welfare of Alaska's people and environment. Although Mr. Sandor may be well suited for leadership in the private advocacy organization which is promoting mining in Juneau, he is no Trustee. He is absolutely unsuitable to be Commissioner of DEC.

Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee:

My name is Florian Sever, and I am here today testifying on behalf of The Foundation for the Protection of the Common People, Inc. Our organization is one which is dedicated to the protection of the civil and human rights of all individuals; and to promoting the compliance with all environmental laws and regulations.

I oppose the confirmation of John Sandor as Commissioner of ADEC; and urge you to reject his appointment. Mr. Sandor's philosophy in regard to the environment, is aligned with the major polluters in Alaska. Mr. Sandor possesses neither, the credentials; nor the will, needed to protect the right every Alaskan has to enjoy a clean, healthy environment. His past record with the USFS demonstrates his willingness to sacrifice the environment, in order to appease industry.

Mr. Sandor's appointment to this post was an exercise in blatant "cronyism"; his appointment is a simple extension of this administration's standing policy to hand out "juicy" commissions to those who are loyal to the "Hickel Dream".

The past timber management policy on the Tongass National Forest, in Southeast Alaska, was largely the brain-child of Mr. Sandor, and men like him. The legacy of this ill-conceived "give away" of public resources has yet to fully experienced . . . the damage to the environment, caused by this policy, is both extensive, and long lasting.

I had the opportunity and honor to testify on behalf of the Tongass Timber Reform Act, on several occasions, before various committees of the U.S. Congress. I was fired from two consecutive jobs for doing so.

The allegations of mismanagement and impropriety, which led to the introduction of the Tongass Timber Reform Act, by U.S. Representative Bob Mrazek, (D) New York, have been recognized and affirmed by both, the Congress of the United States, and President Bush; this was manifested in the signing of the Act into law, in November, 1990. The signing of the TTRA was a repudiation of Mr. Sandor's policies and philosophy.

Mr. Sandor was a principal architect of the policies which the Act tried to remedy. These USFS policies condoned, among others, . . . "price fixing" . . . timber monopolies . . . "high grading" of the "old growth" forest . . . logging right across fish streams . . . collusive bidding practices by the 50-year timber contract holders (Alaska Pulp and Ketchikan Pulp) . . . illegal "double-invoicing" of cedar logs . . . illegal collusion to force independent timber operators out of business . . . and "blacklisting" of critics of these policies.

Mr. Sandor's appointment to the post of Commissioner of ADEC is an affront, and an embarrassment, to the general public. His confirmation would be a travesty, and a "slap in the face" to all Alaskans who have any concern for the conservation of our fragile environment.


During his career with the USFS, Mr. Sandor played the role of both "handmaiden", and protector, to two of the largest polluters of the environment in the state of Alaska; Alaska Pulp Corporation, and Ketchikan Pulp Company. APC, and KPC, have both proven, over the last 30 years, to be aggressive polluters of both the air, and the water. Neither company has **ever** been in compliance with either the federal Clean Air Act, or the federal Clean Water Act. Will Mr. Sandor force them into compliance? I hardly think so.

Mr. Sandor is philosophically "unarmed" to do battle for the environment. He sorely lacks the conviction necessary to handle the task. Being a staunch "Hickelite" is simply, not enough.

Past history shows that his strategy would be simple, and devastating; that being: surrender to the polluters.

In closing, I would like to, again, say that I oppose the confirmation of John Sandor as Commissioner of ADEC. Mr. Sandor is to the environment; as a logger is to an ancient Sitka spruce.


Dear Ms. Ulmer,

The purpose of this letter is to state our opposition to the confirmation of Commissioners Harold Heinze and John Sandor.





Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee:

My name is Florian Sever, and I am here today testifying on behalf of The Foundation for the Protection of the Common People, Inc. Our organization is one which is dedicated to the protection of the civil and human rights of all individuals; and to promoting the compliance with all environmental laws and regulations.

I oppose the confirmation of John Sandor as Commissioner of ADEC; and urge you to reject his appointment. Mr. Sandor's philosophy in regard to the environment, is aligned with the major polluters in Alaska. Mr. Sandor possesses neither, the credentials; nor the will, needed to protect the right every Alaskan has to enjoy a clean, healthy environment. His past record with the USFS demonstrates his willingness to sacrifice the environment, in order to appease industry.

Mr. Sandor's appointment to this post was an exercise in blatant "cronyism"; his appointment is a simple extension of this administration's standing policy to hand out "juicy" commissions to those who are loyal to the "Nickel Dream".

The past timber management policy on the Tongass National Forest, in Southeast Alaska, was largely the brain-child of Mr. Sandor, and men like him. The legacy of this ill-conceived "give away" of public resources has yet to fully experienced . . . the damage to the environment, caused by this policy, is both extensive, and long lasting.

I had the opportunity and honor to testify on behalf of the Tongass Timber Reform Act, on several occasions, before various committees of the U.S. Congress. I was fired from two consecutive jobs for doing so.

The allegations of mismanagement and impropriety, which led to the introduction of the Tongass Timber Reform Act, by U.S. Representative Bob Mrazek, (D) New York, have been recognized and affirmed by both, the Congress of the United States, and President Bush; this was manifested in the signing of the Act into law, in November, 1990. The signing of the TTRA was a repudiation of Mr. Sandor's policies and philosophy.

Mr. Sandor was a principal architect of the policies which the Act tried to remedy. These USFS policies condoned, among others, . . . "price fixing" . . . timber monopolies . . . "high grading" of the "old growth" forest . . . logging right across fish streams . . . collusive bidding practices by the 50-year timber contract holders (Alaska Pulp and Ketchikan Pulp) . . . illegal "double-invoicing" of cedar logs . . . illegal collusion to force independent timber operators out of business . . . and "blacklisting" of critics of these policies.

Mr. Sandor's appointment to the post of Commissioner of ADEC is an affront, and an embarrassment, to the general public. His confirmation would be a travesty, and a "slap in the face" to all Alaskans who have any concern for the conservation of our fragile environment.

During his career with the USFS, Mr. Sandor played the role of both "handmaiden", and protector, to two of the largest polluters of the environment in the state of Alaska; Alaska Pulp Corporation, and Ketchikan Pulp Company. APC, and KPC, have both proven, over the last 30 years, to be aggressive polluters of both the air, and the water. Neither company has ~~ever~~ been in compliance with either the federal Clean Air Act, or the federal Clean Water Act. Will Mr. Sandor force them into compliance? I hardly think so.


