 4 offices, their campaign organizations, or to political groups; providing that a
 5 political group is not a qualified organization for purposes of charitable gaming;

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 05.15.060(a) is amended to read:

9 (a) The department shall adopt regulations under AS 44.62 (Administrative
 10 Procedure Act) necessary to carry out this chapter covering, but not limited to,

11 (1) the issuance, renewal, and revocation of permits, licenses, and
 12 vendor registrations;

13 (2) a method of ascertaining net proceeds, the determination of items

1 of expense that may be incurred or paid, and the limitation of the amount of the items
2 of expense to prevent the proceeds from the activity permitted from being diverted to
3 noncharitable, noneducational, nonreligious, or profit-making organizations, individuals,
4 or groups;

5 (3) the immediate revocation of permits, licenses, and vendor
6 registrations authorized under this chapter if this chapter or regulations adopted under
7 it are violated;

8 (4) the requiring of detailed, sworn, financial reports of operations from

19 operate, or conduct the number of sessions and games a month equal to the number
20 allowed an individual permittee per month multiplied by the number of holders of the
21 multiple-beneficiary permit;

Proposed CS for House Bill 307 (FIN)

"An Act relating to accounting for charitable gaming proceeds; providing that a political use is not an authorized use of charitable gaming proceeds; prohibiting the contribution of charitable gaming proceeds to candidates for certain public offices, their campaign organizations, or to political groups; providing that a political group is not a qualified organization for purposes of charitable gaming and providing for an effective date."

This bill simply would prohibit politicians and other political entities from receiving charitable gaming proceeds. I do not believe anyone can consider politicians, or their attempts to influence the electoral process, a legitimate use of charity money.

From Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary:

"charitable" 1: full of love for and goodwill toward others:
BENEVOLENT

2 (a): liberal in benefactions to the poor: GENEROUS

2 (b): of relating to charity <~institutions>

3: merciful or kind in judging others: LENIENT

"charity" 1: benevolent goodwill toward or love of humanity

2 (a): kindly liberality and helpfulness esp. toward the needy or suffering; also: aid given to those in need

2 (b): an institution engaged in relief of the poor c: public provision for the relief of the needy

3 (a): a gift for public benevolent purposes

3 (b): an institution (as a hospital) founded by such a gift

4: lenient judgment of others

From "definitions" section of the Alaska gaming statutes:

AS 05.15.690 (5): "**charitable organization**" - organization that is operated for the relief of poverty, distress, or other condition of public concern in the state.

CSHB 307 (FIN) (9-LS1070\K draft dated 2/7/96)

Sectional Analysis

Section 1: AS 05.15.060(a) *amended*. Permittees are required to identify all accounts that charitable gaming proceeds are transferred into. The Division would also have access to each account should it desire an audit.

Section 2: AS 05.15.150 *amended* to clarify that political organizations may not receive proceeds from any type of gaming activities. It prohibits any part of the proceeds of gaming activities to be given to a candidate for public office (state or subdivision of the state) or to the candidate's campaign organization; to a political party; to an organization or club affiliated with a political party, to a political group, or to a group defined in AS 15.30.130.

Section 3: Conforming amendment.

Section 4: AS 05.15.690 (34) is repealed.
