SPONSOR STATEMENT

CSHB 164 (CRA)

"An Act providing that employment as a legislator or with the National Education Association is not credited service under the teachers' retirement system; and relating to credit for unused sick leave for members of the teachers' retirement system."

The intent of this legislation is to remove from the teachers' retirement system (TERS), those individuals who are or were teachers, and are elected to the state legislature.

Currently teachers can apply their unused sick leave for credited service and are not required to make contributions for that credited service. This bill would amend the statute and remove this option for anyone appointed to retirement after the effective date of this act, unless there is an agreement between the bargaining organization representing the teachers and the teacher's employer, permitting unused sick leave for credit towards total year of service.

 This bill has no fiscal impact on the Teachers' Retirement System (TRS). This bill will impact members first hired after the effective date. The provision to eliminate credit for unused sick leave is estimated to decrease the future contribution rate by .36% after 25 years. This would be a decrease in total employer contributions of \$220,200 yearly after 25 years. This effect is not estimated to affect the funding ratio.
