This amendment reduces the amount paid to foreign contractor personnel who act as field office liaison in Japan and Korea.

Despite ongoing effort on the part of several legislators to have the DCED solicit competitive proposals for these offices, the department has steadfastly refused. Several firms in Anchorage and in Seoul have expressed desire to respond to competitive proposals.

A review of the monthly reports from these offices shows no tangible results. Most of their time is spent going to meetings of insignificant value to Alaska. They provide a service that is or can be duplicated by other private and public agencies such as the World Trade Center, ASMI and the Northern Forum.

Note that Korea closed its Anchorage Consulate office in the past year, because of their economic difficulties. This proposed scale back is necessitated by Alaska's economic difficulty.

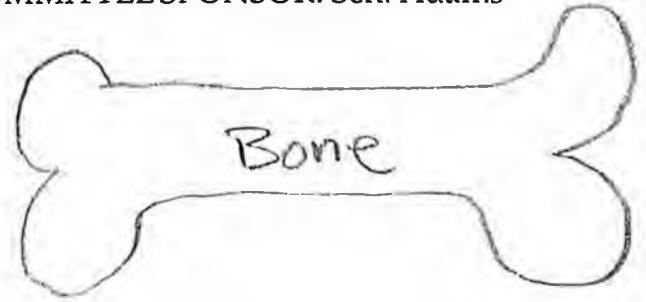

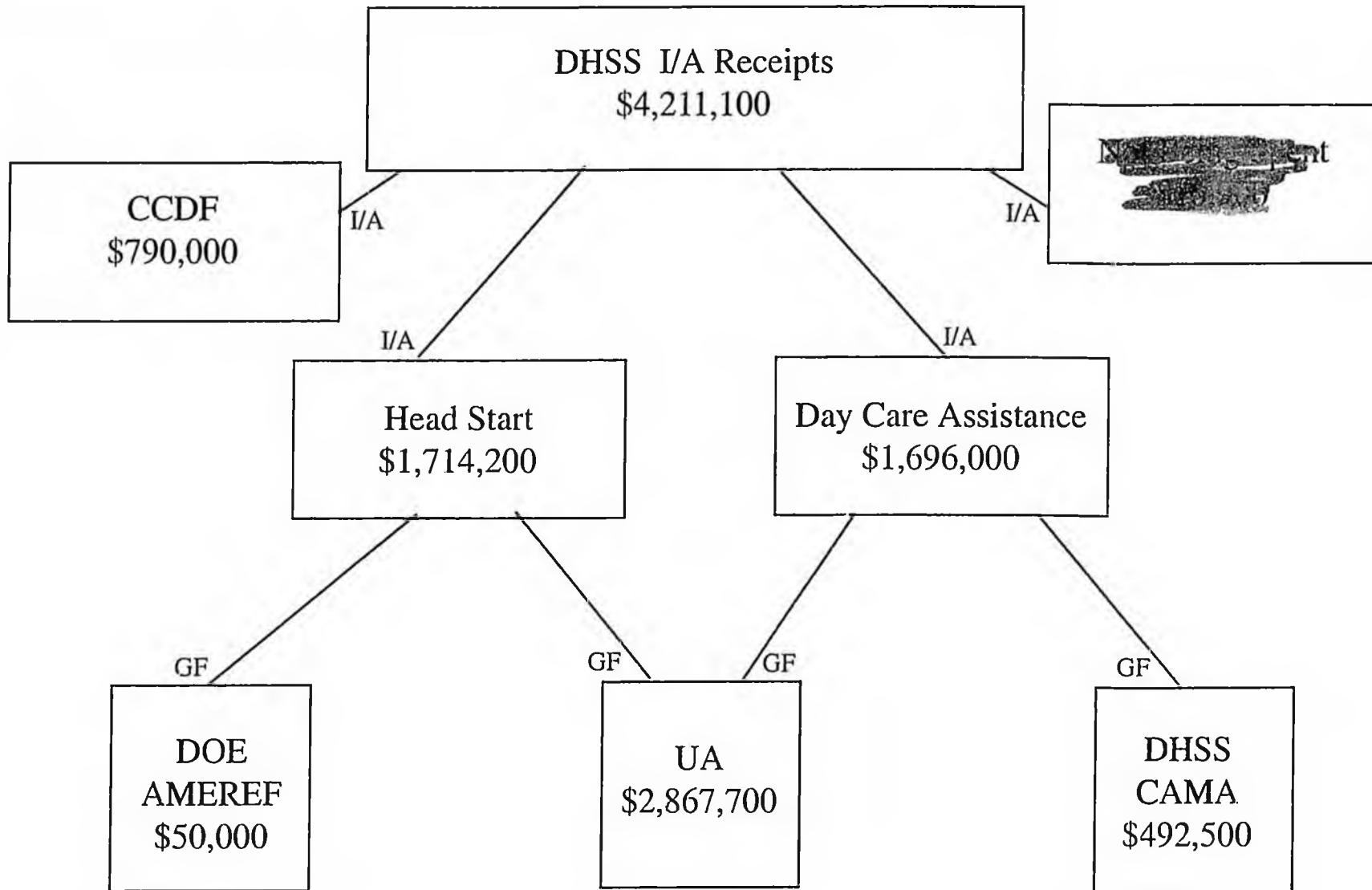

The Subcommittee extended this reduction into FY 00 by reducing the Commissioner's Office 124.1. The department proposed elimination of a Labor Economist (55.0), reducing a Workers' Compensation Hearing Officer to half time (36.0), reducing Workers' Compensation program receipt authority (20.0) and reclassifying a Management Services position (13.1) to address the 124.1.

This amendment restores the one half reduction of the hearing officer position which translates into a loss of approximately 8.4% of the hearing officer staffing. The hearing officers act as the Commissioner's designee on panels of the Workers' Compensation Board. The Board must make decisions when there is a contested case between an employee and an employer in regards to workers' compensation claims. The Board must hold hearings, render decisions, issue decisions and orders and approve or deny compromise and releases in regards to disputed cases. The hearing officer aids the Board in the application of the appropriate statutory, regulatory and case law that applies to a specific case and is in charge of writing decisions and orders pursuant to Board panel deliberations.

This reduction will negatively impact the department's ability to conduct formal hearings and compromise and release hearings as well as impact its ability to process compromise and releases settlements.

The current workload will remain the same but negatively impact the department's ability to perform its statutory duties. This will result in delays in obtaining hearing dates, decisions being rendered and compromise and releases being approved. The ultimate result will mean compensation payments to disabled injured workers, who often have no income, will be delayed.


This letter is to confirm authorization from the Trustees to include Mental Health Trust Authority Authorized Receipts (MHTAAR) in your FY00 budget plan.
