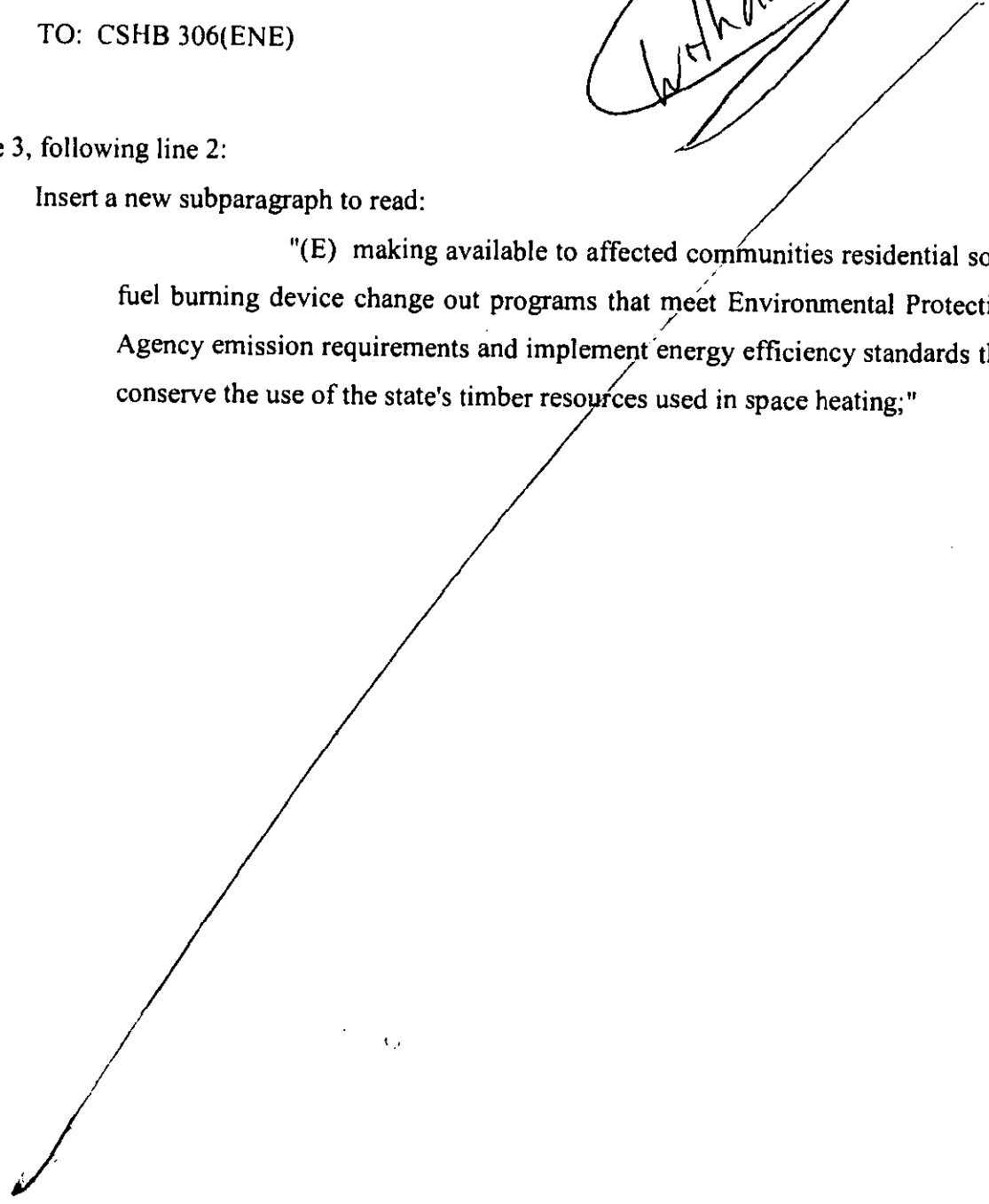

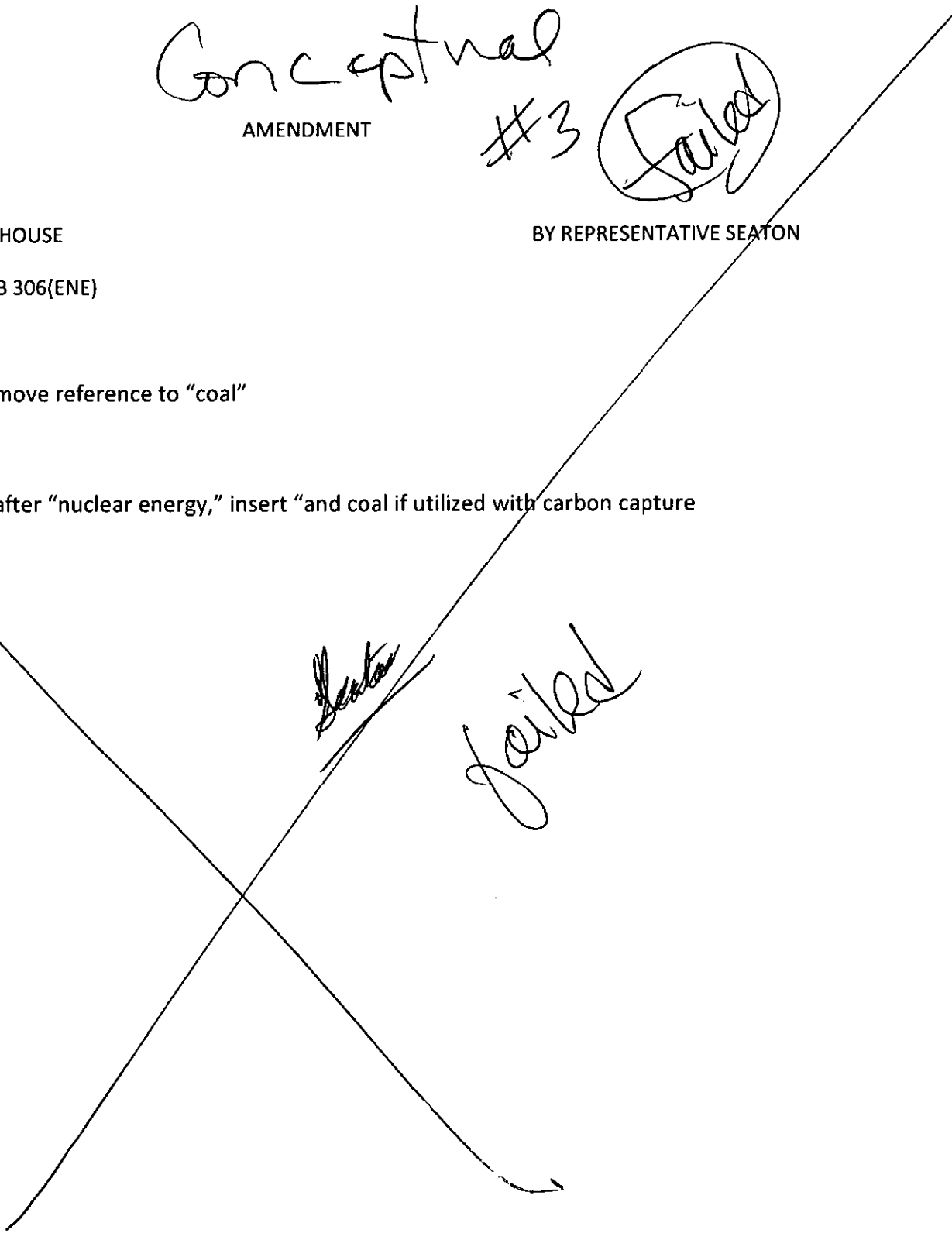

Sponsor Statement – HB 306

“An act creating a state energy policy”

Creating a state energy policy is one of the first steps to meeting the state’s energy current and future needs. A comprehensive energy policy in statute will serve as a blueprint for future generations of Alaskans.

The House Special Committee on Energy Co-chairs Rep. Bryce Edgmon, D-Dillingham and Rep. Charisse Millett, R-Anchorage used a unique method to draft the bill - they didn’t write it.

Instead, they assembled a diverse group of Alaskans with decades of experience in energy policy to come together and write what they believed would make a good energy policy for Alaska.

The Purpose

- ▶ To develop a statewide energy policy as the basis for a long-term vision to address Alaska's energy challenges and opportunities
- ▶ Through adopted policy, align state government in a unified set of strategic goals for the State of Alaska
- ▶ Lead to the development of a comprehensive energy plan to achieve the strategic goals of the State of Alaska

The Key Steps

1. Establish the Energy Policy
2. Develop Strategic Goals
3. Create the Plan to Achieve the Goals
4. Implement Programs and Projects

Principles Guiding the Process

- ▶ The future success of Alaska's statewide economy is tied to available, reliable, and affordable energy for:
 - Residential users
 - Commercial users
 - Industrial users
- ▶ Worldwide supply and demand for fossil fuels and concerns about global climate change will affect the price of fossil fuels in the future

The Starting Point of the Policy

- ▷ Tri-Borough Commission Energy Policy
 - ◻ Matanuska-Susitna Borough Mayor Curt Menard
 - ◻ Municipality of Anchorage Mayor Mark Begich
 - ◻ Kenai Peninsula Borough Mayor John Williams
- ▷ Established a diverse 13 member task force to develop proposed energy policy in October, 2007
- ▷ Adopted Southcentral region energy policy proposal February 7, 2008
- ▷ The House Energy Policy Stakeholders Advisory Panel agreed that many of the principles in this policy could be applied statewide

The Fundamentals of the Policy

- ▶ Promotes energy efficiency and conservation
- ▶ Promotes development of renewable and non-renewable energy resources
- ▶ Promotes economic development through cost-effective, long-term sources of energy for communities statewide
- ▶ Supports energy research, education, and workforce development
- ▶ Supports coordination of governmental functions and promotes streamlining of regulatory processes, avoiding duplication of effort, and overall coordination of effort by all levels of government

- Promote economic development through cost-effective, long-term sources of energy for communities statewide
- Support energy research, education, and workforce development
- Support coordination of governmental functions, which promotes streamlining of regulatory processes and overall coordination of efforts by all levels of government

If passed, Alaska will join many other states in having a statewide energy policy on the books.
